# Another Florida Special Session Called on Insurance Crisis for after the November 8th Elections.

Gov. Ron DeSantis on Thursday said Florida legislative leaders agreed to hold a special session after the Nov. 8 election and before the end of the year to address the state's crumbling property insurance industry, an issue with

increased urgency in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian, according to an article in Politico.com on October 20th. DeSantis also said the Legislature will provide property tax rebates to areas affected by the catastrophic storm, which left more than 100 people dead and destroyed some coastal communities.

The insurance crisis in Florida continues to be a red hot issue as many major insurance companies have pulled out of the state altogether and many more are poised to follow. Leaving homeowners with few options and Florida's state-backed Citizens Insurance dangerously overburdened.

- May's special session provided a \$2 billion reinsurance fund to help protect insurance companies, however just one storm, Hurricane Ian has already resulted in over 500,000 claims worth over \$6.5 billion.
- Citizens Insurance, Floridas insurer of 'last resort' has ballooned to over 1
  million customers this past year because of insurers leaving the state or
  refusing to insure Floridians property.
- Legislation passed in May to reduce the number of claims and lawsuits filed by unscrupulous contractors taking advantage of Floridians with storm damaged property needs more.

Residents need to be aware of these issues as they will affect your ability to obtain and retain homeowners insurance policies on mobile homes. Last May legislators approved language that gives insurers the right to REQUIRE homeowner repair or replace older roofs or windows BEFORE WRITING new or replacement policies. A new proposal for the upcoming session is to PRORATE the replacement value of the homeowners roof based on its age. So if your roof is blown off in a hurricane, and is near the end of a twenty year life span, regular less of condition, then you will close to NOTHING (or a very small percentage) in replacement value. This will be done to force homeowners to get their homes inspected and roofs replaced much sooner; paid out of homeowners pocket as a maintenance cost.

We will try to keep our residents abreast of legislative issues that affect you, in an informative, apolitical manner. As homeowners in Oaks Royal 3 it is your right to voice your opinions on these matters to your state representatives.
