Sermon Excerpts

With permission, adapted from Pastor Dan Shutters sermon of February 3, 2019

1 Corinthians 13, verse 11, is one of the best-known passages in the Bible because of its use in weddings. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child, but when I became an adult, I put away childish things.

Jesus said that we are to be like children, but he didn't say we are to behave like children. We live in a society which says you're only young once, but you can be immature for a lifetime. He who finishes with all the toys wins the game. But living for Jesus is supposed to be different. You know when you spend time with young children, they repeat one word: mine! For the grown-up Christian there is no such thing as mine! There is only what God has shared with us. But this is not a popular



There is only what God has shared with us. But this is not a popular idea in America and in church. We look out for number one—"I got mine, you get yours." The grown-up Christian knows everything we have is a gift, so we sound childish when we cry "mine!"

Paul said, "When I was a child, I understood as a child...." The beginning of understanding comes with real listening. Love listens to God. It hears with the heart what is said and not said. Sometimes just listening is the best expression of love. If you want to talk with someone who has a different point of view, first you have to listen to them. Listening isn't simply waiting for a chance to speak; it is also understanding what is said.

Despite the Bible's warnings, we still measure success by verbosity and amounts of information. But if a business can be measured by its profit margin, then a Christian life should be measured by how much time is devoted to quiet focus on God. We're getting older, but are we growing up?

Paul finishes talk of childishness by saying, "I used to think as a child"--so what are childish thoughts? Children are always sure they are right. We know we are not always

right. It takes a grownup to admit that he or she was wrong and to hear an apology and move on. It takes real growth to apply the words of our faith, 'If someone offends you, go to that person directly. Note: it doesn't say send a terse email and then write off the person.

It is childish not to speak words of reconciliation, to hold a grudge, and to brood and pout. In another letter to a church Paul says that unity, faith and knowledge of the Son of God are maturity. We live and learn from Jesus that our childishness is being replaced through the Holy Spirit. The point, of course, is as we grow in the full stature of Christ, his ministry in the world is multiplied. As others see that we are no longer like children, they might be inclined to hear about how we've achieved this growth.

How can we share our faith without getting tangled up in differences? Maybe the whole problem is about growing up.




Bible Studies

NOTES FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Congregational Redevelopment:

An article, "Led by the Spirit," from the February 8, 2019, issue of Lutheran Living magazine, explores ways churches like ours have revitalized their congregations. "For years the two primary measures of congregational vitality have been worship attendance and congregational income. But counting only "butts" (in the pews) and "bucks" (in the offering plate) can be misleading. Some wealthy and well-attended congregations may have a lackluster church life and no community engagement, whereas financially struggling congregations may exude a robust spiritual life and strong community ties. Recognizing these limitations, our denomination is now emphasizing the many ways that congregations can find life and vitality. Through stories, education and training, the ELCA is reframing our understanding of church vitality."

What does this mean for Trinity? While we recognize that we have work to do, we sense a growing, positive spirit at Trinity. We have strong ministries within our congregation, especially in the care of members, Bible studies, Sunday school, Stephen ministries, LOV (women's ministry) and a developing youth group. Building maintenance plans are moving along. Going forward we need to share Christ's love within our community and increase our visibility. Fortunately, we have plans for that.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

• The Congregational Life Ministry Team is planning an all-church Bible study using Rick Warren's Forty Days of Community.

• The Support Ministry Team is developing a plan to make Trinity more attractive as a rental space for community events/organizations. Plans are being made to add gravel to the parking lot (safety). Approval to proceed with tuck pointing was given.

• The Outreach and Care Ministry Team has registered for two Expos, one at Grant High School on March 2 and one in Round Lake on April 13. These events will give us exposure in the area and help us find ways to reach out to our local community.

• The Youth and Family Ministry Team is considering sending this summer, up to four youth and a leader to Leadership Lab at Augustana College, Rock Island, IL. This excellent program teaches youth to become leaders in their groups. Building a strong youth program is vital to reaching out to younger families.

• Finances are going well at this time. We hope to be able to call a part-time pastor this sometime this summer if finances remain on track.

"Redevelopment has always been about reconnecting in the community. That's what congregational vitality is--living out discipleship. How do we love God? Love one another? Serve our neighbor. That's vital! That's what being vital is!"
