"The Log in Our Own Eye"

"Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' and behold, the log is in your own eye?" Matthew 7:4

Christians have rightly been upset by the Supreme Court's legalization of gay marriage. When a society abandons God's design for human relationships, there are bound to be negative consequences for society. It is especially galling to American Christians that the high court makes up rights like this when there is nothing in the US Constitution that addresses marriage rights and the Supreme Court takes upon itself the power to determine the nature of marriage. The Tenth Amendment to the Constitution specifically says that "the powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people."

But the threat to "traditional marriage" did not begin with the issue of same sex marriage. It perhaps can be traced back to the issue of no-fault divorce. In 1970 then California Governor Ronald Reagan signed into law the first state no-fault divorce law. Other states quickly followed. Spouses no longer had to prove infidelity or abuse to get a divorce. Marriage was no longer regarded as a divine union of one man and one woman for life intended by God to produce the next generation of human beings. Instead marriage became a means for providing personal happiness and/or sexual fulfillment.

Unfortunately, the evangelical church has been largely silent on the issue. The Moral Majority, during its existence, addressed many important issues: abortion, school prayer, pornography, sex education in schools, etc. It would seem that the issue of divorce would also relate to family values. But that was not on the group's agenda. There was practically no backlash to the no-fault divorce issue from the Christian church.

Southern Baptist Seminary President Al Mohler says that "evangelicals allowed culture to trump Scripture. The church largely followed the lead of its members and accepted what might be called the 'privatization' of divorce. Churches simply allowed a

secular culture to determine that divorce is no big deal, and that it is a purely private matter."

Part of the problem in speaking out about the issue has probably been the fact that divorce has become so pervasive in our own churches. Divorce is not an unpardonable sin, and the divorced among us need compassion and love. But we need to fight to preserve marriages and to work against divorce as an easy option for Christian couples who struggle in their marriages. Marriage vows mean something to God. We Christians should do all that we can to help married people follow through on those vows.

As John Stonestreet says, "The church needs to be ready in this brave new culture to offer hope, repentance, and reconciliation. And admitting where we went wrong in the past is a good first step." (Breakpoint, 7/28/2014)



They in turn passed the proposed changes along to the Christian lawyers at ADF, who made a few suggestions for minor revisions. The results of all of this work will be submitted to the church congregation at a business meeting after Sunday school on Sept 30. On the Sunday before, Sept. 23, there will be an information meeting during the church Sunday school hour. The current bylaws, as well as the proposed by-laws, will be available for review in the church foyer. You are welcome to take a copy of each. 
