





KNOW YOUR FAITH

LENT: A New Dawn On Our Conversion Journey. Fr. Stephen Sohe



It is about the time again when the Church provides us with the opportunity to trace in a very special way back to God's grace and mercy-the season of Lent. For the next forty days, we will be opportune to focus our attention on religious practices and spirituality of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednes-

day. On Ash Wednesday, the Christian faithful receive on their foreheads the sign of the cross with ashes, a gesture that symbolizes repentance. Ashes in this sense symbolizes mourning, penance and mortality. These symbols are implied in the words that are pronounced as the priest or deacon bestrews the ashes on the forehead of the faithful-You are dust and unto dust you shall return.

The relation of ashes to repentance dates back to the ancient times. It is rooted in the practice observed by a public penitent. From the time of the ancient Israel for instance, those who repented of their sins strew ashes on themselves and clothed themselves in sackcloth. (cf. Esther 4:1; Job 42:6; Dan 9:3; Jonah 3:5-6; Matthew 1:12).

Although we may not cover our entire body with ashes and dress in sackcloth on Ash Wednesday, we are obliged to fast and abstain from meat, with the exception of those who are below the age of 14 and above the age of 60, or anyone who is physically healthy to fast, the same goes for Good Friday. In addition to these spiritual exercises are some external changes like color, decorations, acclamations and songs. Color of vestments including banners, change to purple or violet. Decorations are minimal, and in most cases no floral arrangements. Most significantly, the Gloria and Alleluia are not sung.

Mark your calendars now, let's all show-up for this special event in honor of our patron saint, Joseph the spouse of the blessed Virgin Mary. A repast will be held in the parish hall immediately after Mass .
