## From the Desk of Rabbi Daniel Polish



### Chanukah in a Time of Darkness

To tell the truth, Labor Day does not work for me. Nothing about the way it is celebrated or the season it comes in says anything to me about the dignity of labor. Nor do so many of the holidays that have been arbitrarily dropped onto our civic calendar. That's not the case with our Jewish holidays. And not because I am a parochial person. Pesach makes perfect sense in the Spring, with its promise of new birth and liberation from the grip of winter. The rabbis went out of their way to structure their essentially lunar calendar to keep our holidays and festivals connected to their appropriate season. And they were ingenious in the way they devised celebrations that evoke the very heart of the holiday they are associated with.

And so, we prepare to celebrate Chanukah. Everything about it – the historical events it commemorates, the rituals we perform during it, the season of the year it falls – all deliver the same message. And it is a message we are sorely in need of hearing right now. Chanukah comes at the time of the year when things are darkest. Days are short and night is long. We celebrate it by lighting candles—progressively more candles each night. More light. And it calls to mind the events of a victory in which brutal might did not prevail. It is a story of the triumph of good over evil, right over might.

Altogether Chanukah conveys in so many ways the hopeful message that when things get dark, when wrong seems so pervasive that we fear for its complete triumph, light pierces through the darkness, truth is vindicated and righteousness prevails. How fortunate we are to have Chanukah's message at this time. This is a moment we really need it.

I hope you revel in your celebration of Chanukah and are warmed by the promise it brings us.

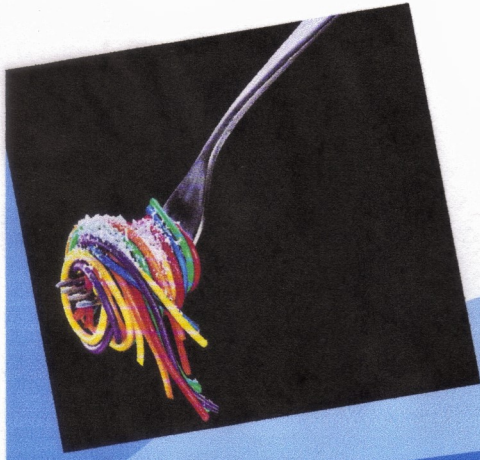

# Member's Corner

## Ginger Cookies with Maple Frosting by Robbie Schiff

### FOR THE COOKIES:

2 cups whole wheat pastry flour  
1 tsp. baking soda  
¼ tsp. sea salt  
½ tsp. each cloves and cinnamon  
2 ½ tsp. ground ginger or 1 ½ Tbls. grated fresh ginger (peel first)  
1/3 cup grapeseed oil  
¼ cup molasses  
¼ cup non-dairy milk  
1 cup organic sugar (for soft version use brown sugar for crisper version use turbanado)  
1 tsp. vanilla extract

### FOR THE FROSTING:

1 cup powdered sugar, sifted  
1 Tbls. Vegan margarine  
2 Tbls. Maple syrup  
1 Tbls. Non-dairy milk  
1 tsp. vanilla  
Dried pineapple chunks or crystalized ginger



Pre heat oven to 350 – line two cookie sheet with parchment paper

Mix the dry ingredients. Put the oil in a measuring cup followed by molasses, sugar, milk and vanilla – combine. Combine wets and drys – no machines needed – mix until just well combined. The dough will be easier to work with if you refrigerate it for at least half an hour – longer is fine too. Form into small balls (use hands or cookie scoop). Arrange on cookie sheet – flatten them a bit. Bake 12-14 minutes – they will start to crack. While baking, make the maple frosting. Sift one cup powdered sugar. If you don't have a sifter, use a strainer. Add vegan margarine, mix with fork. Then add syrup and n-d milk and vanilla. Mix well. Cookies will be soft, but will harden as they cool. After five minutes, transfer to cooling rack. Frost when cool. Add a small piece of candied pineapple or crystalized ginger in the center. As you can see I don't frost the whole top, looks good to show some of the cookie. These freeze well – good make ahead item. Easy for potlucks or meetings and also work well for holidays. Yes, they go anywhere! These are vegan – you can bake without eggs or even egg substitute. I enjoy showing people that vegan food is delicious. I won't be looking over your shoulder, but appreciate your using non-dairy milk when making these. Questions or comments welcome. About Ovens: I discovered that it was taking longer to bake, so I bought an oven thermometer. Yes, my oven temperature was way off! I know I can have it calibrated, but now I keep the thermometer inside and know that 380 gives me 350, but I check it every time.
