12: 2010-December 2018 - A New Post Home

The New Year, 2010, brought efforts to raise money to build a new post headquarters building. Until then, monthly post meetings were held at the VFW meeting hall at Wolters Park.

Fund raising efforts included the VVA Chapter 870 donating \$1000, the Schulenburg VFW donating \$5000, and donations from other American Legion Posts in Texas (Flatonia, Round Top, La Grange, Hallettsville, Weimar, Fayetteville, Rosenberg, and Richmond). These donations, plus those of local businesses and citizens, resulted in \$158,268 in pledges and donations by April 6, 2010. McBride Post also continued its meal fundraisers. The February 2010 stew dinner raised an unprecedented \$6557.

Frank Bohlmann of Schulenburg drafted the plans for the new post home, a 45'x 65' building with a kitchen. Bids were received, and the one submitted by Sandy Meyerson of Meyerson Custom Builders for \$179,300.00 was accepted. On March 22, 2010 the ground breaking ceremony was held for the new post home. Construction was completed in October of that same year. The final costs for the new post home was \$180,900 paid to Sandy Meyerson. With \$93,145 collected through fund raisers and donations, plus the \$100,000 insurance payment, the post had \$1440 left over to buy incidentals.

The ribbon cutting for the new post home was held on October 23, 2010 at 10 a.m. New tables and chairs were bought from Schulenburg Printing Supply for \$5700. A new gun safe was also purchased in October, and new ceremonial rifles received December 23, 2010, with the leather slings arriving in February 2011.

The first meeting held at the new post home was on November 2, 2010. And on February 19, 2011, the post held an open house and dedication for the general public. Rent for the new hall was set at \$200. This was updated in 2015 with a \$50 deposit now part of a \$250 rental charge. With their new post home finished, the McBride Post again hosted the 9^{th} District Convention. Held on October 9, 2011, the post raised over \$8000.

Even with the challenge of building a new post home, McBride Post 143 continued to operate as usual.

Membership recruitment continued with the post reaching their 100% membership goals at the end of fiscal years 2011, 2015, 2016, and 2017.

The Honor Guard covered 138 funerals between July 2010 and June 2018, including those of Andy Lamascus, a former Prisoner of War, Ernest Chaloupka, founder of the Praha Veterans Club, Louis Nitschke, who served as post chaplain from 1994-2011, Adolf Ulrich, who served as Sergeant-At-Arms from 1988-1999, Jerome Sassin, who served as Serve Officer from 1991-1999, Clarence Guentert, who was a 70 year member, and Otto Kocian, a five year legion member and Mayor of Schulenburg.

Of note this decade, the Color Guard participated in the St. Mary's Catholic Church, High Hill, TX, 150th year celebrations on September 5, 2010. And, on November 11, 2012, they participated in Praha's Veterans Day Program 50th Anniversary. They also continued to post the Colors at their traditional events to include the Schulenburg High School Home Football Game Flag raisings, local church picnic flag raisings, NRA Banquet Colors posting, and the Schulenburg Relay for Life Colors posting.

The War Wagon won several awards in local parades to include First Place in the Antique Truck Division at the Fayette County Fair Parade 2012 through 2015, First Place in the Weimar Gedenke Parade in 2016, and Most Patriotic in the Ellinger 82nd Tomato Festival Parade in May 2018. Unfortunately the War Wagon broke down during the 2015 Schulenburg Festival Parade and could not finish, but the participating veterans walked the rest of the way.

In June 2011, five local WWII veterans participated in the Honor Flights Network to see the War memorials in Washington D.C.

Started in 2005, the Honor Flight Network is a non-profit organization created solely to honor America's veterans for all their sacrifices. They transport heroes to Washington, D.C. to visit and reflect at their memorials. Top priority is given to the senior veterans - World War II survivors, along with those other veterans who may be terminally ill.

