


June 20<sup>th</sup> officially marks the first day of summer but high temperatures along high humidity are here now.

Though Father's Day was not made a national holiday until 1972, the efforts of one woman in Washington sparked a movement to celebrate dads long before then. Do you know who this was?

The first known Father's Day service occurred in Fairmont, West Virginia, on July 5, 1908, thanks to the efforts of Grace Golden Clayton. The service was to honor all fathers, especially those hundreds who were killed during a devastating mine explosion in Monongah (just a few miles from Fairmont) the previous year. However, the observance did not become an annual event, and it was no promoted – very few outside the local area knew about it.

## **Pantry Items**



We need your help to restock our pantry.

If no family or individual has made a special request; then, at

the end of each month Lula will pull items off the shelves and take them to the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. in Andrews since they have access to the Cherokee County community atlarge and average about 100 clients a week but has seen an increase in need during the COVID-19 pandemic and increase in unemployment. NOTE: Our pantry is small, so we try not to over stock and we give out food only if someone is here when an individual comes to the church.

March 25<sup>th</sup> Lula took all food items to the Cherokee County Food Bank in Andrew's. The bank is opened to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12. They have requested empty egg carts to divide the large donations they receive from other organizations.



#### **REACH, Inc. – Community Project**

The ladies made a commitment to supply the REACH, Inc. of Cherokee County domestic violence shelter with cleaning supplies and laundry detergent. If you have items of clothing, children books, etc. to donate please place them in the bin provided in the pantry area or you can take them to the REACH office located behind the thrift store on HWY 64. We can always use some small tote bags and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. combs, hand sanitizer, toothbrush, travel size toothpaste, deodorant, etc. for their clientele. Recommended size for the tote bags is 9"X9". Put them on the table in the pantry and we will fill them as time permits.

There is also a small <u>donation</u> jar on the table in the back of the <u>church</u> if you would prefer to give money. If you would like to donate on a recurrent basis, please fill out the card on the back table. You can take the card directly by the office or give it to Lula to take for you.

Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes and furniture from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They can always use volunteers to help with some of their community outreach activities and local fundraiser events. Call the office at 828-837-2097 or 828-837-8064 for more information.



Fundraisers are needed to supplement government grants. The next major fundraiser is a "Duck Race" co-sponsored with Mountain True. Ducks are \$10 each. Let Lula know if you want to purchase a duck from her or you can stop by the REACH office located on Hwy 64 across from the bank.

Because of concern for public health safety regarding the spread of COVID-19, the date rescheduled for July 4th at the ball field in Andrews. The Director of the local REACH. Inc. was contacted to let her know that Andrews has rescheduled their 4th of July activities to July 5th so the staff are discussing what to do for their fundraiser. ## **International Year of the Nurse**

This year has been deemed the International Year of the Nurse and Midwife by the World Health Organization.

Especially during this worldwide health crisis, it is important to acknowledge nurses, all healthcare works and support staff as they are on the front line of battle daily to care for those not only stricken with this deadly virus, but also other patients who require care in hospitals, schools, nursing homes, urgent care centers and even in remote triage centers being set up all over this country.

As we continue efforts to maintain some symbolism of normalcy we continue to identify others who are working hard to take care of our loved ones and ourselves, e.g. first responders, grocery store workers, restaurant owners who provide food to those in need, food banks, etc. I am sure you can think of more who need our prayers and thanks.



#### THINGS YOU CAN DO

According to the CDC here is how you can practice infection control to help stop the spread of all viruses and bacteria.

- Regularly wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- If soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer with an alcohol content of 60% or more
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- Stay home when sick
- Cover your sneeze or cough with a tissue or elbow to reduce spread of droplets
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects or surfaces.
