

The Epiphany of the Lord Sunday 2 January 2022 (Year C)

Happy New Year and congratulations if you already have your New Year resolutions. And I wish all of them will come true and be fulfilled. Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. The feast has many wonderful thoughts for us as we embark our journey into the New Year 2022.

Firstly, it reminds us of God's presence in our lives. The word Epiphany in Greek means appearance or manifestation. The Lord was, first, revealed to the shepherds by the angels. In the Western Church, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates Jesus' first manifestation to the Gentiles, represented by the Magi, while in the Eastern Church, the Feast commemorates the baptism of Christ, at which the Father and the Holy Spirit gave combined testimony to Jesus' identity as Son of God. Later, in the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus revealed Himself in words as the promised Messiah, and at Cana Jesus revealed His Divinity by transforming water into wine. These multiple revelations are all suggested by the Feast of the Epiphany. Jesus, I believe, reveals Himself not only in the past but He continues to do so our lives too.

Secondly, it tells us of God's plan. The adoration of the Magi fulfils the prophecy of Isaiah in which he tells us that the nations of the world would travel to the Holy City following a brilliant light, bringing gold and incense to contribute to the worship of God. The Responsorial Psalm also tells us that kings from foreign lands bringing gifts to pay homage to a just king in Israel. In his letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul says that God has a secret plan. In clear terms he says: "the Gentiles are...co-heirs ... co-partners in the promise, in Christ Jesus through the Gospel." God, I believe, has plans not only for the Magi but also for us too. Let us discern His plan by continuing to ask ourselves "what does God want me to do in my life?"

Thirdly, God never stops bringing us to Jesus. The Gospel tells us that God brought the Magi, foreigners and pagans, to recognize and give Jesus proper respect as the King of Jews. This reminds us that God will never stop bringing us to Jesus no matter how sinful our lives are.

Last but not least, the best New Year resolution would be to accept Jesus like the shepherds and the Magi. There were three groups of people who responded to the Lord's appearance at his birth. The first group, headed by King Herod, tried to eliminate Jesus, the second group, priests and scribes, ignored Jesus, and the third group, represented by the shepherds and the Magi, came to adore Jesus. As followers of Jesus, let us make sure that we belong to the third group by actively worshiping Jesus at Mass with the gold of our love, the myrrh of our humility and the frankincense of our adoration; by giving a new direction to our lives. Just as the Magi chose another route to return to their homes, let us in the new year choose a better way of life, abstaining from proud, unjust and impure thoughts, words, and actions, evil habits, and selfish behaviour; by becoming stars leading others to Jesus, as the star led the Magi to Jesus. Let us remove the darkness of the evil around us by radiating the light of Jesus' love through selfless service, unconditional forgiveness and compassionate care.



Like the Magi, we too offer Jesus gifts of our everyday life, our responsive relationship with God (communicating with Him through prayer, reading & meditating the Bible), our friendship with God by recognizing His presence in our humble service of one another, and by getting reconciled to God for all our sins and failures.

As we embark our journey into the New Year, let us bring Him our hearts and offer our lives to Him for He will enrich us abundantly.

#55 UPDATE: GENERAL LITURGICAL GUIDELINES COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne

Information Updated: 23 December 2021, 5:00pm

As of 11.59pm Wednesday 23 December 2021, the following measures will be applied to Masses at Sacred Heart Parish::

From 11:59pm Thursday 23 December 2021, face coverings will be required for gatherings indoors (except in the home) for people aged eight and over, or for those with medical exemptions.

All Catholics in Melbourne continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further directed by the Archbishop. We continue to carry the happy obligation to keep Sunday holy, whether we can attend Mass or not, and can do so by any kind of prayer with members of our household and parish, reading holy scripture, and encouraging one another in our faith. Prayerfully participating in online Mass continues to be a great source of comfort on Sundays.

Please do not attend Mass if you are feeling unwell, have tested positive or are waiting for a Covid test result

Check in is still required. Thank you.



Lover of all souls,


help us enter the New Year joyfully, willing to laugh and dance and dream, remembering our many gifts with thanks and looking forward to blessings yet to come.

GOSPEL

Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they

told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah,

for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward, and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.