Throughout this decade the McBride Post continued to support veterans and give back to the community. The post makes annual donations

to local community organizations and other state veteran groups in need. Between 2011-2018, the post's donations included: \$500 to Schulenburg Food Pantry; \$100 to the Boy Scouts celebrating their 100 years of active service to the Schulenburg Community; \$50 to the local Marine Corps League Ball (an annual donation); \$95 to the Schulenburg Fire department; \$250 to the Smithville, TX Veterans Memorial Park; and \$688 to the Wharton Legion Post whose hall was severely damaged during Hurricane Harvey in 2017.

In February 2011, Commander Hatfield and comrade Jack Moretz took time to meet with Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) Soldier, Specialist Troy Yocum, as he passed through Schulenburg during his walk across America. Troy hiked over seven thousand miles across America in 2010-2011 to help bring awareness to issues faced by veterans and their families.

In 2012, the executive committee was assigned the task to get the post's Sons of the American Legion (SAL) Chapter, which was chartered on April 11, 1937(see page 15) and became nonoperational over the years due to lack of interest, back on track with new membership. On February 7, 2013, the SAL held a recruitment meeting attended by 20 potential members, 17 of which eventually signed up that year. Travis Liehardt was elected as the SAL Chapter commander at the first official meeting on February 20, 2013. SAL participated for the first time in the Praha Veterans day program in November 2013. Momentum and membership attendance was low for the next two years. On November 3, 2015, the SAL held a meeting with the Post Commander, Bob Heinrich, to discuss whether the SAL chapter should continue. The members who attended the meeting voted to remain active, and new officers were elected. Participation picked up, and in the spring of 2016 the SAL helped install curb posts to protect the post headquarters building's front entrance handrails, and installed new tips on the facility's tables and chairs to protect the polished floor. New officers were again elected in June 2016 due to loss of members (see Annex B for SAL Officer History). dues for the SAL were set in September 2016 at \$20, \$10 to the district and \$10 to the local chapter.

On August 22, 2013, veterans, businesses and other organizations gathered on the Interstate 10 Frontage Road to support the 8th Legion Legacy Run which started in Indianapolis, IN and ended in League City, TX. Over 250 motorcycle riders passed through that day. The post donated \$100 to the cause which raises funds for scholarships for gold star children.

In June 2013, Commander Hatfield who had served as McBride Post 143 Commander for 12 years stepped down, and Robert "Bob" Heinrich stepped up as the new post commander. One of his first acts was to apply for a property tax exemption for the post home from the Fayette County Appraisal district. The request was approved saving the post \$3000 per year.

In November 2015, Mark Meysembourg, the chapter director of the Tri-County Legion Riders approached American Legion Post 143 about transferring the Rider's charter from Post 256, Weimar, TX, to the Schulenburg post. Post 143 members voted and approved the transfer in January 2016. See Annex C for more information on the Tri-County Legion Riders Chapter and their list of officers.

This decade was also the time of many "firsts":

• In 2009, the post's Legionnaire of the Year award was implemented. Stan Correll was the first winner. In 2010, Jack Moretz and Bob Heinrich were joint winners. Other winners this decade include:

- On May 4, 2013, the post draped the Post Charter for the first time in remembrance of member Ben Sustr, who had recently died. The post continues this practice at each monthly meeting for any member who passed away since the last meeting.
- The July 2, 2013, meeting was the first time a POW chair was made visible and recognized. This practice continues today.
- Also in 2013, Commander Heinrich decided to start posting legion meeting reports in the Schulenburg Sticker as a public relations tool to keep the public up-to-date on what the post was doing. He appointed Patricia Hranicky of the Auxiliary to facilitate the articles with the Schulenburg Sticker.
- In January 2014 a scholarship committee was established. They drafted the post's scholarship policy and application process. That same year the first two \$500 scholarships were awarded to Schulenburg High School graduates Dakota Zapalac and Calli Guentert.
 - o The 2015 \$500 scholarships were awarded to Clayton Brossmann and Will Davidson.
 - o In 2017, the \$500 winners were Stormie Dunning and Jacob Salem.
 - o In 2018, due to the increased cost of college education, the post unanimously approved to raise the scholarship amount to \$1000 each for up to three receipients. The SAL voted to provide \$300 towards this goal. Commander Heinrich applied for a grant through WALMART, who awarded \$1000 towards the post's scholarship fund. The 2018 scholarship winners were Cassie Redding, April Borssmann, and Kaitlyn Smith.
- In 2014 a Mew Membership Committee was appointed by Commander Heinrich to spur recruitment. Committee members were Anna Corley, Terrell Brown, Erwin Cernoch and Andy Janda.

