Minister's Lenten Reflection

Love is more than a feeling. Love is a form of sweet labor: fierce, bloody, imperfect, and life giving – a choice we make over and over again. If love is sweet labor, love can be taught, modeled, and practiced. This labor engages all our emotions: Joy is the gift of love. Grief is the price of love. Anger is the force that protects that which is loved. And when we think we have reached our limit, wonder is the act that returns us to love.

Valarie Kaur, See No Stranger, quoted in Faith After Doubt, by Brian McLaren The Craft/Study group has been reading Brian McLaren's book, Faith After Doubt, Why Your Beliefs Stopped Working and What to do About It. It has been a great book that many are enjoying and getting much out of. Our conversations are rich and challenging. His most recent chapter that we read, begins with the above quote and he shares two slogans that summarizes the heart of his message to this point in the book (Chapter 10):

Faith before doubt: it's about correct beliefs.

Faith after doubt: it's about revolutionary love.

He defines revolutionary love as: "love beyond: love that goes beyond myself to my neighbor, beyond my neighbor to the stranger, alien, other, outcast and outsider; beyond the outsid-

er to the critic, antagonist, opponent, and enemy; and even beyond the human to my nonhuman fellow creatures. In short, revolutionary love means loving God as God would love: infinitely, graciously, extravagantly." As we move into Lent, as we experience the invasion of Russia into Ukraine, I think more than ever we need this revolutionary love of God.

Lent is a time of reflection on our faith journey to seek ways to draw nearer to God. To develop and deepen our relationship with Jesus, the one we know as the Prince of Peace, who embodied revolutionary love. It is often seen as a time of prayer, alms (giving to charity), and fasting, which is where the concept of giving up something for Lent comes from. As we move through these next 40 days of Lent, I invite us to con-

sider how we might express revolutionary love? How do we live out God's love in Jesus in our day to day lives? Is what we believe or how we love more important? McLaren talks about apostle Paul saying that it is faith expressing itself in love that matters, not circumcision, not dietary restrictions, not who is in or out, but love.

So, I invite you to consider this Lent, how is your faith expressing itself in love? As we enter this tumultuous time with one large, powerful country invading another, can we love and pray for the leaders, for their well being, as we pray for peace, as Jesus named in the readings last week (Luke 6: 27-38)? I invite us to consider what it would look like for our community to reflect revolutionary love, to be a community that embraces faith after doubt.


As we reflect on how Jesus calls us to live during these times, may we engage ourselves in love as a priority over all else. May you fast and pray and give and do good so that people experience your love, God's love in all that you do. May this Lent bring meaning to you of what revolutionary love is, and how we may embrace it and live it as individuals and as a community.

"In this groundbreaking book,


therapist Resmaa Menakem examines the damage caused by racism in America from the perspective of trauma and bodycentered psychology.

The body is where our instincts reside and where we fight, flee, or freeze, and it endures the trauma inflicted by the ills that plague society. Menakem argues this destruction will continue until Americans learn to heal the generational anguish of white supremacy, which is deeply embedded in all our bodies. Our collective agony doesn"t just affect African Americans. White Americans suffer their own secondary trauma as well. So do blue Americans—our police.


My Grandmother"s Hands is a call to action for all of us to rec-

ognize that racism is not only about the head, but about the body, and introduces an alternative view of what we can do to grow beyond our entrenched racialized divide. [This book:]


- Offers a step-by-step healing process based on the latest neuroscience and somatic healing methods, in addition to incisive social commentary.


Donating to Eastside couldn't be easier with our range of options:
