August 4, 2019 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 12:13-21

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Here we go again. Someone goes to Jesus with the demand, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me" (Luke 12:13). Do you hear an echo of Martha's micromanaging from a couple of weeks ago, going on here, too? She told Jesus 'Tell her to help me" (Lk 10:40). So today someone else is demanding that Jesus 'TELL' someone else to do something. Jesus listens, but does not feed the 'control impulse' of others who want the world pressed into their service. It is so easy to just go around demanding that everyone do exactly what we want them to do. Every day we are tempted to 'meddle' and tell others what to do in their life, or even tell others what they should tell others to do with their lives. Absolutely, our Good Shepherd Jesus always wants to help us. He desires what is best for all of us. God's Will is for the eternal fulfillment (salvation) of everyone, as 1 Timothy 2:3-4 says, "What is good and pleasing to God ... who wills that everyone be saved...". Jesus Himself says in John 6:40, "the Will of my Father, is that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life." In John 10:10, He says, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." But a good question is "What does that Willing of God look like-How does it happen?" First, it must be personal and voluntary. We cannot be dragged into heaven. We must choose Christ and the Good. God calls, and we answer (or not). God offers. We accept. This is the liberating way of Goodness. Back on September 27, 2011, Pope Benedict XVI gave a homily to the German Bishops at Freiburg and reflected upon the parable of two sons who were called to serve their father (Matthew 21:28-32). In the parable, Jesus commends the son who *freely serves* the father. The son who serves freely, does not do so under pressure to look good, or because he feels coerced into working. So, God doesn't desire begrudging service from us out of compulsion. No, He desires our voluntary service given out of compassion. Pope Benedict says, "God exercises his power differently from the way we normally do. He has placed a limit on his power, by recognizing the freedom of his creatures.....God respects our freedom. He does not constrain us. He is waiting for us to say 'yes'...." For our service to be genuine, it must come from our hearts. Just as 'shotgun marriages' are not valid, so also there is no 'baptism at the end of the sword'. While in the Church's history, out of sinful zeal 'forced conversions' have been conducted (with ultimatums like 'be baptized or die'), that violent manipulation is a perversion of true faith. The whole idea of loving God and neighbor with all one's heart, all one's mind and all one's being, means the choice is made freely and without reservation (I'm all-in). The next natural step is to share such freedom with others, not make them 'accept it'. St Paul tells us in Galatians 5:1 "For freedom, you were set free." And St Peter in 1 Pet 2:16, says "Be free, yet without using your freedom as a pretext for evil." Our mindset should be, "I don't have to serve God, I want to serve God!"

So in this case of brothers fighting over an estate inheritance, what is Jesus saying? "Work it out. Is the property more valuable than the relationship? Do you want a brother or do you want the twenty acres? Will the twenty acres get you to heaven?" I hear Jesus saying we should be careful about what we tangle over with others? They may choose to sin out of greed. But if we fight in the mix over material goods and even win, what have gained? I find it a moment of growth and maturity whenever we overcome an opponent and then realize, "I won, but I lost?" I can get my way, but lose my way. Or lose "the Way-Jesus" (John 14:6). Some people learn this early in life. If so, give praise to God. But sadly some people do not learn this until much later in life (a great cause for prayer). What is really gained, and what is lost? The 'bigger brother' will let go of the dispute, saying, "You can have the land, I want a brother." I like how the Alanis Morrisette song 'Thank U' says it, "The moment I let go of it, Was the moment I got more than I could handle." Jesus teaches His followers in Mathew 5:25 "Settle with your opponent quickly while on the way to court with him." And St Paul in 1 Corinthians 6:7 says, "Now indeed in any case, it is a failure on your part that you have lawsuits against one another. Why not rather put up with injustice? Why not rather let yourselves be cheated?" The world's courts and commercial centers are filled with greedy lawsuits and grasping at money claims. Our Amish brothers and sisters believe all court litigation claims and entanglement should be avoided. I am not saying it is always done, but they raise the moral question to me "Should Christians be in the middle of all that legal controversy over material possessions, or worse, even initiate them?" A challenge here: St Paul says in Romans 12:18 "live at peace with everyone."
