OVERVIEW

Kindergarten is your child's foundation to a lifelong love and enjoyment of the learning process and school. Our Kindergarten year is designed for you and your child to experience many exciting moments and share memories to last a lifetime. Our First Grade curriculum is an extension of our Kindergarten program and each child is leveled up upon mastery.

This brochure is designed to give you a glimpse in to your child's school entry year. It will also help you make the necessary adjustments for your child's transition from home or preschool to the School Age classroom. Our goal is to help your child reach his/her maximum potential. Together, we must develop a strong relationship between your home and our school – a relationship based on open communication and a strong dedication to for the best interest of your child.

WHY KIDS' STUFF PRIVATE SCHOOL?

Our program provides the strongest foundation attainable for your child's education. Our small class instruction guarantees your child will receive the individual attention he/she deserves, and may require, to make this possible. Your child will learn to work independently and confidently in both large and small groups. Our 'family like' classroom environment will strengthen their self-confidence, and realize their learning potential, preparing for their successful transition to First Grade, and if repeating Kindergarten, into a larger school system.

Our program stimulates growth in all aspects of your child's development. Kids' Stuff curriculum incorporates the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards and touches on the Common Core Standards as set forth by the Florida State Board of Education as well as implementing our proven traditional teaching techniques. Our robust curriculum is enhanced uniquely Spanish immersion and updated technology resources in the classroom. Your child will also participate in the following specialized inter-curricular programs: Physical Education, Music Education, Guidance, and Art.

Kids' Stuff Private Kindergarten program delivers the same concepts and standards as our surrounding public schools, but is tailored to the socialization and the development of the whole child. The opportunity to eliminate the stresses and demands of a much larger elementary school atmosphere allows children to be more engaged, and benefit from the importance of socializing and building confidence in all areas of their personality. Our Kindergarten experience is staged in a small, uncomplicated, and nurturing learning environment that affords our students the extra time necessary to become well-rounded confident, Kindergartners or First Graders who are very ready and excited for their new experience in an elementary school environment.

Kids' Stuff Private School program introduces concepts of leveled instruction. This allows each child to develop at their own pace, while being challenged to excel in the best of their abilities. Each child is observed and leveled during the first month of school. Your child's level may be determined as Advanced Pre- Kindergarten, Kindergarten Ready or Kindergarten/First Grade Ready. Determining each child's level, will help carve the teaching path for each child throughout the school year. We challenge and level as tolerated by each child, until the child has met the goals set forth.

Our program incorporates teaching, practicing and exploring life skills; teaching and practicing research and critical thinking skills; introducing and utilizing technology; exploring science and social studies experiences in addition to engaging in the logic of Mathematics and the importance of Literacy, all in a natural atmosphere and a comfortable homeschool-like setting.

SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES

The Common Core State Standards encourages the integration of Science and Social Studies throughout the school day. Kids' Stuff incorporates this directive during teachable moments using informational text and resources, such as National Geographic for Kids and other hands-on materials, as well as real life experiences.

DIGITAL EDUCATION

Digital Education is introduced during Literacy Center rotations via a software program created to enhance literacy skills at Leveled Instruction. This is also incorporated into our Spanish Immersion Program.

LITTLE TECHS

Little Techs is a weekly Kindergarten program that exposes your child to an enriched curriculum through the use of iPads. Each child is challenged by leveled work through concepts in math, geography, literacy, and science. Research shows that students in technology-rich environments experience positive effects on achievement in all major subject areas. In addition, students' attitudes toward learning, and their own self-concept, improve consistently when technology is used for instruction. The Little Techs program enhances the age-appropriate progress of students in attaining the state-adopted performance standards, and helps prepare students for the following grade level based on Common Core Standards. In addition, we have incorporated ipad use into more of our classroom operations.

SPANISH

Our unique Spanish Immersion Program exposes your child to the written and spoken Spanish language throughout the entire day. It begins the year deliberately delivering very simple instructions to the children only in Spanish ("would you like a glass of water", "would you like to go to the bathroom"). Before the children even realize what is happening, they are replying totally in Spanish; they very soon begin asking for certain things only in Spanish. It is a very subtle experience and it grows very quickly. By the end of the Kindergarten year, students are conversing naturally in Spanish over a very broad range of subjects and instructions.

This method broadens their understanding of the language and makes their daily Spanish tutoring a very rich experience.

Early exposure is imperative for the child to feel comfortable listening to sounds that are different than those of their native language. Kids' Stuff strongly believes learning a foreign language at an early age increases listening ability, memory, creativity, and critical thinking - all thinking processes that increase the overall learning experience. In addition to developing critical thinking skills, foreign language study exposes children to alternative ways of looking at the world.

MUSIC EDUCATION

The National Standards for Music Education in Kindergarten is used as a foundation in the creation of our lesson plans. Some topics covered during the school year at Kids' Stuff are:

- Steady Beat (tempo)
- Fast vs Slow (tempo)
- Loud vs Soft (dynamics)
- High vs Low (pitch)
- Melodic Direction (music scale)
- Steps, Skips & Leaps (intervals)

These elements are explored using Kids' Stuff classroom instruments .We discuss each instrument's timbre (tone 'color') and how the sound is produced. These typically include:

RHYTHMIC INSTRUMENTS

- Maracas & Shakers
- Metal Instruments: jingle bells/tambourines/triangles/tambourine sticks/finger cymbals
- Wooden Instruments: tone block/sand block/rhythm sticks
- Drums: lollipop /tom tom /bongo /gathering

MELODIC INSTRUMENTS

- Hand bells
- Cow bells
- Boomwackers
- Step bells
- Resonator bells
- Xylophones

We study the different Orchestra families: Percussion, String, Woodwind and Brass.

