2023 Florida Agriculture and Wildlife Expo. Horticulture Show GENERAL RULES for Adults and Youth

- 1. Any citizen of the State of Florida is eligible to exhibit plants in the horticulture show.
- 2. Plants must have been in the possession of and grown by the exhibitor for at least three months prior to the show. (Exception: container grown vegetables.) One variety to a container unless otherwise specified in this schedule (Exceptions: dish gardens and terrariums.)
- 3. A maximum of three plants per category, per entrant will be accepted for judging. Additional plants may be entered for display purposes only. Entries not pre-registered will be accepted on a space-available basis.
- 4. In a given class of plants, exhibitors may enter more than one variety, but not more than one exhibit of the same variety.
- 5. Plants should be show-worthy, well-groomed, (cleaned with water only) free from disease and insect imperfections, and be in clean, uncovered pots or containers.
- 6. All exhibits must be passed by the entry committee. The entry committee is the final authority in disqualifying entries not conforming to the rules.
- 7. Judging will be completed by qualified individuals with extensive horticultural knowledge. Each plant is judged on its own merit. Ribbons in each class will be awarded: blue, red, white, green and best of class, and best of show will be awarded.
- 8. No exhibit or award may be removed before Friday, March 17, 2023 before 4:00 p.m. Plant pick-up will be Saturday, March 18th from noon to 4:00 p.m.
- 9. We will not be accountable for plants left after 4:00p.m., March 18, 2023.
- 10. All care will be taken to safeguard exhibits. All properties should be marked with name of exhibitor. The Florida Agriculture and Wildlife Expo. will not assume liability for damage or loss.
