Watch Out For the "Dirty Devil and His Devious D's"

Of one thing you can be assured and that's "The devil is out to get you!" I Peter 5:8 warns us, "Be sober, be vigilant, because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour."

The other night when I couldn't sleep and I was mulling many things over in my mind, I began to ponder the devious devices and tactics of the devil and I was amazed at how many of them start with the letter 'D'. It seems his best and most successfully used tools against us are: doubts, dread, disappointment, discouragement, deceit, disease, despair, distress, disaster, divorce, disgrace and death. That's his "dirty dozen" and there are more. He takes the attributes of Christianity of which are belief, trust, loyalty, and honesty and adds his "devious D's" to them and steals them for his tools against us. How many have fallen through disbelief, distrust, disloyalty, dishonesty and even disagreements and disenchantments. Look them over. Has he ever used them against you? Everyday he uses them over and over to destroy all he can. His delusions are many and varied and he uses them time and time again.

Those that participate in any kind of sport contest will tell you that to underestimate your opponent can easily be your greatest weakness even while you feel very strong. Don't be fooled. The devil is smart and very powerful and we cannot fight him in our own strength. "We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." We are admonished in Ephesians to be "strong in the Lord and the power of His might." Praise God there's one big 'D' that God grants us that spells defeat for the devil. And that is deliverance through Jesus Christ alone. Satan was defeated at Calvary. He cannot conquer the shed blood of our Saviour. At the name of Jesus the devil has to flee. "Resist the devil and he shall flee from you." He has our defeat and destruction as his goal, but his ultimate defeat and destruction are inevitable in the lake of fire God has prepared for the devil and his followers. Praise God!

The devil also likes to make things seem so dark and foreboding. He likes to keep us in darkness so the light of God can't shine through to us. But the darker the night the brighter the light will shine. And there is no darkness that the 'Light of the World,' Jesus Christ, can't penetrate.

When all else fails for the enemy of our souls then he drags out his tool of "last resort"-delay. If he can't get at you through all the others he'll approach you through yet another angle. He'll say, it's alright to follow the Lord and obey His commandments, but what's the hurry? Why do it now? Let's put it off till a more convenient time. There's too many things pressing for your attention now. Tomorrow will be better. Just delay a little longer. But he doesn't tell you that every day that you delay makes it harder to obey. He doesn't tell you that tomorrow may well be too late, for today is all that we're promised.

We don't know what the year 1978 holds for any of us. But we can be assured that our strong defense is Jesus. The Dirty Devil and his Devious 'D's' have all been defeated if we submit ourselves to God. Be aware of the devil's cunning devices; make them of no effect through the deliverance purchased for us at Calvary. Remember if the devil is after you he hasn't got you yet.

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
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HOW TO MAKE A CHURCH PROSPER

There is a sure way of prosperity. It has never failed and never can. The following rules observed by all the members of any Church will insure good days. If the Church is decaying, the decay will soon be arrested. If it is standing still, it will soon begin to grow. If it is already flourishing, it will grow still more rapidly.

