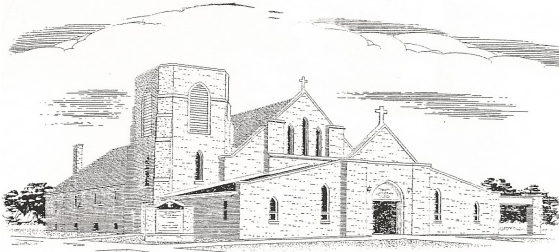

Psalm 25:1–10; antiphon: v. 6


¹To you, O LORD,
