Dear Friends,

Greetings to you in the holy name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer.

We are approaching the end of the church and academic school year, and folks are spending more time than usual traveling, camping, engaging in outdoor sports, and visiting beaches and amusement parks. With that in mind, I have adjusted worship activities from now to September.

The UPC Contemporary Thursday service is suspended for the summer. It will resume on Thursday, September 7, at Noon via YouTube. Beginning June 1, join the UPC family Monday–Friday at noon via Zoom for 15 minutes of prayer.

The following suggestions are offered to help us continue growing in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ while the traditional religious education programs of the congregation are on hiatus.

- 1. Select a time of day to spend five to ten minutes praying, reading, and meditating on short passages of Scripture. An excellent way to do that is to like and follow the UPC Facebook page. It is also a way to read and become more familiar with the Bible.
- 2. Devote some time each day to quiet time. I call this God and Me Only Time.
- 3. Listen to or read inspirational messages for personal growth.
- 4. Intentionally improve your physical, spiritual, and emotional health.
- 5. Unplug for one hour daily no television, radio, cell phone, or computer.
- 6. Ask God to show you who and what needs sustained prayer. Then pray fervently for that person (s) and or cause.

I hope to see you at the UPC Annual Flea Market on June 10 and the community fun days on July 15 and 29.

Keep faith in God. Remember, we walk by faith, not sight, and because the Lord is our shepherd, we shall not want or fear.

Let us continue praying for one another. May God grant us the grace to constantly experience the peace of Christ that surpasses human understanding and the joy of the Lord, which is our strength.



Trinity Sunday

June 4, 2023

In celebrating Trinity Sunday, remember that *every Lord's Day is consecrated to the triune God*. On the first day of the week, God began creation. On the first day of the week, God raised Jesus from the grave.

On Trinity Sunday we proclaim the mystery of our faith in the triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, One-in-Three and Three-in-One.

On the first day of the week, the Holy Spirit descended on the newly born church. Every Sunday is special. Every Sunday is a day of the Holy Trinity.

Unlike other festivals in the church's liturgical calendar, Trinity Sunday centers on a *doctrine* of the church, rather than an *event*. It celebrates the unfathomable mystery of God's being as Holy Trinity. It is a day of adoration and praise of the one, eternal, incomprehensible God.


Trinity Sunday, in a sense, synthesizes all we have celebrated over the past months which have centered on God's mighty acts: Christmas-Epiphany celebrating God's taking flesh and dwelling among us in Jesus Christ; Easter celebrating Christ's death and resurrection for us; Pentecost celebrating God the Holy Spirit becoming our Sanctifier, Guide, and Teacher. It is, therefore, a fitting transition to that part of the year when Sunday by Sunday the work of God among us is unfolded in a more general way.

The triune God is the basis of all we are and do as Christians. In the name of this triune God we are baptized. As the baptized ones we bear the name of the triune God in our being. We are of the family of the triune God. We affirm this parentage when, in reciting the creeds, we say what we believe. Our discipleship is rooted in the mighty acts of this triune God who is active in redeeming the world. The triune God is the basis of all our prayers — we pray to God the Father, through Jesus Christ, by the Holy Spirit. The Trinity holds central place in our faith. ...

What is Juneteenth?

June 19, 2023

"Commemorate Juneteenth while continuing the fight for equity and justice."

June 19, 1865, two years after President Abraham Lincoln presented the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863, slaves in Texas finally received word: They were free.



Black communities in Texas and beyond annually celebrate this day, Juneteenth, which officially became a federal holiday in 2021 when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law.

The holiday is considered the "longest-running African-American holiday" and has been called "America's second Independence Day". Historian Mitch Kachun considers that celebrations of the end of slavery have three goals: "to celebrate, to educate, and to agitate".

Celebratory traditions often include public readings of the Emancipation Proclamation, singing traditional songs such as "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot" and "Lift Every Voice and Sing", and the reading of works by noted African-American writers, such as Ralph Ellison and Maya Angelou. Juneteenth celebrations may also include rodeos, street fairs, cookouts, family reunions, parties, historical reenactments, and Miss Juneteenth contests. In 2021, Juneteenth became the first new federal holiday since Martin Luther King Jr. Day was adopted in 1983.

Observance today is primarily in local celebrations.[15] In many places, Juneteenth has become a multicultural holiday.





CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

Creation: And It Was Very Good

Theme: The Creation

Object: Globe Beach Ball

Scripture: Genesis 1

It's interesting to look at a globe of the earth. Can you find where we live on the globe? (Pass the beach ball to a child.)

The earth keeps on spinning around and around as it has ever since it was created. The very first words in the Bible tell us that "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." Then the Bible goes on to tell about God's creation. (Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

The first thing God created was light. The Bible tells us that God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God said... (Have all kids say, "It was good." Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

Then God said, "There needs to be a space to separate the waters of the heavens from the waters on the earth." So God made a space to separate the earth from the heavens. He called it "sky." And God said... (Have all kids say, "It was good." Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

Next, God brought all the waters of the earth together to make the oceans and the seas and to create dry land between them. Then He covered the dry land with flowers, trees, and grass. And God said... (Have all kids say, "It was good." Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

God paused, looked at the beautiful trees and flowers and said... (Have all kids say, "It was good.") Then He continued His creation. (Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

He created the sun, moon, and stars. They were beautiful! God looked at them, and again He said... (Have all kids say, "It was good." Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

Then God created the birds and fish. He blessed them and told them to multiply so that the sea would be filled with fish of all shapes and sizes and the air would be filled with beautiful birds. God looked at them, smiled, and said..." (Have all kids say, "It was good." Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

Finally, God made the animals. Tall, skinny giraffes and furry little squirrels. He made cuddly little kittens and big, ferocious lions -- animals of every kind. Then God made man and woman. The Bible says He made people to be like Him and He put them in charge of all that He had created -- the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and every living creature. And God said... (Have all kids say, "It was good." Instruct kids to pass the globe beach ball to others.)

When God had finished, He looked at all that He had created and He said, "That is VERY GOOD!" (Have all kids say, "It was very good." Instruct the kids to pass the beach ball back to you.)

Dear God, God we thank you that you alone are Creator. You are powerful and so creative. Thank you for making us in your image and making all things very good.




Creation: It Was Very Good Crossword