- 1. Attend all services regularly. If possible, be in time; you need at least five minutes after coming in to get a seat, and to compose body and mind for the service.
- 2. Never miss a service needlessly. If you have visitors, invite them to go with you; they will respect you more as a Christian if you are faithful to your duty.
- 3. If it rains or snows, or is foggy, make a special effort to go. Our Churches stand much in need of storm-proof religion.
 - 4. Take part in the service. You go to worship, not to be entertained.
- 5. Be devout in your attitude; all talking and even whispering should be studiously avoided. Find the hymn and sing if you can; and share the book with your neighbour.
- 6. Speak to strangers and invite them to come again. A hearty hand-shake will add much weight to the invitation.
- 7. Be friendly to all. Remember, hand-shaking has not gone out of fashion. A hearty Christian greeting means much by way of cheer, comfort, and encouragement.
- 8. Accept gladly any work assigned you. If pastor, or someone else, is struggling under a load, take hold and help. At least, do not increase the burden.
- 9. Never encourage strife, but be a peace-maker. Peace-makers, you know, are called "the children of God."
- 10. Avoid gossip as you would an enemy; it is one of Satan's best agents for starting Church troubles.
- 11. Give cheerfully, according to your ability. The Lord has dealt bountifully with you, hence you should be liberal with His cause.
- 12. Think of the services through the week, speak of them to others, and pray that they may be attended with divine blessing.
 - 13. Pray for the sick and the poor. Help the Lord to answer your prayers.
- 14. Pray for the pastor. His usefulness will be greatly increased by the daily prayers of all the people.
 - 15. Pray for some unsaved soul daily.
 - 16. Pray, pray, pray! Keep on praying. No Christian should be behind in his prayer accounts.
- 17. It is a great deal braver to try to do something to better the condition of things than to stand and criticise. If you mean to help along, don't get in front and block the way. Get behind and push. You will then see how little you feel like finding fault with the burden-bearers after you have shouldered your part of the load.—(Galatians 6:2.)

It was a thrill to see them moving on in the Lord and grasping hold of truths. Changes were made in lives; attitudes, feelings made right, confessions given! It was all very glorious! It would be easy to list each person and tell what God did for them individually; however, all these young people left Convocation to enter ministries of their own and we that were here know that God is going to use them and their lives are going to touch and reach out to every church who welcomes them; then you, too, will witness the changes and sense the power of God in their lives.

If you weren't at Convocation, we missed you, and you missed something wonderful, but most of all we pray that in every city, in every church, in every pastor and minister, in every home, this same renewing of Spirit, Soul, and Body which we felt in Taneyville during Convocation will be spread and continue to be felt in our lives "till Jesus Comes".

Dear Bible School Friends:

1978 has begun and with it comes the Christian's responsibilities to carry the gospel to all creatures. That doesn't mean just ministers . . . but each Christian is called to live for God in such a manner that his life reflects Christ's teachings. Christ said that if we lift Him up, He will draw men unto Himself. Therefore, each Christian is commanded by God to be a soul winner. Let that be our New Year's Resolution.

The blessings of God were great during the past year. Yet, we must not be satisfied with past attainments, but

strive to perfect our lives in the Lord daily.

According to the vote of those present and those sending in their wishes, it was decided at the close of Bible school to prepare for a full nine months term of school. Just as in the past the curriculum will be Bible centered. It will give the students a chance to study more indepth courses of the Bible. And that is why we're here, to help people know God's word in all its fullness.

Also, in order to pay the loan payment on the Parham Book printing, \$725 was taken from the Bible School general fund which has depleted it completely.

The three Parham books are now available. ("Selected Sermons" is now in print and will be available later). "The Everlasting Gospel" and "A Voice Crying in the Wilderness" are \$2.00 each. "The Life of Charles Parham" is \$7.00. Please add .50 for postage and handling. The Board of Trustees borrowed the money for this printing which will have to be repaid each 6 months in the amount of \$1125... beginning January 12. So, we encourage you to make it known among your friends about these books so enough will be sold to retire the loan. Consider giving them as gifts to those interested.

We hope to see each of you somewhere along the line during our spring tour. Travelling with us this year are April Wolf, Guymon, Oklahoma; Karen Oyler, Stockton, California; Tammy Oakes, Joplin, Missouri; Savoy Grimmer, Perryton, Texas; and Fred Arnall, Granby, Missouri.

Now may we ask you again that you keep us in your daily prayers because without God's direction and blessings, all will be in vain. We're only human but God gives the wisdom when we call on Him. The wonderful term He gave us last year in history. Now we're asking Him for a Repeat Performance and that is NOT impossible for with God . . . All Things ARE Possible.



