ROSENBERG HANGS ON FOR FIRST GISBT CHAMPIONSHIP

KOLBERG WINS TITLE IN TOUR DEBUT

ROSENBERG PARLAYS BIG QUALIFYING LEAD INTO VICTORY

Kyle Rosenberg put on a phenomenal display during his qualifying round, and then watched that lead slowly evaporate before gathering himself just in the nick of time.

The 2-hander from Modesto, California overcame the challenging 39-foot plutonium lane pattern by averaging 233.50 for his 8 qualifying games. This easily outpaced the field, and that enabled him to roll into the finals with a bulging 179-pin edge. This was a stellar display, especially considering the boy's cut to match play fell at +9.

The champion began his match play round with a 147, but regrouped and ultimately headed into the position round with a slim 15-pin lead, setting up a championship tilt against his collegiate teammate Andrei Tacorda. Rosenberg won that match 225-184 to claim the title.

CHAMP IS NOW A 7-TIME FINALIST

Rosenberg was appearing in his 7th match play finals – but this was easily the best performance of his career. His best prior finish on tour was a runner-up showing at last season's October event in Waterloo. He took home the winner's share \$750 scholarship, the championship plaque, and a permanent place on Champion's Row. Congratulations, Kyle!

FIELD OF 81 COMPETES AT MAPLE

This month's event drew 81 entrants (59 boys and 22 girls). The GISBT welcomed 8 players who made their tour debut this month.

SIDERS RALLIES FOR RUNNER-UP FINISH

Kendric Siders continued his fabulous start to the season at this month's event. The righthander from Eagle River, Alaska captured our season-opening event last month in Davenport, and this month, he took home runner-up honors with a stout match-play rally that enabled him to reel in a \$600 scholarship.

Siders used a final game 218 to squeeze into the match play finals by just 7 pins. Once there, he was the sharpest bowler, averaging 210.62 for his 8 matches, and posting a 6-2 record along the way. Siders won his position match with 215, and that was enough for him to slide into the runner-up spot by a single pin.

TACORDA TAKES 3rd

Andrei Tacorda finished 3rd this month. The Roseville, California native was on the cusp of his first tour title by posting 6 wins and 1 tie in his first 7 matches. That put him in prime position for victory, but his position round defeat ultimately knocked him into 3rd place – just 1 pin behind the runner-up spot.

This matched the highest finish of Tacorda's GISBT career. He previously finished 3rd at the January 2022 tour event. The 2-hander won a \$500 scholarship for his performance. It was his 7th match play finals appearance.

VENEM FINISHES 4th

Ryan Venem returned to the finals, and his efforts netted him a \$400 scholarship. One of 3 southpaws in this month's match play round, Venem was in solid form all day, resulting in his 2nd tour finals appearance. The 21 year-old tour veteran enjoyed his breakthrough victory at last season's Tournament of Champions.

BIERI BAGS 5th

Keaten Bieri finished 5th this time out. The Letts, Iowa resident was appearing in his 6th career match play finals. Bieri earned a \$350 scholarship for his efforts.

YOUNG TAKES 6th

Will Young, a Summerville, South Carolina resident, was this month's 6th place finisher. The 20 year-old was one of five 2-handers in this month's boy's finals; he was rewarded with a \$325 scholarship.

VANVEGHEL PLACES 7th

River Vanveghel returned to the match play finals for the 4th time in his tour career, and the Waterloo, Illinois native eventually finished 7th, earning a \$300 scholarship award for his efforts.

NAKAGAWA 8th IN FINALS DEBUT

Raiden Nakagawa completed this month's boys' finals field by finishing in 8th place. The righthander from Kaneohe, Hawaii was appearing in his 2nd GISBT event, and was rewarded with a \$275 scholarship for his day's work.

KOLBERG CLAIMS TITLE IN GISBT DEBUT

KOLBERG DOMINANT FROM START TO FINISH

Megan Kolberg put on a dominant display of shot making at this month's tour stop. The southpaw from Sycamore, Illinois averaged 215.87 for her 8-game qualifying round, giving her a 157-pin lead heading into the finals. While that lead shrunk considerably, she finished strong with games of 231, 205 and a big 257 in her final position round, and those numbers gave her a commanding 271-pin margin of victory.

Kolberg's win was one of the more dominant victories in recent memory. She dominated in qualifying, and then was the best during the finals by averaging 211.33 for her 6 games, and posting a 4-2 ledger along the way.

This was Kolberg's tour debut as well. Ironically, the last time a female competitor won in their tour debut also came at Maple Lanes. That happened 13 years ago - when Brandi Branki won in her GISBT debut back on September 12, 2010. The champion took home all the spoils of victory; those included the championship plaque, a \$500 scholarship, and a permanent place on Champion's Row. Congratulations, Megan!

3-TIME CHAMP MADISON SECURES RUNNER-UP SHOWING

Brynna Madison turned in another successful showing. The slender stroker from Lincoln, qualified for her 16th match play finals, and her day resulted in a runner-up finish, and the accompanying \$400 payday. Madison has logged a bevy of high finishes over the past 4 seasons, including 3 tour championships.

ABDUL JALIL 3rd IN TOUR DEBUT

Malaysia's Nada Abdul Jalil roared into her very first GISBT event, and when it was all said and done, she had recorded an impressive 3rd place finish. The right-hander took home a \$300 scholarship for her performance.

DAY FINISHES 4th

Chloe Day was this month's 4th place finisher. The Galesburg, Illinois native earned a \$250 payday for her efforts. This was the 4th match play finals of her tour career.

4-TIME TOUR CHAMP MOORE FINISHES 5th

Rachel Moore was this month's 5th place finisher. The right-hander from Keokuk, Iowa took home a \$225 scholarship by virtue of her performance. The was her 20th match play finals. ULLIAN PLACES 6th

Kenzie Ullian rounded out this month's match play finals field; she picked up a \$200 scholarship for her performance. The right-handed stroker from New Lenox, Illinois was appearing in her 2nd consecutive match play finals.
