Do you have any favorite, unexpected elements that you love to use in your projects?

My go-to wall color is BRIGHT white or a warm gray. I love Coventry Gray by Benjamin Moore!

Do you find yourself frequently changing up the aesthetic in your own spaces?

I feel like I am always changing up my spaces. Spaces are best when they evolve over time, feel collected and are imperfect. That's not something you achieve in a single-go design plan. I am always changing art, mirrors, decorative objects, and furniture placement.

I first took classes at UCLA extension for interior design and then moved to New York City after undergrad at USC's Marshall School of Business, and enrolled at Parsons for my masters in Interior Design.
