Clergy Column

This past Wednesday we celebrated the feast day of St. Isidore the Farmer. Isidore, who lived in 12th Century Spain, grew up in a poor family. His parents could not afford to educate him, but they taught him what they knew, but most importantly they shared with him their love for God. Eventually Isidore took a job as a farm hand, a job he kept his whole life. Each morning Isidore attended Mass before work, and all the day long while at work he stayed in constant communion with the Lord all the while he worked. His co-workers grew irritated by Isidore's piety, and they complained to the farm owner that he always came to work late because he was going to Mass each morning and dawdling in the church afterward. The owner checked the following day, and he did notice that Isidore arrived after everyone else, but as he watched him work, he could see a glowing white man and team of oxen plowing right next to Isidore with his own team of oxen. Because of his holiness, and the grace of God, Isidore was able to do the work of two men. Isidore married a pious woman, Maria, who is herself a canonized saint. They had a son early in their marriage, but he died young, and afterward Isidore and Maria vowed to live as brother and sister in their marriage, so they could more fully dedicate themselves to the Lord.

As a saint from Spain, there is not much of a natural connection between Saint Isidore and American Catholics, very few of whom were of Spanish descent before recent times. However, the bishops of America decided to promote him among American Catholics because so many early Americans were farmers, and the bishops wanted it to be well known that a simple, but holy man, doing an honest day's work, was as capable as anyone of living the life of a saint. May the Month of Our Lady

May is the greatest Marian month of all, traditionally known as the "Month of Our Lady.". She begins the month as Queen of May, and final day of the month brings a bevy of Queenly titles. It is the month when the spring of new life flourishes.

The Catholic practice of assigning a special devotion to each month goes back to the early 16th century. Since the best known of those devotions is probably the dedication of May as the month of the Blessed Virgin Mary, it might come as a surprise that it wasn't until the late 18th century that this devotion arose among Jesuits in Rome. In the early years of the 19th century, it quickly spread throughout the Western Church, and, by the time of Pope Pius IX's declaration of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in 1854, it had become universal.

May crownings and other special events in May in honor of Mary, such as public recitation of the rosary, stem from this time. Sadly, such communal events are rare today, but we can take the month of May as an opportunity to renew our own devotion to the Mother of God by dusting off our rosaries and adding a few more Marian prayers to our daily routine.

Parents, in particular, should encourage Marian devotion in their children, since the non-Catholic Christians they encounter today often downplay (if not denigrate) the role that the Blessed Virgin played in our salvation through her *fiat* -- her joyous "Yes" to the will of God.

When You (or someone you love) Visits the Hospital

None of us looks forward to time spent in a hospital bed. Altru Health System seeks to both help with what is wrong physically and also to support patients in other ways. That includes spiritual

Some of you may remember the days when the local hospital would call churches to inform pastors when a parishioner had become a patient. That went away years ago. These days a patient's privacy is protected carefully and hospitals are inspected in terms of protecting patient information and keeping it private.

So if you become a patient at Altru your information is kept private. You will have full control of who comes to see you.

"Will my pastor know I'm in so he/she can come to see me?" you might ask. There's two ways that can happen and you, the patient, control both.
