JESUS of NAZARETH, the Son of God, as He stood among the fields of ripening grain, spoke to His disciples, saying, "The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest that He will send forth labourers into His harvest." The same Jesus who was moved with compassion as He beheld the widow following her only son to the grave, and who raised him from the dead, restoring him to his mother, is still moved with compassion for the brokenhearted, and still heals all who come to Him; for He is the same, yesterday, today and forever. A Reed Shaken by the Wind?

Matt. 11:7

A pungent question asked by Jesus and NOW comes to this generation to be answered by all Christians of experience and normal growth. This 6-word phrase administers large doses of strong meat if we have anointed eyes to see the hidden truth and sanctified ears to hear the Wind. It takes many years for some Christians before they are willing to even consider themselves just a "reed," and then, to be further reduced to a state of non resistance to be shaken by the Wind and finally to be submissive to guidance and to cease from planning for self exploitation. If we do arrive at this 'death to self" we find the door of humility opens to us with all of its hidden possibilities where Life, Freedom, Vision and Joy awaits us. To be just a hollow grass—to be shaken until spiritual pride loses its grip on us is preceded by a deep heart preparation by God, who is the sole causative power, not our own holiness or righteousness. Flexible enough to be shaken—and soft enough to be molded in His likeness and image. One lesson that Pentecostal saints must learn is the law of Recurrence and can be likened to the war phrase "soften them up"—it is humbling to the natural mind. When we understand what this law does and how to adjust ourselves to its unhindered operation we are on our way to becoming just a "reed." In simple terms this is God's effectual repeat system in order that we learn our lessons, —not gloss them over, filling our reed with self deception. Life is essentially difficult (Job. 5:7) man is born to trouble as the sparks fly upward—we must face stern realities not of our own choosing, hence, there are painful adjustments to be made and the secret is to learn HOW.

Before I prove the text let us take a short cut to its quickest solution—LET GOD reduce you with all of your worthy potentialities to just a hollow reed, possibly to an elimination from

familiar surroundings to a swampy isolation (reeds grow best in a swamp), then LET HIM shake everything in you that can be shaken by the Wind and we will then face the sterling challenge of Ezek. 37:9—"Prophesy unto the Wind, prophesy son of man and say to the Wind, — THUS SAITH THE LORD GOD . . . O BREATH BREATHE UPON ME THAT I MAY LIVE. IF you are an ALIVE Christian (1 Cor. 15:22) you are bearing the reproach of Christ,—the law of Recurrence is operating in you and thru you. There are different stages of reproach but I am contending for the ignominious opprobrium that goes with those who dare receive the mark which is the seal of the Spirit. To receive this seal the law of recurrence breaks our will until we "go down" and "out" under the humbling process to the flesh which must be experienced in our triune being coming under full control of the Spirit's infusion as in 1 Jno. 4:2, Jesus Christ is come (present tense) in the flesh and followed up with Acts 1:8 "receiving power by the Holy Ghost COMING UPON YOU. Repeated and fresh invasions of Spirit power upon our bodies with rich returns of divine LIFE—greater than healing. Yes, COMING IN THE FLESH, COMING down to our finger tips, COMING until every fibre of our being is under His control. There is no escape from this very supernatural humbling process,—"line upon line, line upon line, precept upon precept, precept upon precent, here a little and there a little (Isa. 28: Why? "that they might GO and FALL BACKWARD and BE BROKEN and SNARED and TAKEN. This 5-fold shaking is a miracle working process of THE WORD OF THE LORD in your innermost being and perfectly accomplishes a surrendered

Yes, this is the humbling way to Knowledge, Rest and Refresh-

ing—yet they would not hear. Whom shall He teach knowledge? and whom shall he make to understand doctrine (notice that this word is singular—Deut. 32:2)? them that are weaned from the milk and drawn from the breasts. From spiritual babyhood to "immediate access to constant flow of the ministration of LIFE. Rev. 4:2.

FOR WITH STAMMERING LIPS AND ANOTHER TONGUE WILL HE SPEAK TO THIS PEOPLE. ISA. 28:11 becomes as it were the "rock of offense"—the stone of stumbling" to those who are ruled by church organization and man appointed dictators instead of being taught and led by the Spirit who executes the will of God in appointing "overseers to feed the church of God." Acts 20:28. Brethren, if you are in a church fence where the pasture has become dry stubble the Spirit has been denied the power to select an overseer that is abundantly able to feed the flock. Zealots, religious apostates and lukewarm Christians have refused to believe that God is now setting a seal, an unmistakable mark upon His predestinated overcomers of these last 45 years and God dares to name the ones who rebel against His sovereign prerogatives the "drunkards of Ephraim" drunk their own self sufficiency.

