God wants us to experience His peace. The peace that passes understanding, so when He sent His son to into the world He sent to us The Prince of Peace... Jesus.

For unto us a child is born; unto us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder. These will be his royal titles: "Wonderful," "Counselor," "The Mighty God," "The Everlasting Father," "The Prince of Peace."

Isaiah 9:6

Jesus IS our peace. The Prince of Peace is our ultimate source of peace. But... how do we get from Jesus being our peace to actually living a peaceful life? How in this tumultuous unpeaceful world can we have peace?

We have to receive it.

God doesn't make things complicated for us. We do. The peace we long for comes as a gift. And long ago it came as a priceless gift wrapped in swaddling clothes. Within this incredible gift, we have an amazing blessing...

For God's secret plan, now at last made known, is Christ himself. In him lie hidden all the mighty, untapped treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

Colossians 2:2-3

The peace that we so badly want for our lives and our world IS Christ. We must choose to receive HIM... follow Him... trust Him... make Him our source for living. Just as you trusted Christ to save you, trust him, too, for each day's problems; live in vital union with him. Let your roots grow down into him and draw up nourishment from him. See that you go on growing in the Lord, and become strong and vigorous in the truth you were taught. Let your lives overflow with joy and thanksgiving for all he has done.

Colossians 2:6-7

When our hearts and lives are rooted in Christ, we give the Holy Spirit an opportunity to work in our hearts... The Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Galatians 5:22-23

One of the fruits of the Spirit's work in our lives is PEACE. That means that we become peacemakers, peace-givers. Our world may be filled with unrest, turmoil, and the lack of peace. **But this Christmas... you can bring peace to that broken hurting unpeaceful world.** And you can do it by stepping out of the busyness for a bit. Taking time to reflect on your heart and on the gift, you've been given.

You see this season of Advent is a little bit like Lent. Don't think we're supposed to arrive at Christmas as if we were on a roller coaster making a downhill decent, sliding into the 25th of December with a screeching halt. Instead, we need to purposefully decide to create times in our day to pause and reflect and meditate.

Some things to reflect on...

- Have you actually received the gift of Jesus that God has given you? (If you have not... do that now... Ask Jesus to be your Lord and Guide and Peace. Ask Him to forgive you for all the bad or wrong things you've done. Ask Him to help you live His way... getting all your nourishment direction for life from Him. And thank Him for this amazing gift of New LIFE in Him.)
- ♣ If you have received God's gift... are you following Him or making your own way?
- ♣ Are you rooting yourself in the Lord and in the Bible or are you too busy?
- ♣ Is He your source for living or do you look for answers and direction elsewhere?
- ♣ Are you allowing Jesus to influence your heart and mind in all matters of daily life?
- ♣ Are you developing a heart of gratitude?
- ♣ Would others be able to look at your life and say that they see fruit... love, joy, peace, patience....?

Because of Christ living in you... you can bring God's perfect peace wherever you go. Don't let the craziness of the season rob you of your peace. Make it a point to take some time to pause, reflect, meditate, and set your heart roots deep.

His peace will come and fill you and...

Experience God's peace, which is far more wonderful than the human mind can understand. His peace will keep your thoughts and your hearts quiet and at rest as you trust in Christ Jesus.
