



## VISIONING SUMMIT

What is the future of St. John's UCC? Have you ever thought, "I wish someone would ask me what I think." Now is your chance! During the month of October, we will have a Visioning Summit, which consists of several opportunities to explore and openly discuss the future of St. John's UCC. Getting together as a congregation allows us to actively be the Body of Christ and discern how we can be the hands and feet of Jesus today, a year from now and five years from now.

One may ask, "What is a Visioning Summit?" Visioning is a process whereby an organization defines the future it wants. This is achieved by exploring topics such as looking at the core values of an organization, examining the current mission of an organization and taking a deeper look into the purposes of an organization. Communities and other organizations are increasingly using a visioning process to help guide the future of the organization. The purpose is to build consensus around an organization's future. James J. Mapes says, "A vision is like a lighthouse, which illuminates rather than limits, giving direction rather than destination."

A visioning exercise can bring an organization together as people allowing them to recognize their shared values and purposes. The vision serves to lay out what the organization should look like in both the near and distance future. A visioning summit creates a sense of ownership and gives voice to all members of an organization.


