As you may remember, we've been discussing the recent new legislation which increases the distance a vessel must maintain from a southern resident killer whale/orca from 4,000 yards to 1,000 yards. This will become effective January 1, 2025. RBAW is awaiting the next steps to have a representative be part of the taskforce to determine education, outreach, and enforcement.

Be on the lookout for the RBAW newsletter in your inbox later this month. They are also interested in any legislative priorities our members are concerned about. The current priorities are the watercraft excise tax depreciation schedule for vessels owned more than 15 years, Lakebay marina, derelict vessels and boating access as well as boating safety.

## Open Duties on WSYC Board

#### **DUTIES OF THE REAR COMMODORE**

Shall obtain moorage, plan, organize & be in charge of all club sponsored cruises including the Sweetheart land Cruise. Turn in receipts for reservations into the Purser for payment and/or reimbursement.

Note: Many of the marinas are booked a year in advance. It's best to book Des Moines for the Seafood feed and Brownsville for the Steak Fry for the following year while the club is there in the current year. The park and Brownsville YC clubhouse must be booked separately (also a year in advance).

Shall obtain moorages for all cruises, including the Sweetheart Cruise, Steak Fry & Seafood feed.

Should attempt to be the 1st to arrive at the destinations or designate a cruise captain. This is to enable them to direct arriving vessels to available moorage.

Is responsible for organizing potlucks, games, contests, or other events that are part of the cruise, and any appropriate prizes.

For Steak Fry, this includes providing lunch and drinks for Saturday.

Is responsible for alerting the Telephone Committee to contact the membership regarding their attendance on the cruises. This will enable him/her to plan moorage, make dinner reservations, etc.

#### **General Meeting duties:**

Selling 3/3/3 tickets for the name drawing & raffles at the monthly meetings.

Purser will assist with keeping the paid members current for the name drawing.

Submit a written report each month to the Anchorline Editor, including information on upcoming cruises & a report on past cruises. Exception, July & August.

Shall coordinate & cooperate with the other officers in the performance of their duties.

The Board of Trustees control and manage the club's finances, budgets, activities, and affairs of the club. Decisions regarding appropriate funds are a board decision and should not be voted on at General Meetings. Discussions regarding finances are appropriate but voting shall be the responsibility of the Board of Trustees.

Shall meet at a regular time each month, to be fixed by the Board and at such other times as may be directed by the Commodore.

Six (6) Board members shall constitute a working quorum.

Shall have power, by appointment, to fill any vacancies occurring in any elective office or in its membership until the next annual election.

Read & understand the club's bi-laws.

Note: It is helpful to have the Anchorline Editor and Storekeeper present, as well as any other Chairmen who have reports to be given to the Board. All Board meetings are open to ALL members

# **Upcoming Open Position of Anchorline Editor and Webmaster**

The Anchorline is created in the format of Publisher, but whomever takes this task on may change to a format they are comfortable creating.

The Webmaster duties are on GoDaddy web design. It is a user-friendly platform. A guidance manual and the past editor will be by your side to help with transitioning.

#### DUTIES OF YEARBOOK EDITOR

- Make changes from the previous Yearbook and save as new. The format is currently maintained in Publisher.
- Update the Officers and Committee Members. Get pictures of new Officers and see if any of the Officers moving up in the chairs want a new picture.
- Update Past Commodore list. Add a star to the Membership list for the new Past Commodore. c. Add Family/Male/Female of the Year and find a picture of them.
- Ask the Reciprocal Rep if there are any changes to the Reciprocal list.
- 5. Obtain a copy of the Cruise & Social schedules and update.
- Check with Purser to make sure new members are added and members who have withdrawn from the club are removed.
- 7. Check with Members to verify their information is up-to-date.
  - a. Boat information
  - b. Address
  - c. Phone numbers
  - d. Email address
- 8. Update Current Membership information.
- Find pictures of members. These are usually found on the WSYC Facebook page.
  - Download pictures that would be good to use.
  - Determine which ones to use and where/how to put them into the yearbook pages.
  - Copy/paste into the Yearbook pages and format to fit.
- Send out WSYC FYIs to the Officers and ask if there are changes or updates to be made.
- 11. Update the By-Laws if there have been changes. Language should be in the minutes from the board & membership meetings when voted in.
- 12. When changes complete, save as PDF and have the Past Commodore review for accuracy and/or
- 13.Make changes as necessary
- 14.Save as PDF again and contact vendor for quote and printing. We have been using Lancer LTD in Spokane. All correspondence is done via their website and phone calls. <a href="https://www.lancerltd.com">www.lancerltd.com</a>
- 15. Receive the new Yearbooks
- 16.Mark one for each Member (couple)
- 17. Give to the Purser, who will:
  - Distribute to Members who are in good standing.
  - Provide extra inserts to the New Membership Rep.
  - Provide extra inserts to the Storekeeper for purchase.
