



Summer is almost here and VBS will be July 22nd-25th from 4PM-7PM.



Ursuline Sisters of Mount Saint Joseph Announcement

150th Anniversary of the Ursuline Sisters: Display in Chapel and Music at Maple Mount Reunion

The Ursuline Sisters of Mount Saint Joseph are celebrating 150 years of service to God's people in 2024. The Sisters are "Cultivating the Vine Saint Angela Entrusted to Us."

Father Paul Volk belongings on display: To celebrate the birthday of the priest who invited them to Daviess County 150 years ago --- Father Paul Joseph Volk – the Ursuline Sisters of Mount Saint Joseph are displaying his personal items throughout May in the gathering space of the Motherhouse Chapel, Maple Mount. Visitors can stop in to see them during May. Father Volk (May 16, 1841 - Nov. 2, 1919) was born in Germany. Ordained in 1865, he studied to become a missionary to the U.S. He was appointed pastor of St. Alphonsus Church in 1870, and in 1874 he brought the Ursuline Sisters to Daviess County to open Mount Saint Joseph Academy. He collected donations and acted as architect, contractor, and laborer in erecting the building. The place became known as Maple Mount because of the maple trees he planted. Traveling on foot and on horseback, he tended to the needs of the faithful, building many churches in Kentucky and elsewhere. In his late 40s, he answered the call to serve in South America, including Ecuador and Panama. He always wanted to help the poorest missions. 

SPIRITUAL LIFE COMMITTEE

St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Anti-

och. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiegne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.
