


Sometimes the Bible can be hard to understand. The Old

CHAPTER 1 – A JOURNEY BACK IN TIME!

Our first stop in our time machine takes us back to the Ancient Near East. This is where the first parts of our Bible were written. When we investigate the Ancient Near Eastern world, it helps us better understand the first books of the Bible. Let's look at what's happening in the Ancient Near East when we hop out of our time machine!



Wow! There's not much around here. We have stepped out into a barren wilderness where life is difficult. We don't see much food, water, animals, plants, or trees. There are a lot of hungry people, a lot of diseases, a lot of violence, and a lot of suffering in the world. Let's look at some of the people who lived in the Ancient Near East. Just be careful! You'll see a lot of mean people who are very violent. They mistreat each other, take advantage of each other, and they are always fighting with one another. By the way, when we talk about people being mean, selfish,



and harmful, we are talking about *sin*. Sin is everything people desire, do, and say that is mean, selfish, and harmful to us, others, and God's creation. Sin is doing the opposite of the good and loving things God wants us to do.

Wow! Look over there at that big group of people. They don't have anywhere to live. They are wandering around the Ancient

Near Eastern desert. These people are called Israelites, and they are descendants from a group of people that God had chosen to be His special people and bring His blessings to the whole world. So how did they end up here in the desert wilderness? Great question!

The people of Israel had been in slavery in Egypt for 400 years. But God heard their cry for help, and He delivered them from slavery. God did a great miracle and parted the Red Sea so they could escape the Egyptian army. They are now wandering around the desert, and they are complaining about how bad things are. They are afraid because the other nations around them are mean and violent people. They are upset and asking God why He brought them out here in the desert, and why the world is such a mean and harsh place.

Their questions and complaining are why God gave them the first books of the Bible. In the first books He gave the Israelites, He explained to them how the harsh, cruel world they lived in was broken. It was not the world He originally created or wanted, but it had become corrupted. He gave them a Book of Beginnings, what we call Genesis, and it explained what happened to corrupt the beautiful world He created.



Genesis explained that Yahweh (God) was and is the only true God. He alone created all the world and all the nations. The world they lived in had become harsh and cruel, not because of God, but because people rejected God, lived sinful lives, and sin had corrupted the whole world.

Still to this day, bad and horrible things happen in the world because people choose to live selfishly and reject God. Sin always causes misery and harm and corrupts everything. When we make a bad choice, it hurts us, others, and God's creation.



In the next chapter, we will travel back to when God originally made the world! We will see what the world looked like before sin corrupted it. Later, we will also find out how sin entered the world, and why we all struggle with sin today, just like the Israelites and all other nations did in the Ancient Near East.

CHAPTER 2 – GOD'S SPECIAL GARDEN

The first book of the Bible, Genesis, tells us about the very beginning of God's relationship with man. God gave Genesis to the Israelites, His special people we learned about in chapter 1, and it helped explain everything wrong with the world. So, buckle up and get ready! We are now traveling all the way back to the beginning of God's creation of mankind!

Let's hop out of our Time Machine and look at the world of Genesis 1, before sin corrupted God's creation.



Wow! How awesome is this place? We have traveled back to a special place in the world called Eden, the Garden of God. It is full of plants, animals, fresh water, beautiful skies, gorgeous mountains, and everything you could ever need! Eden is the total opposite of the cruel world the Israelites lived in.

In Genesis 1, God described this amazing place to the Israelites. This is how God wanted the whole world to be. If only they could have seen it!

When we look around God's special garden, everything in it was made by God, and everything was good! The sun, moon, planets, stars, animals, fish, birds, fruit, vegetables, and everything else God made was good!

The Garden of Eden was God's temple, and that means it was

His special home where He would live on the earth. But Eden wasn't complete. It still needed one thing, and that one thing was people. God wanted a family to live in His special Garden with Him, and to help Him take care of the Garden.



Hold on a minute! Look over there behind those bushes! God has put something else in His Garden.

That's Adam and Eve! They're God's special people, His family on the earth. God made them both, and He gave them the gift of life. He has placed Adam and Eve in His special garden, where He lives. He told them they were His family, and they could


work with Him by helping take care of His Garden, His sacred space, which was someday going to spread out and be the whole world.

Yahweh loves Adam and Eve. They are free to spend time with Him every day, and He enjoys spending time



with them. He also gave them a special job. He wants them to have a great big family that will help Him take care of the whole world. That means in the very beginning God wanted everyone in the whole world to be part of His family, to enjoy Him, and help Him enjoy and take care of His beautiful creation. Yahweh is a God who loves life, and He doesn't like death or any of the things associated with death like sickness and disease. So, he has placed a special tree in the Garden. 

God is love. God freely chooses to love you and me. He also wants you and me to freely choose to love Him, and He wants us to love one another. So, God made Adam and Eve with special abilities to think, and learn, and then make their own decisions. This way they could freely choose to love God and others. You see, if you force someone to love you, that's not really love. God knew if He created Adam and Eve and they couldn't make choices, they would just be robots and not real people. Robots can't choose love! Thankfully, God didn't make robots. He gave Adam and Eve a choice. They were free to love Him and live in His Garden, or they could choose to reject Him and live apart from God. Living apart from God would mean living apart from the Tree of Life, and that meant death would be the result of rejecting Him. Rejecting God would be disobeying God, and that's what sin is.



Oh no! Look out! There comes a new creature into the Garden, and this guy is always up to no good! We will meet him in the next chapter. Proceed with caution because he's a sneaky snake. For real!

CHAPTER 3 – A SNEAKY SNAKE!

