Pastoral thoughts

This time of year shouldn't be just an ordinary period for a believer. It should be full with spiritual thoughts about our behavior and Christian image. The best way to organize our fasting period is to follow biblical events. This gives us a complete idea about the consequences of human behaviors and how we can confess and direct our outlook toward God and the salvation of our souls. It's a whole process which requires striving toward perfection through prayer and confession.

The biblical events our church fathers have defined for Great Lent perfectly describe human being's comprehension about spirituality in general. All proverbs and biblical passages describe human desires and their consequences. It shows us how human being can damage the normal and natural processes of life.

All conditions are provided in the church during this period for believers to live and to realize the burden of sin. It shows us how Adam and Eve sinned and how God put them out of the Garden of Eden where previously they were enjoying God's presence. All kinds of thoughts about Great Lent are summed up in this idea. By closing the curtains of the Holy Altar we deprive ourselves of divine presence, and are given forty days to expiate our sins and to be worthy children of God.

Chosen parables for this fasting period show the best ways for the redemption of sins while pointing out moral and virtuous demonstrations which can help believers in their forty day journey. During the Great Lent period we assume penance, repentance and abstinence about everything; eating, talking and behaving in general. These are all very important to implement useful and successful fasting.

One more time I would like to invite you all to come and join us on Wednesday evenings for Lenten evening services, where also we will have discussions about certain spiritual thoughts and feelings about fasting.





FIRST CLERGY CONFERENCE OF 2019 HELD AT THE WESTERN DIOCESE



With the participation of all Diocesan clergy, the first clergy conference of 2019, presided by the Primate His Eminence Archbishop Hovnan Derderian, was held on Tuesday, February 26, the Feast Day of St. Ghevont the Priest and his companions, at the Headquarters of the Western Diocese in Burbank.

Administrative, organizational and pastoral matters were addressed and discussed during the opening session in which the Diocesan Primate emphasized the continuing ministerial mission of delivering the Word of God to our People. Youth involvement, service, and immersion in the life of the Church was another important topic of discussion.


Earlier this year, a beautiful tradition engaging the youth in the life of the Armenian Church was established by the Diocesan Primate Archbishop Hovnan Derderian at the Annual ACYO Assembly in San Francisco.

Feast of the Glorious Resurrection of Jesus Christ



The Feast of the Glorious Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ or the Easter Feast is one of the five major feasts of the Armenian Church. The main origin of the feast is the following.

Following the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ His body was taken off the cross and placed into the tomb and the entrance to the tomb was closed by a large stone and the soldiers were ordered to control the entrance to the tomb. After three days the three women, who had followed Jesus from Galilee, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the Mother of James and Joseph, and the wife of Zebedee brought spices and perfumes to anoint the body of Jesus. They found the stone rolled away from the entrance to the tomb, so they went in but they didn't the body of the Lord. They stood there puzzled about this, when suddenly two angels dressed in white appeared and said to them, "Why are you looking among the dead for one who is alive? He is not here, ha has been raised" (Lk 24:5-6). Christ rose from the dead, by means of His Death He destroyed Death and granted eternal life. "I am the Resurrection and I am the Life. Whoever believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die" (Jn 11:25).

Christ died for the salvation of mankind and by His Blood took away the sin in the world, so that we should inherit eternal life.

The Armenian Church celebrates the Easter Feast on the first Sunday following the full moon of the vernal equinox, with 35 days moveability, during the period from March 21 –April 26.

The Armenian Church traditionally celebrates evening Divine Liturgy on the evening prior to Jesus Christ's Glorious Resurrection (Easter). Following the conclusion of the Liturgy, the assembled faithful take lit candles home, symbolizing the Light that Christ brought into the world. The Divine Liturgy celebrated on the eve is the start of the festive ceremonies.

On Sunday, the day of the feast, a morning service is conducted the Andastan Service is performed wherein the four corners of the world are blessed, afterwards the Divine Liturgy is celebrated. That day the faithful welcome each other on the occasion of the Glorious Resurrection of Christ conveying the great tiding: "Christ is Risen from the dead" and receive the answer: "Blessed is the Resurrection of Christ.
