October 21, 2018 **Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time** Mark 10:35-45

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

"Call your seat, I call shotgun!" When I was a kid, whoever said that, got the best seat. They got the jump on everyone else and sat up in the front car seat beside the driver! The front seat was the favorite one because it had the best view, but way back then, it also meant you controlled the window crank and could roll the window down as wide open as you wanted! Well, James and John are doing that today by calling for the 'glory seats' beside Jesus in His Kingdom. James and John want the pole position, like in Nascar racing, up front alongside Jesus. Another way of thinking about how 'special' their seats are is to imagine them on powerful thrones beside Jesus, much like we see every January in the US State of the Union address. The president stands at the podium and over his right shoulder sits the Vice President, and over his left shoulder sits the Speaker of the House. Or consider that James & John are looking for popular attention, like in parades when people get lucky to ride alongside the Parade Grand Marshal in his/her special car drawing all the focus from the crowds. That acclaim and prestige is what James and John are after, but before we give them too hard a time for being 'fame-greedy', listen to verse 41 "When the other ten apostles heard this, they became indignant at James and John." The other ten apostles are mad because James and John beat them to the punch, cutting in line ahead of them to seize the desired power seats. They are ALL power-hungry! After this, Jesus may want to call these fought-over seats, 'high chairs', because of how 'childish' the apostles are acting. So, verse 42 says "Jesus summoned them all, and said to them...." This is Jesus taking a 'teaching moment' to expose their corrupt 'power grabbing' and misunderstanding of his mission. For Jesus, authority is service to all, and power is shared with everyone. Christians, who lead with a title or position, should not rub the noses of those working below them in their rankauthority. Jesus says, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord their authority over them, But it shall not be so among you." (Mark 10:42-43). Jesus leads by service. Jesus starts his confrontation of James and John's misunderstanding of Christian power, by telling them "You do not know what you are asking" (Mark 10:38) He is saying, "Do you know how far in over your head, you are getting." In fact, James and John may receive seats beside Jesus but they are not the 'comfort seats'. Picture the two crosses on either side of Jesus on Calvary. Crosses are what Jesus has in mind for those who are strong enough to serve alongside Him. Jesus tells all of us, 'If anyone wants to come after Me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me' (Mark 8:34). So, to claim a place beside Jesus doesn't mean a pampering seat for oneself, but a 'standing service' for other people.

To see the apostles wanting to 'boss' their authority over others and feel glee over controlling other people, this should humble all of us. If those closest to Jesus in the Bible fall into sins by abusing power, then all followers of Jesus need to beware of 'tendencies' to manipulate others. Do we still find such sinful ambition in Jesus' disciples? Can a Christian disciple abuse power? For sure! Maybe it is not surprising to quote here the famous principle of inevitable corruption that Lord Acton wrote in 1887, that 'Power tends to corrupt, and absolute power corrupts absolutely.' But a historical note that may surprise us is that he wrote this in a letter rebuking an Archbishop named Mandell Creighton. We all stand under judgment! (2 Corinthians 5:10) Not all that long ago, at a press conference of a just-appointed young Bishop, he was asked about his ceremonial coat-of-arms and motto. He said he was so surprised at the call, he hadn't had time enough to select one. Then he was asked why not and if it was true that some men pick their motto in seminary, and he said 'Yes, but I am still settling into this surprise'. There it is: Temptation to power! Climbers even in the seminary! Jesus Himself faced that temptation in the desert (Matthew 4:8-9). But Jesus is clear, that there is to be none of that in His Kingdom (Mk 10:43).
