Judges for the Saturday, Sept. 30 parade were Chris Jensen and Catherine Blades from KCRG "Everyday lowa" morning show and Deda Happel from Koru Berry Farm.

The return of the El Kahir Shriners was gratefully noted by all and yes, they brought the funny, attracting the positive attention of the judges who awarded the Shriners with the prize for "Most Humorous" parade float for their funny cars and costumes. Judge's choice went to Millstream Brewing Co. for their omm-pah, rocking out the hippiedom float.

The Festhalle was packed all afternoon and into the evening on Friday so official ticket sales and beverage sales topped the charts, according to Jamie Scott, Amana Colonies RV Park and Event Center executive director. Scotts coordinates sales and beverages at the Festhalle; a big job.

"Friday did break the records for beer! Biggest one day sales we've ever had in beverage income. . .I never seen anything like that crowd on Friday." she reported.

She gave a shout-out to Becky and Paul Trantor who have signed up volunteers to sell beverages at the Amana Festhalle for over 15 years. They work with over 60 adults who volunteer in exchange for donations to support their causes: Camp Courageous, Miracles in Motion and the Cedar Valley Street Rods.



The Amana Boy Scout leaders and troop members help by emptying trash cans and doing clean up on the fest grounds As has been the case for nearly 50 years, Amana's Oktoberfest is a fundraiser for many local nonprofit groups.

In addition many local merchants volunteer before and after the festival to set up and tear down the event spaces.

Jamie Scott, with co-chairs Elise Heitmann and Lacie Blatter, along with Stacey Colledge, Amana Colonies Convention and Visitors Bureau, all credited the hard work of volunteers who stepped up to bring the festival to the community. In addition to workers in the Festhalle, volunteers help out at the museum, at various events in the villages and during the parade.

Colledge said, "We had an amazing turnout for volunteers to help with the event and we appreciate everyone chipping in!"

Festhalle attendance dipped just a bit on Saturday (compared to previous years) as the temperature climbed above 93 by 3 p.m. on Saturday and the evening lowa Hawkeye kickoff loomed. 
