

Some of you may know that last year during Arlington I was in the hospital for two weeks with cepsis and cellulitus in my right foot which had developed into Charcot Syndrome. This is something that diabetics get when the bones in their feet dissolve. Therefore major reconstruction with metal plates, bridges and screws had to be put in to replace the bones. This is extremely painful and has been a long recovery. I have been dealing with that plus since end of last October. I have been hospitalized 4 different times for diabetic related problems. As I type this newsletter July 5th, I have developed the same Charcot Syndrome in my left foot. I have been put in a not weight bearing cast waiting for my surgery which will take place the 22nd of July, then about 6 to 8 months of recoup time from then. I am sorry if the yearbook is not going out as it did last year the end of July. I am shooting for the end of August. I want to thank all the nobles for their prayers and kind words as I go through this troubling time. Enough about me.

I would like to thank all the nobles who assisted with the booth at Imperial Session, check the back of this news letter for a picture of International's Booth. I would also like to ask that all unit leaders check with their Adjutants and Finance Officers to make sure the Annual Report have been submitted and the current year's dues have been paid.