We also spend time studying 'music that tells a story', and incorporate creative musical projects.

PRESENTATIONS/CONCERTS

The students enjoy preparing for, and performing at, the annual Winter Holiday Concert, where they also sing in Spanish; and the year-end Mother's Day presentation, as an opportunity to display the various musical skills learned throughout the year.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Kids' Stuff has cultivated our existing Physical Education Program to include exciting new format that incorporates sessions such as muscle strengthening, whole body conditioning, teamwork and good sportsmanship ethics as well as smart food choices.

ART

In addition to the thematic illustrative writing and storytelling experienced during Language Arts/Literacy, Kids' Stuff incorporates designated artistic instruction sessions where students will explore uses of different art mediums and expression.

GUIDANCE

There are other considerations, besides program academics, that influence a child's success in (and out) of school. Among these are feelings of capability and personal significance, and the capacity to formulate positive and constructive choices in the face of disappointment and challenges.

Using methods designed for early elementary grades, our Guidance program helps our children:

- improve upon important positive thinking skills,
- cope with unfounded fears,
- develop anger control,
- realize competencies,
- recognize their worth and
- how to be a good friend.

Our cognitive approach to teaching positive self-esteem skills through a structured, sequential, and skill-based approach includes stories, story discussion, songs, and sharing.

The above concepts are introduced to create a baseline on each child, from Advanced Pre-Kindergarten level up to Kindergarten level. First Grade Concepts will be introduced and developed once these levels are mastered.

THE KINDERGARTEN TEAM

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL GROWTH

CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS.

While in the classroom we will work on many areas of expected conduct. These include:

- following classroom and school rules,
- coping with problem situations in an acceptable manner,
- participating and contributing during group activities,
- sharing materials and taking turns with equipment and supplies,
- respecting the rights, feelings and property of others,
- transitioning appropriately from active to quiet tasks smoothly,
- demonstrating the ability to be both a leader and a follower at appropriate times,
- making appropriate use of classroom time,
- selecting a wide variety of activities and materials and
- demonstrating responsibility in managing personal needs.

HOW TO GET INVOLVED

Studies show that when parents are involved with their child's education, the child usually enjoys learning and school life more. This involvement improves their academic skills and attitude which enables them to do better in school, develop confidence in themselves and they become better prepared for the future.

Kids' Stuff encourages our parents to become as involved as possible, while realizing the need for structure and routine in the classroom. There will always be opportunities to chaperone field trips, get to know your child's teachers, volunteer inside the classroom, and become involved in homework or class projects. Participating in just one of these types of activities emphasizes to, your child that value you place on education.

WHAT CAN I DO AT HOME TO PREPARE MY CHILD?

There are many things that you can do at home to prepare your child for their Kindergarten year and to enrich the experience they have here at Kids' Stuff.

- Stimulate a love of literature by reading and discussing a variety of literature with your child.
 - Remember to include nursery rhymes, poems, fiction and non-fiction, characters, settings, problems and resolutions
 - Encourage your child to use oral language by speaking with them about their daily experiences.
 - Ask them to describe things they see or do.
 - Question them about what they did, what they see, where they are going, or where they have been.
- Provide opportunities to play, share, and work with other children.
- Provide opportunities to work with scissors, crayons, markers, pencils, pens, glue, paint, chalk, play-doh, or clay.
- Teach your child to become independent with snapping, buttoning, and zipping clothing; putting on and removing sweaters and jackets; and cleaning up and putting items away when finished.

CLASSROOM INFORMATION

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Each week your child's teacher will send a copy of their 'Classroom Times' to advise you on classroom happenings including:

- Week at a glance updates reminders
- The week's curriculum.
- Details of curriculum covered by Inter-curricular subjects

• Important due dates, events, or information you need for the week Please ensure that you read the Classroom Times each week.

WHEN SCHOOL BEGINS

SCHEDULE

Kindergarten class students should all to be dropped off at the Kindergarten playground where they will play until class begins at 9:15 a.m.

During the first week of school, we invite you to bring your child in to the classroom every day if you would like. Class will begin every day at 9:15 am; the teacher will relax the morning schedule slightly from 9:00 am until 9:15am every day that first week. During those 15 minutes, you can remain in the classroom, watch your child as they begin to set up their day, help them find where they will sit, where their backpack will be kept, etc.

The teacher will begin class at 9:15 AM; we suggest a swift exit as we find that lingering goodbyes are harder for the child.

Please feel free to call the school after you have left the property to check that your child adjusted well to his/her day.

After the first week, normal drop off arrangements should be followed.

BELONGINGS

Please provide your child with a backpack and a change of clothes

Label all belongings such as backpacks, lunchboxes, jackets, sweaters, etc., with your child's name.

ATTIRE

A large portion of Kids' Stuff activities require active play as well as painting, coloring, and pasting. Dress your child in comfortable clothes that are allowed to "get messy.".

Comfortable close-toe shoes are required.

We signed him up. And let me tell you, that first day of school, I knew right away we made the right decision. He was going back to Kids' Stuff, which always felt like home. That was such a relief for me. But for him, he could feel as though he was moving forward. He got to go to the schooler house, which was a big deal to him. He got to go to the big kids' playground. He got his own cubby and his name on the table.
