A Checklist for Catholic Dads

The stakes are high, and this generation of children desperately needs fathers to step up to their responsibilities. Look back on your own upbringing. What role did your father play? Were there other role models? Just as many of us live out the lessons we learned in our youth, our children will someday emulate us. They are always watching, and we have to decide if we will be their heroic role models who consistently set the right example or relinquish our fatherly responsibilities to a host of bad societal influences. Which will it be?

Surrender. We have to surrender on an ongoing basis to Christ for his will to be done in our lives. Guys, we are not in charge ... as much as we want to be! St. Ignatius of Loyola once said: "Few souls understand what God would accomplish in them if they were to abandon themselves unreservedly to him and if they were to allow his grace to mold them accordingly."

Understand Our True Vocation. For those of us blessed to be married and have children, we must recognize that helping our families get to heaven and being good husbands and fathers — not our business careers — is our real vocation.

Invest Time. Our children need our time. Put down the smartphone; turn off the TV; cancel the golf outing. Let's spend more time with our kids! There are countless bad influences ready to take his place and guide his children in the wrong direction

Be Courageous. Christians are meant to stand out, not blend in. Blending in speaks to conforming so that our faith becomes part of the mainstream ... and we need to fight the culture. These are difficult times, and we have a responsibility to love and defend Christ, be great role models for our families and stand up for our faith.

Love Our Wives. Husbands, we must love and cherish our wives, plain and simple. Our children will learn to love others by how they see Mom and Dad love each other. Let's show our wives respect and cherish the critical role they play in our families. Today's kids face significant challenges — and, without a doubt, strong fathers are part of the solution.

Let's take a few minutes to reflect on how we are doing as fathers and a husbands. Take the results of this reflection to prayer and reconciliation. Most importantly, commit to make the necessary changes. Let's look to the inspiring example of St. Joseph, patron saint of fathers, workers and the universal Church, for his obedience, humility, selflessness, courage and the love he showed to Mary and Jesus. If we can emulate St. Joseph even a little each day, we will be that much closer to becoming the men and fathers we are called to be.

What does the Catechism say about...

What is required when one of the spouses is not a Catholic?

A *mixed* marriage (between a Catholic and a baptized non-Catholic) needs for liceity the permission of ecclesiastical authority. In a case of *disparity of cult* (between a Catholic and a non-baptized person) a dispensation is required for validity. In both cases, it is essential that the spouses do not exclude the acceptance of the essential ends and properties of marriage. It is also necessary for the Catholic party to accept the obligation, of which the non-Catholic party has been advised, to persevere in the faith and to assure the baptism and Catholic education of their children.

Baptism

Baptisms scheduled after following completed. (1) Registered & active parishioners for at least 3 months. (2) Attend Sunday Mass and live exemplary Christian lives as a model for the child to be baptized. (3) Parents attend a Baptism Preparation Seminar, held last Wednesday of month, call parish to schedule. (4) Sponsors need to attend a Baptism class and have a letter from their parish stating they are active members, attended a Baptism class and qualified to be godparents. **Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation need to be at least 16 years old, have received the sacraments of Baptism/Confirmation/First Communion, and if married in a Catholic marriage.** If you do not register in a parish and contribute regularly (no matter how small), they will not have a record of your attendance & cannot provide a letter. This is your responsibility.
