Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

ARTICLE VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. These common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit
Creation and Formation
Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.

Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9

Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teachings approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

God giveth the increase

O what a blessing this summer has been! I remember thinking as I drove home to Balko how fortunate and blessed I was as I faced the opportunities that the summer held for me. Going home, going home to rest and prepare for the California Youth Camp.

It wasn't all rest however, for I was able to work during wheat harvest. The most beautiful time of the year in the Panhandle and I was going to be in the middle of it! It rained and rained and rained and the anxious farmers became so impatient. It was harvest time, the wheat was ripe and the urgency to get into the fields and get the grain into the elevators was felt among all. Each day as I talked with the farmers I heard over and over again, "I must get into my fields soon, before my grain is ruined!" I was reminded of the verse found in John 4:35 "Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? Behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." Truly we as Christians need to experience the urgency of getting into the ripe fields of unsaved souls. There will be time when it will be too late. Let's pray as we are admonished in Matthew 9:38 "Lord, send forth labourers." And let us be sensitive to His call as He calls us into that field. God blesses. We filled our elevators and then piled the grain onto the ground. And the farmers worked so hard! Long, long hours was what it took to save their crops and all the time and effort put forth was worth it to them. In my heart I felt the Lord tugging and asking me just how hard I was willing to work in His fields. I learned a valuable lesson from my friends at home who worked so diligently during harvest. But this is a report about camp. . .

I arrived at San Francisco early on a Monday morning. Bro. Ross Briles, his daughter Jan, and David and Sue Juarez were welcome faces. I was in California a week early and gladly used the time to just enjoy myself, meet new friends and do some last minute preparation. The Briles family was a blessing and opened up their home to me and enough thanks cannot be expressed for their kindness. Soon camp time came and we were off to Camp Pinecrest nestled in the Sierra Nevada Mountains. So many big, big beautiful trees! What a sight!!

I was in charge of the children. We had classes twice a day and sing . . . how those children loved to sing. Before long Delaine Harvey and I knew those songs backward and forward, as did the children. I found many precious friends among the 27 souls that I had the privilege of working with each day. While my group was enjoying themselves, the Young People were in another part of the camp grounds listening to Brother Frank Hankins who led them in learning more about Jesus. Bro Frank is from Pasadena, California. In still another part of the camp Brother Ken and Sister Ann Owens were ministering to the adults who came to enjoy camp and the blessing of the Lord. Bro. Ken and Sis. Ann are also from California.

I cannot tell you how many people came to the camp, that is really not important. I can tell you though, about Thursday night. All week I'd been sharing with my kids about God, and who Jesus was and just planting seeds everywhere. But no response would come as I invited them to come meet Jesus and ask him to come into their heart. On Thursday night we had planned to share Communion

with campers. During our class time on Thursday I invited Brother Ken Priest to come share with us about the meaning of Communion and what this time really meant. Bro. Ken came and after sharing with us he gave the invitation for them to come and become Christians by thanking Jesus for what He had done on the cross and receiving Him into their hearts. Tears flowed like a river from my eyes as I saw everyone of the children get up from their place and come forward acknowledging their need for Jesus. Such a blessing to be apart of this harvest too. Thursday night was beautiful as we participated in Communion and drew not only closer to Jesus our Lord but also closer to one another as Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

I thought of harvest back home and the time those farmers spent sowing seeds and praying for rain and praying the rain would stop. It's so important, each step in the soul-winning process. "I have planted, Apollos watered; but God gave the increase. So then neither is he that planteth anything, neither he that watereth; but God that giveth the increase. Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one . . . For we are labourers together with God: . . . (1 Cor. 3:6,7,8a,9a).

After a quick week of sharing with the smaller children who were not old enough to participate in camp it was time to say good-bye. So many new friends to cherish and although some of the names are already forgotten the faces I'll always remember. I thank the Lord for the opportunity I had to plant seeds to witness the watering and the harvesting and for just being able to be a small part of the California Youth Camp.

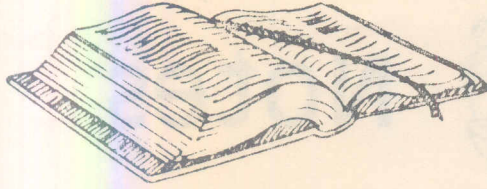

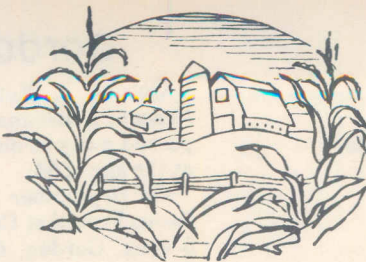

We are beginning a study of the Tabernacle on Wednesday nights and have been thrilled to have some new people join in this study.

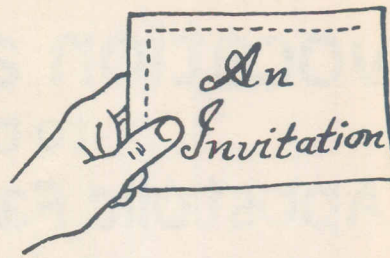
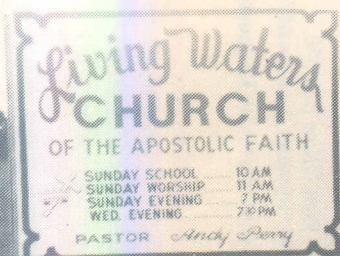
There is a hunger for the Gospel in this area, and God has anointed our teachers, and preachers as they preach forth the precious STORY.
