



TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda - Overview



- * Focused agenda does not cover every possible issue
- * Mix of calls for **expansion** of existing programs, **renewal** of previous-but-inactive initiatives, and **new** ideas
- Consistent with top priorities of incoming federal leadership



TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda - #1 of 4 Economic Recovery for Communities

Economic Development Administration

- Include \$3 billion in American Rescue package, and \$500 million in annual appropriations for EDA grants
- Support sectors beyond normal EDA focus including health & wellness, tourism & recreation

EPA Brownfield & Land Revitalization

- Increase to fully authorized annual level of \$250 million
- Focus on green, resilient & clean energy approaches; economic recovery & post-COVID redevelopment



Reinstate congressionally directed earmarks

TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda - #2 of 4 Local Climate Action

Restore DOE "Energy Efficiency & Conservation Block Grants"

- Through the 2009 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, EECBG program provided block grants to state and local governments to develop, promote, implement, and manage job-generating energy efficiency and conservation projects
- > \$3.5 billion annually

Reinstate EPA "Climate Showcase Communities" grant initiative

- Helps communities pilot energy efficiency building retrofits, financial incentives for efficiency, building code support, renewable energy, distributed energy technologies, alt fuel fleets & transportation, recycling & waste management
- \$25 million annually





TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda – More #2 of 4 *Local Climate Action*

Expand EPA Office of Community Revitalization

- Brownfields, environmental justice, smart growth, urban waters, and other funding
- > \$25 million annually
- Grants up to \$500,000 for <u>Building Blocks for Sustainable</u> <u>Communities</u> implementation grants



TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda - #3 of 4 Community Equity & Resilience

Establish "Build Back Better" Task Force & Planning Grant



- Identify strategies and support for resilience strategies for localities (environmental, economic, health, equity, sustainability)
- Interagency Task Force with White House Intergovernmental, HUD, USDA, DOT, HHS & others
- Modeled after Obama-Biden "Partnership for Sustainable Communities"
- > \$25 million annually for Build Back planning grants up to \$500,000

TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda – More #3 of 4 Community Equity & Resilience

Create HUD "ANCHOR Institutions" initiative

- Help localities expand economic opportunity & jobs through collaboration with anchor institutions

 hospitals & health systems, colleges
 universities, cultural institutions
- > \$25 million annually for \$250,000 HUD planning grants

Expand DOJ Community Relations Service

\$30 million annually for \$20,000 CRS grants for facilitated community policing, police-community collaboration, reform




TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda - #4 of 4 Sustainable Infrastructure Investments

New Infrastructure Legislation

- Localities seek a real seat at the table on Build Back Better
- We back proposal from Biden Administration and House for all-infrastructure package of \$1.3+ trillion
- Focus on sustainable, resilient, smart growth & smart technology approaches, and support for rural communities

DOT BUILD Grants

- ➤ Highly-Recommended Projects outstrip \$1B annual funding each year
- Propose \$4 billion in annual awards



TAP Federal Advocacy Agenda – More #4 of 4 Sustainable Infrastructure Investments



Transportation, Community, & System Preservation

- Planning and coordination to improve efficiency of transportation system, reduce environmental, and ensure access to jobs, services, and trade hubs
- ➤ Restore former <u>TCSP</u> program at \$1 billion annually

NPS "Public Square" Initiative

- New initiative to support development of parks, recreation, community centers, public waterfronts & public squares
- \$100 million annually, leverage by local, philanthropic & crowdfunding sources

TAP Campaign Gameplan - 6 month plan

Coalition led by 25 "Founding Local Leaders"

- 15 signed on already
- Diversity among localities, regions, types of communities, political assets, and representative leaders
- ➤ Total coalition goal = 50+

Consultation with **Biden White House & Agencies**

Advocacy to Senate & House leadership & Committee/Subcommittee leadership

Tools to Localities for Grassroots Support

- > Tools for local resolutions, media & social media announcements
- > Tools for outreach to Members of Congress/staff, agency leaders & state officials
- Fly-ins (?) and Zooms
