Military Women Convention Invades Mississippi

More than 100 members and guests arrived on planes, trains and in automobiles to attend Military Women Across the Nation's first national convention July 18-22, 2016, at Gold Strike Casino & Resort in Tunica, Mississippi. The convention was hosted by members of Volunteer Unit 94, Memphis Belles Unit 151 and TriState Women Veterans Unit 157.

Most attendees arrived Monday afternoon and evening. After a quick stop at the registration desk Tuesday morning, many hopped aboard the shuttle for a bus tour of Memphis, sightseeing at Tunica River Park or a shopping trip at the nearby outlet mall.

Wednesday morning ushered in the General Business Session which opened with a beautiful ceremony. Written, choreographed and conducted by Gloria Wix, Becky Dickinson and Marie Porter, the solemn rite included a brief history of WAVES National, retirement of the WAVES National flag and the unfurling of our new MWAN flag.

Reports by elected officials and national staff members were accented with the presentation of door prizes throughout the day as well as MWAN Security Staff lurking around the meeting room (Continue Convention on page 5)

HOWEVER, before we detail the changes, please consider helping us save some money. With this inaugural issue, a full-color version of "Military Women's Bulletin" is available on our web site: www.milwomen.org

For those who are computer-shy, we will continue to "snail"-mail every issue of your newsletter. However, if you are somewhat computer savvy and know how to visit our web site, perhaps you could view/print your own newsletter.

Currently, it costs \$1.37 per black & white copy to print, fold, staple, and mail each issue. With some 1,550 members and 6 issues per year, that brings the annual cost to about \$12,700.

If only 12 members elect to discontinue the paper copy and use the full-color, digital issue, we can cut almost \$100 off that annual cost. (Continue Newsletter on page 5)

To the left is the final Fiscal Year 2017 Budget which was approved by the MWAN Board of Directors at the post-convention meeting.

There are numerous fees, taxes and other costs associated with running a non-profit organization. Where an office is listed under "expenses" the budget allows the holder of that office to receive reimbursement for expenses associated with that office. Additionally, some office holders are required to attend national meetings, so there are allowances for some of their travel expenses to be reimbursed.

Many of the items listed in the budget are detailed in the MWAN By-Laws and/or MWAN Procedures Manual, both of which are available at our website www.milwomen.org.

History HerStory

For some 37 years our members have been accumulating photos, documents and other historical keepsakes. These items have routinely been stored in some 17 to 20, 30-gallon containers except for four days every two years when they were transported to various locations and put on display at convention.

William Cathey served in Company A, 38th U.S. Infantry Regiment (Buffalo Soldiers) from November 1866 to October 1868. Cathay

became ill and was discharged when the tending physician discovered he was a "she." Cathey Williams is likely the first black woman to serve in the regular U.S. Army.

My Life in the Navy by Pearle Crisler

A 93-year-old Navy Veteran and MWAN Life Member, Pearle enlisted in Dallas, Texas and served as an Aviation Machinist Mate during World War II. She wrote this poem in August of 2016. The poem was provided by Therese Agnes Hughes who is a contributing writer for Huffington Post.

Our country was at war in 1943
I was young, footloose and fancy free
Working with other women on the assembly line
Putting radio equipment in B24's, doing just fine
When a recruiting poster caught my eye
I decided to give the Navy WAVES a try
Left Dallas, Texas on 6 May, on a troop train
Going where they didn't say
When the time came to disembark
We were at Hunter College, The Bronx,
New York
We were assigned to buildings, given a
bunkbed.

Marched to the Mess Hall to be fed
They then gave us shot after shot,
Which made our arms hurt a lot
We were issued uniforms, hats and shoes,
Had no time to sing the blues
Calisthenics to make us strong,
Then classes all day long
No more wearing civilian clothes:

No more wearing civilian clothes;
The need to wear navy gear arose
Boot training was finally complete
We had accomplished quite the feat
One thing was left to do
We all had to "Pass in Review"
Orders were then assigned,
I was happy to receive mine
I was to become an Aviation Machinist Mate

Working on airplanes was to be my fate

This was cool, but first I had to go to school

To learn about airplanes from wing to wing

NATTC, Norman, Oklahoma came next, It all was so complex Classes again all week long Weekends for fun, dancing and song

Engines, carburetors, everything

The thing you had to remember to do Was be inside before curfew

Didn't make sense to me I got picked up by the S.P. Taken back to base to mend my ways Restricted for sixty days



No more weekend journeys for me Confined to barracks, gosh oh gee Graduation came eventually And orders came down NAS Dallas, Texas was where I was bound Assigned work in assembly and repair Measuring engine parts for wear Then came work on the Magna-Flux machine. Checking for cracks on all metal things On weekends we'd go into town, To eat, to have fun, whatever we found One night, as crazy as it seems I met the man of my dreams He was home on leave and wouldn't you know His leave was soon up and he had to go Not long after that I got orders again, Back to NAS, Norman was the plan

Which was fine, I went to work on the flight line The planes had to be checked , then started so

When the cadet came out, they'd be ready to go I'd lead him, since he couldn't see
To where he needed to be
He'd take off for his flight
I'd watch 'til he was out of sight
When his flight was over and he came to land,
I'd lead him back to where he began
I'd re-check the plane for the next cadet to fly,
Knowing my turn to go up would come by
and by

At the end of the day we'd go around To make sure the planes were all tied down I couldn't believe it, but my dream man came back on leave,

I got leave and let it be said, On 23 March 1945 we were wed He returned to duty and I did too, This was what we had to do Later the war was over-Victory! An Honorable Discharge was handed to me My husband remained a military man Sent to the Philippines, Korea, Vietnam and Japan

Before this however he had orders for Austria and lo

This was when I was allowed to go
We returned to Ft. Bragg to settle down 'til
The next orders came around
We raised four kids along the way
I learned to take life day by day
We were in Alaska, retirement time came
Before we could leave he developed a pain
In the hospital for a spell
For how long no one could tell
The guest house kept the kids and me
Napoleon & Kat stayed in the kennels you see
Orders for Ft. Lewis, Washington came
finally


Life in the military was done Civilian life had just begun