Sing Us One Of The Songs Of Zion

A few weeks ago I and several others of my family were entered into a discussion of some of the conditions that we now contend with as we work for the Lord. The question was asked, "Why don't the people in charge of church services have more choir singing, more special songs, and more testimony services like we used to have?" I suppose this question has been asked recently as much if not more than any other. Some laymen say it is the fault of the ministry. Some ministers will say it is the fault of the laymen who are unwilling to participate in the services as they once did. Others may excuse this condition with, "it is the sign of the times." Whatever the reason or excuse, I have become more concerned with the great need that rests upon all of God's people to renew their consecration and faith with a determination to give our very best in the service and worship of our Lord and Savior.

The Psalmist writes of a condition that came among the Israelites. "By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept when we remembered Zion. We hanged our harps upon the willows in the midst thereof. How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?" Psalms 137:1,2,4 God's people came to a time of saying, "What's the need of being excited about what God has done for us and what He will do for us?" They were sitting down crying because things had become different than they used to be. Their harps were hanging on the willows and they were saying "we can't go on rejoicing in the work of the Lord because times have changed. It is not the same as it used to be." Their only other thought was how happy they would be when God would bring a terrible judgment upon the people of Babylon. Psalms 137:8-9. As a matter of fact it seems they couldn't hear the cry of the Babylonians, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!" Psalms 137:3. Lamentations of Jeremiah 5:14-16 records that the "elders have ceased from the gate, the young men from their music. The joy of our heart is ceased; our dance is turned into mourning. The crown is fallen from our head." This entire chapter seems to be a pitiful complaint of the conditions of Zion. Joel 1:8-12 calls for a time of lamenting because the conditions all around seemed to be bleak and desolate. Even the joy had withered away from their hearts. As I have read these words over again, it seemed I was reading what we are hearing from those who have taken the name of the Lord. The conditions and problems of this old world are so disheartening that there seems to be no room for joy in the hearts of men. Those who possess the harps seem to be sitting down and weeping, "How can we take our harps off the willows and sing the songs of Zion when things are not like they used to be and nobody cares anyway? All the

while a sin laden world is crying out, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion."

Of course, we may sometimes attempt to "comfort" ourselves with the thought that "the day of the Lord will not come except there come a falling away first." Yet, that kind of consoling will simply bring us to becoming a part of the falling away.

As a minister, I can recall incidents when members of the congregation absolutely refused to take part in the service when called upon. To wit, a church board member who would not lead a testimony service. However, we must also remember the times that ministers have been called upon and they also refused to do their part to declare God's word and promote an atmosphere of worship unto the Lord. With this in mind, it seems that the Lord's church is suffering defeat. As one man put it, "The way things are going now, it looks like heaven may be for rent." Oh that God would prompt us again to look into His word and His will to see what He has determined to do.

Paul writes to the Ephesians (5:25-27) that "Christ loved the church and gave Himself for it; that He might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, that He might present it to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle, or any such thing: but that it should be holy and without blemish." Hallelujah! The church of the living God is not defeated! It is not becoming less spiritual! It is not falling away! But the true church is alive and glorious and filled with the Spirit of Christ. God's people are unspotted from the world. James 1:27 We may hear it said that the church just isn't doing what it should be doing, but Daniel 11:32 records that people that surely know their God are "strong and doing exploits." Praise God's holy name! I pray that we will retain a vision of Christ's church as He described it. For He said, "The gates of hell shall not prevail against it." Matthew 16:18 Christ's admonition to us is to take the keys of the kingdom that will set the captive free and bind the forces of sin and satan, that we may be more than conquerers through Him that loved us. I am so glad in my heart today to know that defeat will not come to the church. Surely, some who have known the Lord will turn back, but God's people are going to finish this age in power and victory. The message rings out again and again that God through the Spirit will manifest Himself to give good and perfect gifts to them that love His appearing. The Psalmist again declares that the church "shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper." Psalms 1:3 The prosperity of the church is certain. Even though men may not testify as they once did, or sing as they once did, and even though we may hear it said that "things are not like they used to be", we can be sure that God's people will be triumphant. The song writer's words ring out:

This old ship's been through some battles before,
Storms and tempests and rocks on the shore,
Though the hull may be battered, inside it's safe and dry,
It will carry its cargo to the port in the sky.
Let the church be the church, let the people rejoice,
For we've settled the question and we've made our choice;
Let the anthem ring out, songs of victory swell,
For the church triumphant is alive and well!