Woah! Who is this serpent looking creature sneaking into the Garden? And why aren't Adam and Eve afraid of him? Get ready because you're about to meet the most dangerous creature mankind has ever met! He's always up to no good.



You see, God not only had a human family on earth, but He also had a family in heaven. His family in heaven were spiritual beings. He made them so they could help His family on earth. But some of these spiritual beings decided to rebel against God. They wanted

to be their own boss, and they wanted people to worship them instead of God. God had to kick some of them out of heaven because of their sinful rebellion against Him. The spiritual being we see in the Garden with Adam and Eve is the first one God kicked out of heaven. We call him Satan, or the Serpent. He has come into the Garden to trick Adam and Eve, and he wants them to reject God and follow him instead. He wants them to give their loyalty to "Team Satan" so he can take control of them and all the nations. Let's see if we can sneak over and hear what he's telling them!

The Serpent hisses and says, "Don't you want to be your own boss instead of listening to Yahweh? He doesn't want you to eat from the second tree, because He knows it makes you smarter than Him and you'll get to decide for yourself where to live and what to do. You won't really die if you eat it! Trust me, not God! I defied Him and didn't die. Don't let Him boss you around! Doing whatever you want to do makes you so much happier! That's what I do. Come join me."

Oh no! They've listened to Satan! I don't think this is going to work out very good for Adam and Eve. God warned them of the bad things that would happen if they rejected Him and His ways.



Ah oh, I think Adam and Eve know they've messed up. God is coming to spend time with them, and for the first time ever they're hiding from God in the bushes! That is what happens

when we disobey God. It messes up our relationship with Him. Even though they're hiding, God knows what they've done. He knows Satan tricked them into eating from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil. God's heart is broken because they sinned, and He knows what the consequences will be.



Sadly, sin means Adam and Eve must move outside the Garden. After they chose to disobey God, it meant they would continue



to sin and disobey God. Being out of the Garden meant they could no longer eat from the Tree of Life, and someday they would die. Sin always leads to very bad things. Sickness, violence, hatred, hunger, death, and all the bad stuff that happens in the world was caused by sin and that sneaky snake, the Devil. Remember, sin is like pollution. Thankfully, God had a plan to rescue us from sin, Satan, and death! Even though we all sin and disobey God, He loved us so much He planned the greatest rescue mission ever! Let's hop back into our time machine and travel to the time when God's rescue mission entered the world.

CHAPTER 4 – GOD'S RESCUE PLAN



His cousin John the Baptist is preaching about God's Kingdom. John is telling everyone they should turn away from living in sin and get

ready because God's promise to rescue man was coming soon! Everyone who believed John's message was baptized in the Jordan River. Baptism is when you are dipped into water as a way of showing everyone else you've turned away from sin, and that you've turned your life over to following God. People were coming from all around to hear John preach.





One day while John was preaching, he saw Jesus coming. That day, Jesus was baptized by John. Jesus wasn't baptized because He was turning from sin. John called Jesus, "The innocent lamb of God," meaning Jesus was innocent and without any sin at all. Jesus was baptized as a special ceremony to start His rescue mission! Now we are going to buzz around and watch Jesus in ministry. Hold on! Here we go!

Look at that! The world was corrupted by sin and Satan, and that means sometimes people struggle without food. But Jesus took one little boy's lunch and turned it into enough food to feed over 5000 people! It's like all the bad stuff caused by sin in the world goes away when Jesus shows up!

There are a lot of people being tormented and controlled by evil spirits like Satan. But watch Jesus, going from town to town and running off all the demons so people can be free and happy! The devils fear Jesus and must leave people alone when He shows up. Satan is no match for God's Son!



This is amazing. Jesus fixes everything sin messed up in the world. He also defeats the devil and his evil army. And death is overcome by Jesus! His ministry is a ministry of rescuing the world from sin, Satan, and death.

You might be asking, "What happened to Jesus? How long was He living in the world and helping people?" And that brings us to our next stop. It's three years after Jesus was baptized and started helping people. And now things are going to get a little sad again. But don't worry, there will be a happy ending! Do you see those crosses? Those are used for killing people. Satan caused one of Jesus' disciples to turn again Him. Satan also used his evil control over world leaders to make them turn against Jesus too. Sadly, they lied and



falsely accused Jesus, and had Him nailed to a cross. On the cross, Jesus died. It was a very sad day. Because of Satan, and because of sin in the hearts of men, Jesus was crucified.

Remember, when Adam and Eve chose sin and rejected God, they joined "team Satan" and the whole world came under the evil influence of Satan? Satan had used sickness, violence, misery, and death to torment people. He tricked all the nations into following him and kept them from turning back to God. And now he thinks he's defeated Jesus, and defeated God's plan to rescue us. But the story isn't over. Jesus was buried in a tomb after He died on the cross. So, let's jump forward a couple days and check out the tomb. Look at that! The tomb is empty! Do you want to know where Jesus' body is? I'll tell you! Jesus' body is gone, and the tomb is empty because God raised Jesus from the dead!



You see, the cross was part of God's plan all along! The Sneaky Snake, the Devil, used death as his main weapon against man. He tricked Adam and Eve into sinning, and he kept the nations tricked into sinning, all because he hated God and the people God made. Since God loved life, Satan loved death. God is about loving others. Satan is all about hating others. God is good. Satan is bad. So, God turned Satan's own weapon of death against him. The people, influenced by Satan, sinned, and reject Jesus and nailed him to the cross. But remember John called Jesus a lamb? In the Old Testament days when sin polluted God's temple, a lamb was sacrificed and the life in its blood purified sin's pollution from the temple and made it a safe place for man



to be with God again. When Jesus died on the cross, He spilled His blood and gave His life so all the sin that polluted our hearts and lives could be cleansed.
