Sisters and Brothers in Ministry,

Psalm 107 is one of many "thanksgiving" psalms in the Bible. As we prepare to celebrate Stewardship Sunday as we dedicate our estimate of giving cards and make our commitment to God and the church, the opening words of this psalm ring out in my head. "Give thanks to the Lord because he is good, because his faithful love lasts forever!" The psalm continues with reason after reason that the people of God have for giving thanks to God.

The Interpretation and Stewardship Committee continues to prepare for the upcoming 2017 budget and Fall Stewardship Campaign. You have probably received your Commitment Letters and Celebration of Giving Cards in the mail. We hope that you are prayerfully considering your 2017 commitment. As Thanksgiving comes upon us, look to all the blessings in your lives and thank God for everything you have.

As of the end of September, our expenditures continue to be under budget, however, we spent \$2,000 more than we received in the General Fund. The Treasurer and the I&S Committee are monitoring the accounts. The Giving Statements for the three quarters ending September 30, 2016 are also being prepared for disbursement in the next few days. The financial secretary and treasurer have faced many challenges this year with the new accounting software and progress has been slow. HEALTH MINISTRIES

NOT JUST FOR WOMEN!

Many men might think of osteoporosis as a women's disease. Don't put yourself at risk of broken bones or worse. The bone thinning disease affects up to two million aging men. Men rarely get screened for osteoporosis, many doctors also may not be aware of it's impact on men.



SHARE YOUR HISTORY--- tell the doctor if osteoporosis runs in your family. STRENGTHEN YOUR BONES--Do weight bearing exercises to build up your bones. Walking and running are both fabulous. Wear the proper shoes so you don't jar your bones, joints, or tendons.

EAT RIGHT---Nutrition is a keystone of protection. For bone protection that means calcium and vitamin D often in supplement form. Check with your doctor.

WEAR PROPER SHOES---It is imperative you have the proper footwear to prevent a fall that could result in a fracture. Check your shoes to be sure they are still in good shape. You need a pair of shoes you can trust. Stay safe and strong.