EVANGELISTS — DO WE REALLY NEED THEM?

"And He gave some apostles; and some prophets; and some evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers."

(Ephesians 4:11)

Christ gave evangelists! He gave them to the whole body of Christ, the Church. Evangelists are exactly as much in the plan of God as are apostles, prophets, pastors, and teachers. It is my firm belief that the Church can never do without evangelists. Evangelists are intended to edify and build up the body of Christ, to prepare the saints for service.

There are those voices being heard today which are saying that "times have changed". "People are different." "The Church must up-date." "Revivals are no longer effective." "The role of the evangelist is fading."

Those who may possess such opinions, (and I don't believe there are many) should possibly answer some pertinent questions. Such as:

Is there still a need for conversion?

Do churches still need spiritual refreshing?

Does God still call men to "evangelize"?

It is regretful that individuals who are imperfect, bring reproach upon a whole class of men and women whom God himself has called, and has given to the Church to help carry out His holy task.

It is true that some preachers fall into gross sins. It is true enough that some preachers are too much concerned about their bank accounts. But on the whole, the average evangelist, who believes the Bible, has been really born again and called of God to preach, is a godly man, unselfish, devoted and sincere.

In my years in the ministry I have had the privilege of knowing a number of evangelists. I have known only a few whom I did not think were sincere and genuine. I have heard them say, "I have a burden to evangelize. God has called me to this particular ministry and I want to fulfill that calling which He has placed upon me." These were men of good report and full of the Holy Ghost.

The true evangelist has a real burden for souls. He is not seeking an "appointment". He is not in competition with the pastor for the spotlight, but is a loyal team member with the pastor. Both are on the side of righteousness fighting against Satan. Both should be working together to build up the Kingdom of God. One is not, in any way, threatened by the other for they are brethren.

How we still need, and will always need, a fresh crop of old-time Bible preaching, Spirit-filled, soulwinning evangelists! Consider Paul, the evangelist. With a powerful anointing of the Holy Spirit upon him, he went out to ransack Asia minor, mauling its markets, stirring its synagogues, penetrating its palaces. Out he went with the war cry of the Gospel in his heart and on his lips. Paul was not merely a city-wide preacher, but a city-wide shaker. He stood before Agrippa, with an awareness that the pallbearers were not far away, and "turns on the heat" until the immoral King stammers, "Thou almost persuadest me to be a Christian."

The pastor has a varied ministry. He ministers by counseling, visiting the sick, etc., but the evangelist realizes he must win souls or his ministry is a failure. He must have a "hot heart" burning with a passion for souls.

The real evangelist stands with a host of great and mighty warriors of the faith.

There is no doubt about it. The Bible declares it. The need is evident. The evangelist remains a vitally needed part of the Church of God in our time.

The Family of God



Often, we sing that familiar song, "The Family of God" without really stopping to realize what the Family of God actually is. When a person mentions the word "church" to you, do you instantly receive a mental picture of a building with red brick walls and a sparkling, white steeple? Just who is the Family of God? This paper, hopefully, will serve two purposes: (1) To give you a strong, scriptural outline concerning the Family of God, the Church of Jesus Christ and the Body of Christ; and (2) to clearly define the above mentioned to your satisfaction.

THE BASIS FOR THE CHURCH

Ephesians 5:25, "Even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;" This is the stepping stone, the building block and main foundation for the establishment of the Church of Jesus Christ. Jesus loved mankind so much that he gave his own life for it on Calvary.

THE CHURCH DEFINED

Acts 2:47b, "And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved." This wonderful verse does two things: (1) it tells us how a person can gain entrance into the Church—through salvation by Jesus Christ; and (2) defines those that comprise the Church—people that have accepted HIM as their Lord and Savior. If, then, you are a Christian (if you have accepted the forgiveness of sins brought about only by the shedding of Christ's blood) you are also a member of the company we call "the Church".

