

Catch a Falling Star By Barb Jones

DecoArt Paints:

Uniform Blue Deep Burgundy

Tangelo Espresso
Tomato Red Lamp Black

Brushes:

#2 Flat, #10 Flat, Fine Liner or Script Liner, 3/4" Flat for base coating

Other Supplies:

Rust-Oleum Texture Spray Paint (optional if you want texture) Cord or Ribbon for Ornament White Graphite Regular Painting Supplies

Prep before meeting:

Base coat with Uniform Blue (over texture paint if used)
Sand lightly if needed
Transfer Pattern
Base coat Snowman with Buttermilk

I will have a pattern at the March meeting.

May Rock Kindness Project – Butterfly and Daisies

Paint colors used on sample:

Grape Juice

Hauser Light Green

Dioxazine Purple

White

Purple Cow

Black

Hauser Medium Green

Cadmium Yellow

Feel free to substitute colors.

Optional: Sealer. Some rock painters use Posca pens. I'll bring a sample for you to see.

Sample painted on 4" X 6". Any size will work. Could even paint butterfly on one rock and flowers on another.

I will bring an assortment of rocks for purchase to the meeting. I buy by the pound at Sand & Gravel to Go in Burleson. They have a \$5 minimum. Dark smooth rocks are .25/pound. Rocky's Stone and More off FM1187 in Rendon also has smooth rocks. Sometimes rocks are available at Home Depot or Lowe's. Make sure they don't have a waxy coating.

Recipe Corner

FROSTY WINTER BARS from Nancy

1 ½ c butter

1 c sugar

1 egg, well beaten

½ c milk

1 ½ c flaked coconut

1 ¼ c chopped pecans

Whole Graham crackers (enough to line pan twice)

1 c. Graham cracker crumbs

6 Tbsp light cream

1 tsp vanilla

2 c. powdered sugar



Melt 1 cup butter in saucepan and stir in sugar, egg and milk. Bring to a boil over low heat, stirring constantly, then remove from heat. Stir in coconut, 1 cup pecans and graham cracker crumbs. Cover bottom of 13 x 9 dish with whole graham crackers and spread coconut mixture over crackers. Cover with whole graham crackers. Soften remaining butter in bowl. Add cream, vanilla and powdered sugar and beat until fluffy. Spread over crackers and sprinkle with remaining pecans. Refrigerate overnight and cut into bars. May be frozen.

Easy Chicken Tetrazzini from LaRue

1 Chicken
1 can cream of chicken soup
1/2 can milk
1 cup shredded cheese
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup chopped celery
1 12 oz. pkg. spaghetti
1 stick butter

Cook Chicken . (Save the chicken broth). Bone and chop . In the chicken broth, cook spaghetti (broken into 3rds.) Saute onion and celery in butter until tender. Combine chicken soup, cheese, onion, celery and milk. Heat until is cheese is melted. Add chicken and spaghetti. (note: It seemed a little dry so I added 1 cup of chicken broth. Put into casserole, add shredded cheese on the top and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

Best Chicken Casserole Recipe From Peggy

1 (6-ounce) can French-fried onion rings

3 cups chopped cooked chicken
2 cups finely chopped celery
1 cup (4 ounces) shredded Cheddar cheese
1 cup sour cream
1 cup mayonnaise
1 (4-ounce) can water chestnuts, drained and chopped
1 (10-3/4-ounce) can cream of chicken soup



What to do:

1/2 cup slivered almonds

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat a 9- x 13-inch baking dish with cooking spray.
- 2. In a large bowl, stir together chicken, celery, cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise, water chestnuts, soup, and almonds. Spoon into prepared baking dish.
- 3. Bake uncovered for 30 minutes. Sprinkle onion rings evenly over top and bake 5 minutes more, or until bubbly around the edges. Let stand 5 to 10 minutes before serving.






