We are still busy working on our Summer projects.


The North building has 2 beautiful, operating elevators. Now that they are






Decorating



Does Your Garbage Disposal Stink?

Actually, the cure for this is much easier than you might imagine.

Method 1

Grab a citrus fruit, peel it and dispose of any seeds. Put the slices of fruit into the <u>disposal</u> and then turn it on.

Turn on the cold water. The disposal should mash up the fruit leaving a fresh scent. If you like a Lemon smell, grinding up a lemon is one of the better options.

Method 2

Pour white vinegar into a cup about 1/3 full. Pour 1/3 cup of baking soda down the disposal. Pour the white vinegar into the disposal.

It will bubble and foam...possibly up into your sink. Wait for 5 minutes and then turn the water on.