Entrance into the Church of Jesus Christ is gained by SALVATION and by no other means. Entrance is not gained by being voted-in, walking to the front of the sanctuary, shaking hands with the pastor and the elders and then writing your name in the church roll book. Church membership is not gained by denominational means. It should be pointed out, however, that there is absolutely nothing wrong about this type of action. But, to say that this ensures you membership in God's Eternal Family would certainly be erroneous. LET US NOT BE SO CONCERNED ABOUT HAVING OUR NAMES WRITTEN IN OUR PARTICU-

CHURCH BOOK, BUT LET US MAKE SURE THAT OUR NAMES ARE ASSUREDLY INSCRIBED WITHIN THE PAGES OF THE LAMB'S BOOK OF LIFE.

THE CHURCH REQUIRES FEEDING

Acts 20:28, "Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood." For anybody, whether natural bodies or a structural-type body, nourishment needs to take place in order for it to survive and prosper. The elders of the Church were instructed to feed spiritual food unto the whole Church. This also included themselves. We require spiritual food in order to grow in the spiritual realm.

THE WORD OF GOD IS IMPORTANT TO GROWTH

Acts 6:7, "And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied in Jerusalem." Though not thoroughly conclusive, it can be safely assumed that the membership and effectiveness of the Church will grow in proportion to the amount of the word of God that is going forth. This only makes sense. This should be coupled with persistent, intercessional prayer.

THE PRESENCE OF THE LORD IS IMPERATIVE TO CHURCH INCREASE

Acts 11:21, "And the hand of the Lord was with them; and a great number believed, and turned unto the Lord." The Family of God can never be increased nor genuinely generated by any other means other than the prevailing hand of God touching it. Denominations can increase their membership by all sorts of methods, but this in no way ensures that the Church has gained new members as that is only gained through SALVATION BY JESUS CHRIST AND THE ACCEPTANCE THEREOF.

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP IS FOR EVERYBODY

Acts 5:14, "And believers were the more added to the Lord, multitudes both of men and women." Gaining entrance into the Family of God is not limited to just one

sex. Whether you are boy or girl, man or woman, the Savior is patiently waiting for you to accept HIM and enter into His company of believers. There is no limitations with God.

CALVARY SECURES RIGHT OF ENTRANCE

Ephesians 2:16, "And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body BY THE CROSS, having slain the enmity thereby." We are brought into the body of Christ by the redeeming work that was done on the cruel cross of Mount Calvary, Golgotha's Hill.

THE CHURCH BELONGS TO JESUS

I Corinthians 6:13, "The body... is for the Lord; and the Lord for the body." This verse tells us that the Church is Jesus' and we are to work for and to please HIM. And, also, the Lord is for the Church to meet our every need as he has promised.

THE CHURCH IS NOT TO BE DIVIDED

II Corinithians 12:20, Paul warns against "debates, envyings, wraths, strifes, backbitings, whisperings, swellings and tumults" within the Church. The Lord does not want the members of HIS CHURCH to be entangled by warring with one another. The Church should be one as God so designed and planned.

REMEMBER: The "CHURCH" is not necessarily the structure in which Christians meet, but it is the Christians themselves. You and I as Christians (born-again) comprise the Church. When the word "church" is mentioned, one should dwell on a group of people and not a building.

CHRIST IS THE HEAD OF THE CHURCH OR BODY

Ephesians 1:22-23, "And hath put all things under His (Christ's) feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all." ANOTHER NAME FOR THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST IS HIS BODY.

