
A Prayer for Reformation Sunday 2018





Romans: The Bookends



- 1:5 = through whom [Christ] we [Paul and colleagues] have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name.
- 16:25-27 = ²⁵Now to God who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages ²⁶but is now disclosed, and through the prophetic writings is made known to all the Gentiles, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith— ²⁷to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever! Amen.

Romans: The Theme



¹⁶ For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. ¹⁷ For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous will live by faith."

OR (v. 17)

If For in it [the gospel] the saving justice of God is revealed from Christ's faithfulness for the purpose of generating faithfulness in us; as it is written, "The one who is made righteous by means of God's saving justice will live."

Romans 1: The Human Condition (1)



¹⁸For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and wickedness [or impiety and injustice] of those who by their wickedness suppress the truth. ¹⁹For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. ²⁰Ever since the creation of the world his eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things he has made. So they are without excuse; ²¹for though they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their senseless minds were darkened. ²²Claiming to be wise, they became fools; ²³and they exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling a mortal human being or birds or four-footed animals or reptiles. ²⁴Therefore God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, to the degrading of their bodies among themselves, ²⁵because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever! Amen.

Romans 1: The Human Condition (2)



- ²⁶For this reason <u>God gave them up</u> to degrading passions. Their women exchanged natural intercourse for unnatural, ²⁷and in the same way also the men, giving up natural intercourse with women, were consumed with passion for one another. Men committed shameless acts with men and received in their own persons the due penalty for their error. ²⁸And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, <u>God gave them up</u> to a debased mind and to things that should not be done. ²⁹They were filled with every kind of wickedness [injustice], evil, covetousness, malice. Full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, craftiness, they are gossips, ³⁰slanderers, God-haters, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, rebellious toward parents, ³¹foolish, faithless, heartless, ruthless. ³²They know God's decree, that those who practice such things deserve to die—yet they not only do them but even applaud others who practice them.
 - IN A WORD: IMMORALITY/INJUSTICE

Romans 3: The Human Condtion (3)

- 9... for we have already charged that all, both Jews and Greeks, are under the power of Sin, ¹⁰as it is written:
- "There is no one who is righteous, not even one;
- ¹¹there is no one who has understanding, there is no one who seeks God.
- ¹²All have turned aside, together they have become worthless; there is no one who shows kindness, there is not even one."
- ¹³"Their throats are opened graves; they use their tongues to deceive." "The venom of vipers is under their lips."
- ¹⁴ Their mouths are full of cursing and bitterness."
- ¹⁵"Their feet are swift to shed blood;
- ¹⁶ruin and misery are in their paths,
- ¹⁷and the way of peace they have not known."
- 18"There is no fear of God before their eyes."

Romans 3: God's Solution, Our Response





²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness [saving justice] of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness [saving justice] of God through faith in Jesus Christ [through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ] for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of [lack] the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified [made right] by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies [makes right] the one who has faith in Jesus [shares in the faith of Jesus].

Romans 5: God's Solution, Our Benefits



¹Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.
⁶For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. ⁸But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. ⁹Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. ¹⁰For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. ¹¹But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.





- John Barclay: Grace (*charis* = gift) according to Paul is unconditioned but not unconditional.
- Dietrich Bonhoeffer: Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession.... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.

Further Highlights from Romans (1)



^a ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.... ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus. (6:3-4, 11)

¹There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ²For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. ³For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. (8:1-4)

Further Highlights from Romans (2)



²⁸We know that all things work together for good for those who love God [God works all things together toward the ultimate good], who are called according to his purpose....³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." ³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (8:28-38)

Further Highlights from Romans (3)



¹I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying; my conscience confirms it by the Holy Spirit—²I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. ³For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kindred according to the flesh. ⁴They are Israelites, and to them belong the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; ⁵to them belong the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, comes the Messiah, who is over all, God blessed forever. Amen. (9:1-5)

¹²For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. ¹³For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." (10:12)

Further Highlights from Romans (4)



¹I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin....²⁵So that you may not claim to be wiser than you are, [my Gentile] brothers and sisters, I want you to understand this mystery: a hardening has come upon part of Israel, until the full number of the Gentiles has come in. ²⁶And so all Israel will be saved....³³O the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! (11:1, 25-26, 33)


Further Highlights from Romans (5)



¹I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual [appropriate] worship. ²Do not be conformed to this world [age], but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. (12:1-2)

¹⁵Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁴Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶Live in harmony with one another....¹⁷Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. ¹⁸If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably [practice *shalom*] with all. (12:15-18)

A Few Highlights from Ephesians (1)



- Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places (1:3)
- ⁹[God] has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ¹⁰as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. (1:9-10)
- ⁴But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us ⁵even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—.... ⁸For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— ⁹not the result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life. (2:4, 8-9)

A Few Highlights from Ephesians (2)



- ¹³But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. (2:13-14)
- ⁴There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, ⁵one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. (4:4-6)
- ³¹Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, ³²and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. 5 ¹Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, ²and live [walk] in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. (4:31-5:1)

A Challenging Text from Ephesians 5 (a)



²²Wives, be subject to your husbands as you are to the Lord. ²³For the husband is the head of the wife just as Christ is the head of the church, the body of which he is the Savior. ²⁴Just as the church is subject to Christ, so also wives ought to be, in everything, to their husbands. ²⁵Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, ²⁶in order to make her holy by cleansing her with the washing of water by the word, ²⁷so as to present the church to himself in splendor, without a spot or wrinkle or anything of the kind—yes, so that she may be holy and without blemish. ²⁸In the same way, husbands should love their wives as they do their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹For no one ever hates his own body, but he nourishes and tenderly cares for it, just as Christ does for the church, ³⁰because we are members of his body. ³¹"For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one flesh."

A Challenging Text from Ephesians 5 (b)— MJG Revision of NRSV



- ¹⁸... [B]e filled with the Spirit [and here are some specifics],
 - ¹⁹singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves,
 - singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts,
 - ²⁰giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.
 - ²¹being subject to one another out of reverence for Christ,
 - ²²Wives, be subject to your husbands as to the Lord....
 - Husbands: note repetition of "Christlike sacrificial love" and see also 5:1.
