Church,

When in faith we pray, search the scriptures, take the Lord's Supper, fast, and participate in the life of the church, we avail ourselves to God's transforming light. In our trust and willingness to receive and share his light, we ourselves are renewed and restored. And it is because of who God is that in his light we cannot remain as we are. As we go into this new season together, let's attend to Christ's call to be light, and be comforted by the transformative goodness of God.


