(and it's a great recipe to make with your kids or grandkids. They'll love the experience of making it with you!).

ONE BOWL CHOCOLATE SMORES CAKE

1 cup flour
1 cup sugar
1 cup unsweetened
cocoa powder
1 tsp baking soda
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp salt
1 cup milk

1 cup vegetable oil
1 tsp vanilla
1 egg
1 – 7 oz. jar
marshmallow crème
Graham crackers,
broken into small
pieces and/or crumbs

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and lightly flour an 8-inch square pan. In a large bowl, mix together the first six ingredients. Add milk, oil, and vanilla. Beat with a mixer on low just until combined. Beat on medium two minutes. Add egg; beat two minutes more. Spread batter in prepared pan. Bake 30 to 35 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Cool in pan on a wire rack for 10 minutes. Remove cake from pan. While still warm, spread with marshmallow crème and sprinkle with graham cracker pieces and/or crumbs (or dust with some cocoa powder as an alternative topping). Cool on wire rack. Enjoy around the fireplace!

### Trustees corner

## Here's the low-down on our House Rules

In this edition of "The Trustees Corner," your Trustees feel it's important to highlight some of the most important House Rules and the ramifications for violating those rules:

#### House Rule #4

Intoxication, indulgence in profane, vile and boisterous language, as well as physical violence on a part of members or guests in the home is strictly prohibited and disciplinary action may be taken against any member or guest who violates this rule.

This is the basic "be nice" rule; violations could range from verbal reprimand to 90 day suspension for severe violations. It's also important to remember, that members are responsible for their guests.

#### **HOUSE RULE #16**

Except for Rule #15, no one is allowed to sell or solicit any product for any purpose in the lounge, dance or dinning area, unless said solicitor has approval of a majority of Trustees and approval of a

majority of the members at an Aerie Meeting.

#### **HOUSE RULE #17**

Members using or possessing illicit drugs on Aerie premises will be subject to suspension from Aerie #2308.

#### House Rule #19

If any member or employee of Daffodil Aerie #2308 is found to be conducting or participating in any illegal gambling activity on the Aerie premises, they will be subject to suspension from the aerie for a minimum of (90) ninety days, or expulsion from the Fraternal Order of Eagles.

This includes *any* form of gambling including small football pools.

The Trustees do not like to focus only on the negative, but there seems to be an increase in bad behavior lately and we want to make it clear that we will not tolerate it and you, Puyallup Aerie 2308 members, should not either.
