Officers from Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and New York attended this one-day training put on by Taser International in order to become certified in the various less-lethal options available through Taser. 3 North Berwick Officers were able to attend the training for free as we were the host site. This saved our Department and the Citizens of North Berwick approximately \$1,500. These newly certified Taser Instructors will be able to present the mandated yearly training for our other Officers to remain certified Taser Operators. We wish to extend our thanks to all the attendees along with the employees of the North Berwick Town Hall for their patience and assistance during a full day of training.
