

Join the Eucharistic Pilgrimage Across America when it comes to our very own Diocese of Harrisburg at 4 different stops from June 3rd – June 5th.

What is the National Eucharistic Revival?

Just in case you have not heard about this yet, the entire Catholic Church in the United States of America is participating in a National Eucharistic Revival from Summer 2022 – Summer 2025. Here in Shippensburg, we increased the time spent in Eucharistic Adoration, and I've been mainly writing bulletin articles here in Shippensburg each week to help us understand the Catholic Mass. https://www.eucharisticrevival.org/

Right now, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is happening across the United States, and designated pilgrims are walking four different pathways to get to Indianapolis for the Congress in July.  - b. 2:30 pm, Begin Procession to St. Joseph ~ 3 mile walk between churches!
- 4. Tuesday, June 4th Hanover, PA --- @ St. Joseph a. 5:00 pm, Adoration and Evening Prayer in the Church
 - **b. Followed by,** A Big Dinner that is open to all (if you sign up!)
 - c. Event ends throughout the evening
- 5. Wednesday, June 5th Hanover, PA @ St. Joseph a. 8:45 am, Adoration and then Mass in the main church
 - b. ~ 10:00 am. Breakfast after Mass and then sending off the pilgrims to their next stop!!

***Please Note: The Diocese of Harrisburg will have one shuttle running between these FOUR churches from 1:00 pm until 8:00 pm, in case you park at one church and walk to the other locations to help you get back to your vehicle.

Register Now for Vacation Bible School!!!


There is NO COST, but spaces are limited— so don't wait! VBS is for students in pre-k (4 & 5 years old) through 5th grade.

The Father: 30 Meditations to Draw You Into the Heart of God

Saying the Our Father prayer that Jesus taught us from 2,000 years ago when He walked this earth is a fairly normal thing for most Christians. Many of us as Catholic Christians, say the Our Father prayer many times every single day. However, how often do we take some time to reflect on God relating to us in personal way as a true and real father. Fr. Mark Mary Ames is a young Capuchin Franciscan priest in New York City, and he does a remarkable job in his new book, The Father, to

bring our belief and Scripture itself into a new light in this way. Fr. Mark Mary uses real stories and examples to easily bring the reader into a new understanding of Scripture and help us to pray through our relationship with God as a Father. These reflections and stories are split up into 30 different chapters or days, and they are only a few pages long, which make this book easily readable and digestible for the average person. "Finally, before we left Monsignor King told all of us to reflect on one final thing. 'If Christianity were a crime, would you be guilty?'"

This is the last line of a series of comments from one of your contemporaries about last year's Men's Retreat who attended for the second year in a row with his father and grandfather. They are planning to attend again this year. Consider these words along with the theme from this year's retreat "Answering the Call to Follow Jesus" How could time with Jesus help your faith grow during these adolescent years? In 1967 the current church was built. This modern structure included many imaginative features. The sacrifice is the central action of our Christian life. The altar stands in the focal center of the church. Supported by concrete arches, the roof rises to a fifty foot summit, giving it a sweeping movement. The pews are positioned to focus attention on the altar. The second level and the ramps provide a flexible seating arrangement to accommodate the whole church congregation, which includes the university student population. The large stained glass windows provide light and help create an atmosphere of devotion and piety. Pennsylvania and Vermont slate are used in the sanctuary and altars. The laminated roof beams support a ceiling of red cedar.

Our Lady of Visitation Parish grew and on July 2, 1967, the new church and rectory were formally dedicated. The church now provides services to 460 families and also provides space for some of the activities of the Catholic Campus Ministry at Shippensburg University. The social hall and education building was built in 1999.

The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children



Today we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is also

called Corpus Christi, which means the "body of Christ".

In today's first reading, we heard a very unusual story. After the people of Israel had received the gift of the law and heard it proclaimed by Moses, Moses gave people the instruction to make a sacrifice of bulls and then he sprinkled their blood on the people.

It sounds pretty messy, doesn't it? Why would Moses do such a thing?

What is blood? What does it do for us?

Blood helps move what we need throughout our bodies: oxygen, energy, vitamins and minerals, and water. Why, then, might Moses sprinkle blood, sprinkle life, on the people? The blood from the bulls that has been sacrificed had been offered as a gift to God. So, this blood belonged to God.

At the moment that Jesus gave the most precious gift of himself in the bread and wine, that are no longer bread and wine, he remembered this particular way in which God's life and the life of the people were bound up together. He also said something new. He offered his friends a cup that he called "my blood of the covenant". In saying that it was *his* blood, the blood of the covenant, he was saying something about who he is.

Who does the blood of the covenant belong to?



It belongs to God. Jesus was helping his friends to understand that he is God. this Gift is for us, too. Some of us will receive this gift today as we come forward for Communion and some are waiting to take our place at the table of the Lord. Jesus is among us and we enjoy his presence, the life he gives us that

makes us his own.

Living our Faith: Take time this week to thank Jesus for giving of himself, so that we have the chance to get to heaven.
