ACS Contractor Rights and Responsibilities

1. As a contractor for ACS, you have the right to refuse any work offered to you either by ACS or directly through the client.
2. As a contractor for ACS, you also have the right to set your own rates and policies.
3. As a contractor for ACS, you are directly responsible to comply with all FAA regulatory training, medical, duty and rest requirements.
4. As a contractor for ACS, you are responsible to ensure that you are in compliance with any, and all other clients policies.
5. As a contractor for ACS, you are responsible to ensure that you have adequate time, both before and after each work assignment, to comply with outside obligations and FAA requirements; as schedule often change due to the needs of the client and mechanical interruptions.
6. As a contractor for ACS, If you are unable to complete an assignment that you have accepted, due to illness or some unforeseen circumstances, you have the responsibility to notify ACS or the client as soon as practicable.
7. As a contractor for ACS, you are responsible to comply with all local, state and federal tax requirements.