The head is the central part of any body. It is from the head that the remainder of the body receives its directions and thoughts. The head is the main part of the body. Jesus, our Head, gives unto us the direction and thought that we deem necessary for living and prospering as part of His Church. He should always be held in esteem over any and every part of the Body. He is Lord. Jesus should never be allowed to take a back seat to our whims and desires, building programs, attendance drives, parties for church members, sales, fellowships or anything else connected with the modern-day church. Christ is the Head. He should always be the central figure in the life of the Church. Revelation depictus HIM as standing in the middle of the seven golden candlesticks. These candlesticks, as we are later told in the book, are the seven churches. CHRIST SHOULD ALWAYS BE IN THE MIDDLE OF OUR PLANS AND OUR LIFE. Also see Ephesians 4:15 and 5:2. We should always be subject unto Jesus.

Ephesians 5:23, "For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church; and he is the saviour of the body." The Bible compares our relationship to the Head of the Body, Jesus, as much as the same as the standards it sets forth concerning a wife's duties and relationship to her husband. In fact, later on in the text of the Word of God, the Church, or the Body, is referred to as the Bride.

CHRIST IS TO BE PREEMINENT IN THE CHURCH

Colossians 1:18, "And he is the head of the church; who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence." Because of his exalted position in the Body, we should always bestow upon Jesus the highest place of glory and honour. If we are faithful to perform this in our own lives, then the probability is that it will be found this way in our mode of worship and church services.

THE CHURCH OR BODY IS HELD TOGETHER BY JESUS

Colossians 2:19, "... The head, from which all the body by joints and bands having nourishment ministered, and knit together, increaseth with the increase of God." It is only through our highly exalted HEAD (JESUS) that the whole Church is held together, knit together as ONE, and fed both spiritually, physically and mentally. All things come from the Head to the Body.

CHURCH COMPARED UNTO THE HUMAN BODY

Please read Romans 12:4-8.

-There are members of the human body and Christ's Body, the Church.

-All members of both these types of bodies do not do the same jobs.

—We (anyone that is a born-again Christian) are all one Body in Christ.

THIS REALLY DOES AWAY WITH DIVIDED, DENOM-NATIONAL-TYPE ORIENTED THINKING, DOESN'T 1T?

—We are members of each other. No one person can be said to be self-contained or doesn't need the fellowship of other earnest Christians of the Body. This gives us the unity that we experience in Christ.

—We all have different jobs, gifts, talents and duties to perform for the furthering of the work of the Body of Christ.

THERE ARE MANY, MANY, MANY MEMBERS THAT MAKE UP THE WHOLE BODY OF CHRIST, AND THEY ARE FOUND IN VARIOUS LANDS, NATIONS, TONGUES, COLORS OF SKIN, AND DIFFERENT CHURCHES. WE ALL HAVE ONE THING IN COMMON THOUGH, WE ARE ALL FOUNDED UPON OUR "HEAD"—JESUS CHRIST. Also read the remainder of this chapter (Romans 12:9-21) for additional duties and standards of living for the Body Members.

SALVATION IS ENTRANCE INTO THE FAMILY OF GOD

John 1:12, "But as many as received him (Jesus), to them gave he power to become the sons of God." You and I are granted a power to become literal sons (and daughters) of the Living God. When God becomes our Father as we accept his Son, we become a "child of God".

Romans 8:15, "But ye have received the Spirit of Adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father." Spiritual adoption is ours as we receive his Son. The Lord adopts us and this gives us right to call him our Father. Instantly, we are transformed from children of the Devil (I John 3:10) unto the Children of God. From Death unto Life, from darkness unto Light. Transferred to the very Family of God.

BROTHERS AND SISTERS

I Corinthians 6:18, "And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty."

Galatians 4:5-6, "And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father. Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ."

By Christ we can no longer claim to be only a servant but we are made as a son and daughter and an heir to the throne of the Almighty God the Father. Oh, the Family of God. We all are part of this great eternal family. That is why we can rightly call one another, "Brothers and Sisters." We become brothers and sisters through Jesus who first loved us and gave Himself for us.

CHRIST OUR ELDER BROTHER

Hebrews 211, "For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren." Jesus becomes our ELDER BROTHER AS YOU AND I ENTER THE FAMILY OF GOD, THE CHURCH OF JESUS AND CHRIST AND/OR THE BODY OF CHRIST.