The most antagonistic enemies against the "seal of the Spirit (Eph. 1:13—4:30—2 Cor. 1: 22) are the ones that you would expect to receive the seal in their spiritual stride, but the gross ERROR which has been among Pentecostal people has been a terrible barrier and handicap against these sound holiness groups from even desiring or seeking. Zeal not tempered with knowledge has abetted and encouraged this false teaching viz:—that if one had not spoken in tongues that they did not have any reality to deep Holy Ghost teaching, to use their much coined phrase "but they have not received their Baptism," although they had a deep sanctifying and anointing of the Spirit, a fiery Unction for preaching and testimony, years of consecrated service on the mission fields, etc. This

GERMAN ATROCITIES

According to the Evangelical Christian, "Six truck-loads of children were burned alive by the Germans at the Oswiecim Concentration Camp and mothers who witnessed the spectacle went mad, according to the Yugoslav War Crimes Commission.

"The Commission's report, quoted yesterday by the Yugoslav Telegraph Agency, said that 2,500,000 people perished in the camp to October, 1943. It placed responsibility for the atrocities on Hitler, Himmler, the Nazi party, and the camp officers.

"The camp had installations for speedy mass annihilation of prisoners and the extermination of those for whom there was no room. The camp installations included seven crematoriums.

"The report said that truck-loads of children were burned during the German retreat from the Ukraine. Seven thousand Jews were sent to a neighboring wood, where the Germans poured inflammable liquid upon them. The next day prisoneres were forced to scatter the victim's ashes on German farm fields. The sick and women over fifty were thrown into fires and burned alive and ninety-four truck-loads of men were burned on one night."

A SCHOOL IN NAZARETH

Most of you boys and girls who read this, are now in school. You have nice desks, and are in a new grade. This means that many of you have new books. If they are not new, they still have pretty pictures and bright bindings.

Would you like to know about a school when Jesus was a boy? The Bible does not tell us very much about the boyhood of Jesus, but we do know a little about the schools of that time. We also know His boyhood home was at Nazareth.

Jewish boys were taught at home until they were six years old, then most of them started to school. The girls did not go to school, but were taught at home by their mothers.

The school was held at the Synagogue. We would call a synagogue a church. Notice in our picture that the teacher and pupils all sit crosslegged on the floor. They did not have nice desks like you boys and girls now have. Coming down the steps in the background is a Jewish mother bringing a little boy to school, perhaps for the first time.

The teacher was a minister, or Rabbi as they called him. He was carefully chosen, because teachers were considered very important persons.

The books studied were very peculiar. They were called scrolls. I imagine the teacher read out loud, and the boys were made to listen. Only a few of the boys learned to read and write.

Waxed boards were used as a sort of table to learn to write on. A pointed stick served as a pencil, in an attempt to copy the difficult Hebrew letters.

We have learned when the boys started to school, where they went, who their teacher was, and their funny kind of books. What do you suppose they studied about? Did they study arithmetic and spelling? No. They studied from



our dear Book, the Bible. The Torah, or the first five books of the Bible were studied first, and later the prophets and the writings

The boys learned by heart the laws for living a good life which were written in the books. The good teachings of the Bible which they studied, are excellent for our boys and girls today—"Hear, O Israel, the Lord thy God is one Lord, and thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy mind, and with all

thy strength." "What doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with thy God?"

Preparation

By Albert L. Durham

Jer. 1:6-7, Then said I, Ah, Lord God! behold I cannot speak: for I am a child. But the Lord said unto me, Say not I am a child: for thou shall go to all that I shall send thee, and whatsoever I command thee thou shalt speak.

The prophet Jeremiah felt his inability to perform the task God was calling upon him to do: He said, "Ah, Lord God! I am a child;" but is this not the very kind of material God is looking for to perform His will? Before any one can be a success; he must feel his dependence on the Lord. Did Jesus not say; "Except ye be converted and become as a little child." But the Lord answered Jeremiah: "Say not I am a child; for thou shalt go to all that I shall send thee, and whatsoever I command thee thou shall speak."

We only have to read the next chapter to see, the prophet wasted no time in getting started on his mission. No, it was not to go at once into a new field of service, nor to a people he was not acquainted with; but he began at The word of the Lord home: came to him. Here is one of the greatest lessons for Missionary work and Evangelism. We must all do the things that are at hand. There are many that would go and preach, if they could go where a large audience and fat purse were promised: but I doubt if there was ever a successful missionary that was not willing to begin at home, and there; maybe in their neighbor's yard, or the church at home was laid the ground work for a fruitful harvest in a foreign field. It so happens, that we often meet people with a burning desire to get out and go places, and see new people, or explore new country. Do these people, young and old, have a call to the work of the Lord, and a passion to see souls won to Christ, regardless of cost or what circumstance they must labour

under; or is it just wanderlust? The same people, so often, seldom darken the door of their home church on prayer meeting night, and if they do are usually late. They many times have made it to Sunday School, but, Ah, how sad! didn't know where the lesson was to be found, let alone having studied it. How could any of us be prepared for a work in a land we were entirely strangers in if we cannot meet the challenge of every day duty and Christian experience? Many people are bound with timidity and self consciousness, and they are not to be criticized. I believe Jeremiah felt the same thing. But when the Lord touched him and put His words in the prophets mouth, and said, "I will go with thee;" Then he was made bold to go and do the bidding of God.

