

Motion from the July Council meeting

• The Support Team recommends increasing the monthly facility's use fee for the parsonage from \$800 per month to \$900 per month. APPROVED unanimously.

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

- As we continue to enhance and improve our audio systems for use with both inperson and live-streaming applications, The Worship Board recommends that ACS Sound and Lighting replace the speaker in the chancel with two speakers and add a congregational mic in the nave to pick up congregational singing and verbal responses during worship services, funerals, etc. at a cost of \$1,227.60. The quote covers the cost of the equipment and installation, including running the cables and training our audio/video production teams. Finance Committee recommends that the funds come from the Building Improvement Fund. APPROVED unanimously.
- A motion was made that we create a line item in the budget called Unbudgeted Outreach in which to deposit monies donated specifically for outreach opportunities. APPROVED unanimously.




