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"I Just Don't Get It" By Mark Terrell

A little over a year ago, a senior staff member approached me with a serious concern. "I just don't get it," she said. "I have no idea how to describe what we do and why."

I was impressed by the staff member's honesty and realized many others in the organization might feel the same way. But how could an organization that started in 1968 still be figuring out how to communicate such fundamental messaging?



To be fair, it isn't as if we haven't tried to communicate who we are. We have a mission statement, core values, and even an elevator story for each of our organizations: Lifeline, Crosswinds, and Lasting Change. We have Staffline, Boardline, Newsline, Facebook, and blogs. You name it, we have done it. Yet in spite of all this, we still lack a crucial piece.

I received clarity in a board meeting when one of our new board members repeated the senior staff member's concern and suggested that we describe what we do as a family of organizations. In the past, we might have done this by describing our three organizations. But our board member pointed out that the employees in General Motors' divisions—Cadillac, Chevrolet, GMC, etc.—can clearly communicate General Motors' purpose as a collective family of divisions.

With that in mind, I set out last year to answer three crucial questions: Why do we exist? What do we do? What is our vision for the future?

When I started the project, I expected to knock it out in a meeting or two. Instead, I've spent more than a year and have gone through nearly 500 iterations of our answer to the three questions above. Over the next several months, I would like to discuss what we came up with and hear your thoughts. In preparation, I would challenge you to answer the three questions, yourself. How would you explain our collective family of organizations to a family member?

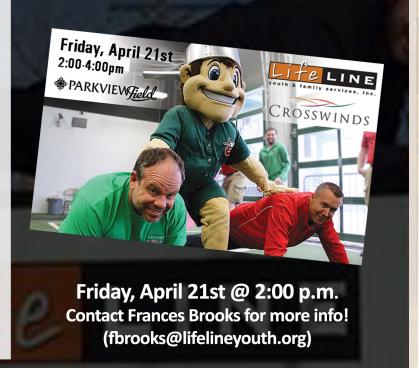

New Leadership Development Program





We, at Lifeline and Crosswinds, are committed to staff development, because we believe that people have an innate need to grow as workers, leaders, and persons of influence. This year, we started "Incredible Leadership," a travelling leadership program designed to foster healthy personal development.

The program is led by Dave Parker, Vice President of Crosswinds, and Gordon Haines, Vice President of Human Resources, who offered the first session of the program in Fort Wayne in January. Only 20 seats were available, but we received more than 130 applicants. Due to this, we have expanded the number of sessions we are offering to include sessions in South Bend and Indianapolis.

Over 45 New Staff Trained Since January

We're growing! In two short months, we've hired and trained 45 new staff members, including therapists, parent aids, and family consultants, who are now out in the field helping families. The administration team added a Vice President of Human Resources and a Communications Manager.

In the months to come, we expect to add more therapists, home based staff members, teachers for our facility in Pierceton, and house staff members for Caribbean Mountain Academy in the
