Cantor's Corner

Those of you who attended our first "creative service" end of February heard Ki Tisa as the Torah portion. All kinds of excitement going on here, culminating in the building of the Mishkan, the sanctuary in which God will dwell, and the infamous Golden Calf. What I found intriguing is the name of the builder/designer of the Mishkan, Betzalel, can be translated in one of two ways. One is Be-tzel-El..."in the shadow of God." Or it can mean "The Divine Egg" Betza-L'El...because we incubate the divine potential within us. Doing a little research on this, I stumbled upon the concept of the cosmic egg. Apparently this was known in ancient Egypt (appropriate for Ki Tisa) and the geometry of the cosmic, or Divine Egg, was the origin of the tale "The Goose that Laid the Golden Egg" long before Aesop stumbled on the idea. Who knew! The Great Pyramid at Khufu was a temple to the earthmoon egg (if you draw an oval around the earth and moon together). A hen's egg has the same proportion as does what is known as the Egyptian Triangle giving rise to the pyramid. There are many Divine Eggs in the universe, so it is no coincidence that Judaism teaches of the Divine Egg within us...that spark we all have that turns ideas into reality. My goal this month is to take a little more time to nurture my own Egg and not be so distracted by "important" things that I ignore the divine potential within me. What nurtures your Egg? Yoga? Reading? Swimming? Knitting? Sewing? Cooking? Singing? Taking time for that Divine Egg is as important as anything else you may do. It is nearly Spring...a time of incubation for those Eggs. Let's share some of them in the coming month as we practice becoming mishkans, holy sanctuaries, ourselves.

Purim: History

The story of Purim is found in the Book of Esther, one of the books in the *Ketuvim* (Writings) section of the Tanakh. It is set in the land of Persia (current day Iran) at the time when Ahashverosh was king. King Ahashverosh held a banquet in the capital city of Shushan and ordered his queen, Vashti, to come and dance before his guests. She refused to appear and lost her royal position.

Acting on advice from his counselors, Ahashverosh held a pageant to choose a new queen. Mordechai, a Jewish man living in Shushan, encouraged his cousin, Esther, to enter the competition. Esther won but, following the advice of her cousin, did not reveal her Jewish origin to the king.

Mordechai often sat near the gate of the king's palace. One day he overheard two men, Bigthan and Teresh, plotting to kill the king. Mordechai reported what he had heard to Esther. She then reported the information to the king. The matter was investigated and found to be true, and Bigthan and Teresh came to an unfortunate end. Mordechai's deed was recorded in the king's diary.


Meanwhile, the king's evil adviser, Haman, paraded through the streets, demanding that all bow down to him. Because Jews do not bow to anyone but God, Mordechai refused to bow down to Haman. Upon learning that Mordechai was Jewish, Haman decided to kill all the Jews in the Persian empire. He plotted to kill them—convincing King Ahashverosh to go along with the plan—and cast *purim* ("lots," plural of *pur*), a kind of lottery, to determine the day on which he would carry out his evil deed: the 13th of Adar.

However, Mordechai alerted Esther to Haman's evil plot, and Esther, in turn, revealed her Jewish identity to the King, convincing him to save the Jews and foiling Haman's plot. Haman was hanged, Mordechai received his estates and the position of royal vizier, and the Jews of Persia celebrated their narrow escape on the 14th of Adar, the day after they were supposed to be annihilated.

Thus, the fate Haman had planned for the Jews became his own. The holiday of Purim celebrates the bravery of Esther and Mordechai and the deliverance of the Jewish people from the cruelty of oppression.

Although Purim is observed in most places on the 14th of Adar, in Jerusalem, it is celebrated on the 15th. *M'gillat Esther* explains, "on the thirteenth day of the twelfth month—that is the month of Adar—when the king's command and decree were to be executed, the very day on which the enemies of the Jews intended to have rule over them, the opposite happened, and the Jews prevailed over their adversaries." The Jews fought and won on the 13th of Adar and celebrated the following day. However, *M'gillat Esther* continues by explaining that the Jews did not defeat their enemies until the 14th of Adar in the walled city of Shushan. Therefore, cities that were enclosed during the time of Joshua do not celebrate until the 15th of Adar, which has been appropriately named Shushan Purim. Because of the significance of Jerusalem, Purim is celebrated on Shushan Purim.

Key ruling in SPLC case: Court rejects neo-Nazi's First Amendment defense

MISSOULA, Montana – A federal judge has rejected neo-Nazi leader Andrew Anglin's attempt to dismiss an SPLC lawsuit seeking to hold him accountable for orchestrating a campaign of terror against a Jewish woman and her family in Montana.

Anglin claimed in court filings that he was simply exercising his free speech rights when he incited a virtual army of online followers to harass Tanya Gersh, real estate agent living in Whitefish.

Case will proceed to trial

The Gersh family, including Tanya's 12-year-old son, received hundreds of intimidating and threatening messages, including emails, phone calls and postcards, over a period of months.

Chief Judge Dana L. Christensen of the U.S. District Court in Montana accepted a magistrate's earlier recommendation and ruled against Anglin on November 14. The ruling means the case will proceed to trial.

"This important ruling underscores what both we and our client have said from the beginning of this case — that online campaigns of hate, threats, and intimidation have no place in a civil society and enjoy no protection under our Constitution," said David Dinielli, the SPLC attorney leading the case.

The suit accuses Anglin of invading Gersh's privacy and intentionally inflicting emotional distress. It also outlines how his campaign violated the Montana Anti-Intimidation Act.

'Let's Hit Em Up'

Anglin operates a website called the Daily Stormer, which takes its name from the Nazi propaganda sheet Der Stürmer and is the leading white supremacist web forum in the country.

In December 2016, Anglin published dozens of articles urging his followers to launch a "troll storm" targeting Gersh, who he accused of trying to extort money from the mother of white nationalist leader Richard Spencer. Gersh had offered to help the woman sell a building in Whitefish after residents of the town planned to protest her son's activities at the site.

Anglin and Spencer are both prominent leaders of the "alt-right" movement, and Anglin helped promote the deadly "Unite the Right" white supremacist rally in Charlottesville, Virginia, in August 2017.

"Tell them you are sickened by their Jew agenda," Anglin wrote under the headline "Jews Targeting Richard Spencer's Mother for Harassment and Extortion – TAKE ACTION!" The post included Gersh's contact information. It also included photographs of Gersh, her husband and son. One was altered to include a yellow Star of David with the label "Jude" – an allusion to the emblem the Nazi regime required Jews to wear during World War II.

Antisemitic hate, death threats

Anglin launched his campaign with these words: "Let's Hit Em Up. Are y'all ready for an old-fashioned Troll Storm? Because AYO — it's that time, fam."

One message received by Gersh included an image of her being sprayed with a green gas, along with the words: *Hickory dickory dock, the kike ran up the clock. The clock struck three and the Internet Nazis trolls gassed the rest of them.*

There were also phone calls that consisted only of the sound of gunshots.
