We will encounter new people, experiences, and challenges, and for me there is not only an undeniable sense of redemption present in our moving forward into a "new" year, but a graceful offering of personal growth and like nature around us, transformation. I totally understand the mixed emotions around summer's end, because our often-severe winter brings with it a degree of darkness and uncertainty. However, I have been told by a reputable source that the buds on the trees set in the fall, so even before winter sets in Creation extends to us the promise of renewal in the spring. Just watch and wait.


