PENTECOST OFFERING — SUNDAY, JUNE 4

When you give to the Pentecost Offering, you are helping to provide opportunities for young people to grow and share their faith in Christ.

40% of this offering stays with our congregation to be used for programs for young people in our church and community.

Kenzie Shaffer volunteers with them and they provide services to at risk children: they provide food to kids, throw birthday parties for kids at Beatitude House, they take goody bags to kids in hospitals, collect diapers and give to agencies that need them, they also provide bags with PJ's and other stuff when they are taken from there homes and put into foster care.

25% supports Young Adult Volunteers (YAY) - to provide opportunities for young adults to serve in communities around the world and grow as leaders through transformative Christian service. This is the program Pastor Jamie served with when he was in Peru which lead him on his path to ministry.

25% goes to Ministries with Youth—to help guide youth by uniting them in Christ and lifting them up as leaders and messengers of God's word.

SUMMER SKIN CARE TIPS

We all need to protect our skin from ultraviolet rays. You can do this by wearing sunscreen, wearing protective clothing (including long-sleeve shirts, pants and wide brim hats) and wearing sunglasses. Try to avoid being in the sun between the hours of 10am and 3pm when the UV rays from the sun are the strongest.

The American Association of Dermatology recommends a "broad spectrum" sunscreen with a SPF of at least 15. Apply 1 ounce (2 tablespoons) of sunscreen to your entire body 30 minutes before going outside. Reapply every 2 hours or immediately after swimming or excessive sweating.

Please remember to protect your skin. While sunburns are painful, it is the

long-term exposure to the sun that can greatly increase your chances of skin cancer.

HEALTH MINISTRIES

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM MOSQUITO AND TICK BITES

We've all heard that there is an increase in ticks this season and we all know how bad mosquitos are during the summer. We all need to be diligent in protecting ourselves from mosquito and tick bites. We can start by having and using repellant with 20% or higher Deet on skin and clothing.

When we know we will be outdoors in areas where they might be we need to wear long sleeves & pants with socks. Once a week we should empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, toys, flower pots, buckets, birdbaths, small pools, trash containers, etc.

Check yourself, your children and your pets when you come indoors. And we should all know the proper way to remove ticks. If you find one on the skin, remove it and place it in a bag. If a rash develops on the skin, please see your doctor and remember to take the tick with you.



Tick Removal

Disinfect area with rubbing alcohol.


Use clean, fine pointed tweezers and grab perpendicular to insect body. Pull up with a steady hand without twisting.

Disinfect area again. Place tick in plastic bag to die & take a picture of it in the bag.

Watch for signs: bull's eye rash or fever. This could take a few days to a month to develop.

If any signs occur, see your doctor and take the tick with you.