OBEDIENCE ENSURES CONTINUED ADOPTION

Matthew 12:50, "For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother."

Luke 8:21, "And he answered and said unto them, My mother and my brethren are these which hear the word of God, and do it." To obey the whole word of God is to remain in fellowship with the Father and to be a part of the Family. Obedience guarantees us the inheritance of Children.

Ephesians 2:19, "Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow-citizens with the saints, and of the househoold of God;" We are made the children of the very HOUSE OF GOD.

FAITHFULNESS IS A KEY ATTRIBUTE OF THE CHURCH OF THE BODY

Matthew 25:1-13, please read this account. We are to be as wise as the five virgins that were faithful unto the coming of the bridegroom, the Lord Jesus.

TO ENTER INTO THIS BODY IS TO ENTER INTO A SPIRITUAL MARRIAGE

II Corinthians 11:2, "For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy; for I have espoused you to ONE HUSBAND, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ." Even as a young, unmarried girl is to keep herself for the man she is about to marry and then remain faithful to the Head of us. Jesus. We would be committing a type of spiritual adultery if we were to renege and sell out to worldliness and self and sin afterwards.

THE CHURCH IS MARRIED TO JESUS

Romans 7:4, "That ye should be married to another, even to him who is raised from the dead, that we should bring forth fruit unto God." To enter into the Body of Christ, or the Church, is to enter into a union with HIM. Being SAVED is applied to being married to Jesus. This union, WHEN KEPT INTACT BY OUR FAITHFULNESS, CANNOT HELP BUT BRING FORTH FRUIT UNTO OUR GOD. That being Love, Joy, Peace, and so on.

WE BECOME PART OF JESUS

I Corinthians 6:15, "Know ye not that your bodies are the members of Christ?"

Ephesians 5:30, "For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones."

The Members of the Church become part of Jesus Christ, a particular member of his Body upon Salvation.

CULTIVATE A RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS CHRIST

Deuteronomy 14:2, "For thou art an holy people unto the Lord thy God, and the Lord Hath chosen thee to be a peculiar people unto himself, above all the nations that are upon the earth." When two people are married, they soon cultivate a relationship where they learn about each other and depend and trust each other. This should also be the case after we become part of Jesus Christ. We should desire to get to know him better, learn to lean upon him as our SOURCE.

CHRIST'S BODY ACCORDING TO I CORINTHIANS, 12 Please read I Corinthians 12:12-31

- -The Body is one.
- -Many members make up that ONE BODY.
- -Members are ONE in Christ.
- -There is ONE SPIRIT.
- -All members of the Body have purpose.
- -God has placed each member in the Body as it has suited Him.
- -The stronger instruments need the supposed weaker ones.
 - -Feeble members are very necessary.
 - -God has tempered the Body together.
- -There is no room for SCHISMS or DIVISIONS with the Body of Christ, the Church.
- -When one member suffers, the rest should be sympathetic.
- —When one is exalted, the other members should also be glad and esalted.

Order of the Members' Duties:

(1) Apostles, (2) Prophets, (3) Teachers, (4) Workers of Miracles, (5) Gifts of healings, (6) Gifts of helps, (7) Governments, (8) Different kinds of tongues.

A WARNING TO THE BODY OF CHRIST

James 3:6, "And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell."

This passage of scripture is referring to, I believe, our natural bodies. But, when applied to the whole body of Christ, it has tremendous depth and meaning. If we allow our tongues to run rampant amont the other members, they (our tongues) will have a disastrous affect. There is nothing worse than an entity that is warring against itself and divided. From the scriptures we can see that there is not any place for such behavior within the Church of Jesus Christ. Let us guard our tongues well.

THE MAIN TASK OF THE CHURCH

Revelation 22:17, "And the Spirit of the Birde say, Come," It would seem that the main job of the Body of Christ is to invite others to join it and so increase its size and power.

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
