The Colors of Alchemy and Sandplay: Stages in the Process of Transformation

This is a continuation of the online lecture, where we'll gather to further the journey through the topic at the beautiful Ho'omaluhia Gardens in Kaneohe.

Description of the Workshop:

The ancient alchemists' quest to transform base metals such as lead into gold unfolded in generally agreed-upon color-stages, from black (the Nigredo), to white (the Albedo) to red (the Rubedo). Today we understand these color stages, as described by C.G. Jung and others, as the process of transformation in the human psyche—empirically validated in a doctoral thesis by the sequence of colors emerging in Dr. Ehlers' dreams over a 15-year period (Ehlers, 1992). In the first half of the program, using images from art, we will explore the psychological meaning of these color-stages, with a focus on the albedo and the rubedo as a complementary pair in the psyche, representing archetypal feminine and masculine energies, with corroboration for these opposites as a pair found not only in cross-cultural color symbol-systems worldwide and across time but also in contemporary studies of the neuroanatomy of the human brain. We will discuss the challenges we and our clients face in balancing these two energies in our daily lives. In the second half of the program we will focus on these changes of colors selected for use in the sandplay of a deeply wounded woman, on her transformational 22-year journey from addiction and the self-destructive behavior of her past to a radiant new life.

Educational Objectives:

To begin to become familiar with alchemy as a symbolic system; to be able to use the symbolism of the alchemical colors of black, white and red to understand sandplay and dreams; to understand the importance of having balanced energies in the psyche.

Learning Objectives:

- Describe the psychological meaning of the Nigredo
- Describe two ways the Albedo might appear in a sand tray
- Cite an example of the Albedo & Rubedo as a pair of opposites in the psyche
- Explain how you might bring the Albedo & Rubedo into better balance in your life

Lynne L. Ehlers, Ph.D. is a licensed Clinical Psychologist offering sandplay, dreamwork, case consultation and Jungian-oriented depth psychotherapy for adults in Albany, California. She is a Teaching Member (CST-T) of Sandplay Therapists of America (STA) and the International Society for Sandplay Therapy (ISST) and has been working with sandplay since 1977. She has taught classes on dream symbolism and sandplay in the San Francisco Bay Area since 2003 and has presented papers at every STA conference and two international conferences since 2009. Her many articles appear in the *Journal of Sandplay Therapy* and her book, *Alchemy and Individuation: The Colors of Transformation*, was published in 2022.



“ Some survivors of wildfires describe their cognitive struggles after escaping the blaze as “fire brain.” ... “Breathing in particulate matter can lead to inflammatory responses in the body,” [Jyoti Mishra, lead author and associate professor of psychiatry at the UC-San Diego] said. ‘That affects brain processes. How it influences brain processes is still a question.’ ... The effects of inhaling wildfire smoke, compounded by trauma, sets up a complicated mystery scientists need to explore further, Mishra said. ”

Reflecting on The Heroine's Journey Workshop

Flowers, herbs, candles, sand, water and art supplies of our choosing: These were just a few things on our supply list to bring to Dr. Roz Heiko's spring workshop, "The Heroine's Journey." Some of us wondered, "What do these items have to do with mapping a sandplay process?"

On April 29, 2023 Dr. Roz, the author of [A Therapist's Guide to Mapping the Girl Heroine's Journey in Sandplay](#), took us on an experiential journey using all of these things to awaken our senses, emotions and thoughts. We explored the journey motif itself as we were guided through the four gateways of her model:

- I. Pathways (choosing the journey),
- II. Discernment,
- III. Harmony, and
- IV. Re-Turn.

With each gateway we explored our own experiences, learned about sandplay symbols associated with each period, and witnessed case material to help us further understand the mapping process.

In the center of the wheel-like image of the model is a circle—where all of the gateways join. The circle symbolizes the connection to the Self that always remains accessible. Dr. Roz reviewed mandala symbolism that may appear and the internal centering process that occurs when one submits to the journey.

Participants left with a feeling of abundance and a lot of helpful handouts. One participant stated, "What this workshop brought back for me were the many memories of the observations I have made with so many children over the years and the feelings of gratitude I still have for having done this magical work."
