Book Fair

Set up starts 9/16 and will go for 3 to 4 days. Need a lot of volunteers to help set up. Teacher preview day is that Thursday 9/19 where they come and fill out their wish lists that they would like in there classroom libraries. Book fair is open 9/20 and that is the first Donuts for Dads morning. Donuts for Dads will also be on 9/23 and 9/24 at 7:30am and we will have free donuts and drinks. All the elementary students come with their class on the 23rd and the 24th. There are two pre-order books this year and the form will be in the book fair packet that will go home with your student. It is very important that parents fill out the book fair form and include money if parents will not be attending with their student. New this year is a program called E-Wallet. You can load money onto an account for your child to spend at the book fair. The E-wallet website will be on the envelopes that your student brings home. You can also shop online at Scholastic and the books will be shipped to your home. Its important that when you are shopping online you use the Copper Ridge link and that will be on the envelope that will go home with your child. Scholastic has a program called All For Books. If the student donates a dollar then Scholastic donates a dollar to two organizations that gives books to children in schools in less privileged areas and they also donate a dollar back to our school which is used to purchase books for our library. Book fair will be open after school from 3:15-4:00.

Principal Update