I would like to see a goodly number of missionaries go to new fields, at home and abroad: And yet are we ready to go, are we ready to send? Let us do what our hands find to do; take up our cross daily at home. In so doing we will equip ourselves for a greater field of service to God. Then when greater opportunities are afforded we will at least have some experience and God will furnish the grace to perform His will. Nor should we be content with too small experience in soul winning; However I have my first active home missionary to see, that didn't seek to promote and spread the gospel abroad, and were willing to go their limit to see men won to Christ, regardless of their race or

(Continued from Page 5) erroneous teaching automatically shut them off from being used of God in any way, stymied all the power of the anointing of 1 Jno. 2:27 and the Unction of 1 Jno. 2:20, grieved the Holy Spirit in these worthy soldiers of the cross whom God had given a rich and victorious experience of discipline, years of separation and a blest recognition of their self denial. "Honour to whom honour is due"—honour all men—fear God."

The painful reaction to this error was that all Holiness groups turned away from the "seal of the Spirit," and turned their backs and their spiritual guns of retaliation in the form of subversive literature and a complete severance of all fellowship and both factions using Rom. 16:17 as a cudgel. was a master stroke of Satanic subtlety with all its tragic upheavals in the wake of this anti-christ procedure, while a scoffing world still asks "Is Christ divided"; lukewarm sectarianism chants the requiem of Ichabod,—and a sleeping church accuses and excuses its own adherents, but still will not acknowledge this gross error,—the teaching of which has wrought untold havoc to the Unity of the faith and Spirit. What a sad caricature of the truth and what a barrier it has been to the fulfill-ment to Jesus' high priestly prayer of Jno. 17:11, but Omnipotence reigneth. - "there shall be ONE fold and ONE shepherd" notwithstanding the confusion of false teaching.

The drunkards of Ephraim have a woe of God resting upon them—they surely have rejected the 'word of the Lord'' (not false doctrine as they have taught)—they have mixed with the people (who fought and decried this experience)—a cake not turned—strangers have devoured their strength and he knoweth it not, empty churches and dwindling class rooms are silent witnesses to this truth). Woe to the crown of Pride—woe to the drunkards of Ephraim, whose glorious beauty is as a fading flower. They have erred thru strong drink . . . they

err in vision . . . they stumble in judgment. (Their own doctrines right in themselves but limiting God in His infinite operation.) Many holiness groups tally this description because they have so fiercely attacked the WORD OF THE LORD or have left it OUT entirely in order to escape its responsibility. (Acts 2:4—10:46 -19:6—1 Cor. 12th and 14th chapters). Blind unbelief and wilful ignorance has shrouded these scriptures in all Holiness ranks, hence Isa. 28:15-22-23 are solemn threatenings with a promise to these who are fighting the seal of the Spirit which we are told is the SIGN of the believer Mk. 16:17 and the SIGN to the unbeliever 1 Cor. 14:22. 28:20 exposes the spiritual poverty of "Ye scornful men that rule this people" Isa. 28:15.

NOW—the ETERNAL NOW—be ye not mockers, lest your bands be made strong... give ear and hear my voice, hearken and hear my speech." 28:22. The serious aspect of these strong bands seems to indicate that many could not receive this experience after having rejected the Word of God; rejected all witnesses and testimony of those who have received; rejected the preached and prophetic word of godly preachers with burning messages of this truth proving the scripture that "in His Light we shall see Light" but when the Light has become darkness how great is that darkness.

Brethren — Pentecostal and Holiness let us lay aside our holier than thou snobbery and let Him make of us just a hollow reed emptied and filled through which He can send the golden oil to lighten a dark world, to revive a sleeping church, to enable the Bride to make herself ready—to give strength for the delivery of the Manchild and to bring to final and ultimate fruition the travail of His soul.

What went ye out in the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the Wind? Yes, the mysterious attraction was there when John the Baptist preached,—"Repent ye—prepare ye—the way of the Lord, but in his own eyes John was just a voice, just a reed shaken by the

Wind" who was willing to decrease that He might increase.

May God who giveth the increase reap a whirlwind of spiritual returns from His reeds shaken by the Wind—the Holy Ghost.