- On February 28, 2014, the first Appreciation Dinner was held by Schwenke-Baumgarten Funeral Home. The funeral home sponsored the dinner in order to recognize all the organizations and those members, to include the American Legion Honor Guard, who supported funerals. This dinner is now held annually.
- In 2015, the Schulenburg City Council approved the American Legion/VFW request to designate Texas Highway 77 through the city limits as "Fayette County Veterans Memorial Highway".

The Legion's annual fundraisers continued to be popular and largely supported by local citizens. The April 2015, Chicken Fried Chicken To-Go meal raised \$5133 and the March 30, 2016 To-Go meal raised \$7,090. The 2018 fundraiser was the most successful to date, with a net profit of \$7,371. The profits are shared with the Ladies Auxiliary.

The monies from these fundraisers helped support the high school scholarship program and the Boys' and Girls' State programs. The 2015 Boys' State attendees sponsored by the post were Javeon Lara and Rudolpho Garcia. In 2017, Boys State attendees were Miles Marburger, Garret LeBlue, and Leo Veloz. In 2018, Chris Herrera was selected to attend Boys State.

In June 2017, Eugene Krupala stepped down as post Adjutant after 24 years of service (1993-2017). He was recognized with a plaque presented by Commander Bob Heinrich for this achievement and his 38 years as a post member.

Also in 2017, Post 143 members and other local posts and veterans played a role in keeping a VA clinic in La Grange, TX. The VA was looking to consolidate the clinic to Bastrop, TX. The town hall meeting the VA held had such overwhelming participation that the VA decided to keep a La Grange VA clinic, but move it to St. Mark's hospital annex,

to facilitate the care for veterans.

The members of Post 143 continued to support community Americanism programs during this decade. Post members attended monthly Americanism programs put on by the SISD elementary school, and participated in annual Veteran's day programs atboth SISD and St. Rose. The post members also presented programs for the students on the proper respect and retirement of old American flags. In 2017, the Post presented a program at SISD on the Honors the post provides at the funerals of Veterans, and participated with the War Wagon in a program for the Boys and Girls Club at the Schulenburg Historical Museum.

Post 143 closed out 2018 with 153 members. Two members, David Stahl and James Stanzel, have 70 years of continuous membership, and Alvin Jack Klesel who died in November 2018, had reached 72 years of service.

As McBride Post 143 looks forward to the future, there are many July 12, 2017, Robert Hranicky shows off the uncertain times staring back at it.

- The U.S. continues to fight the war on terror abroad as well as at home.
- In October 2015, in light of the deteriorating security conditions, the U.S. reversed its withdrawal of troops from Afghanistan and determined to maintain а combat presence in Afghanistan indefinitely.
- In 2016, we saw the return of a larger number of Special Operation Troops to Iraq (the withdrawal of U.S. military forces from Iraq began in December 2007 and was completed by December 2011) due to the persistent advances of ISIS.
- The US military has played a role in the Syrian Civil war since 2014, but a missile strike on the Shayrat Airbase conducted in April 2017, was the first time the US had become a deliberate direct combatant against the Syrian government. This marked the start of a more discernible US troop deployment to Syria in 2017 and 2018.

American Legion McBride Post 143 enters into the dusk of this decade preparing to celebrate its 100th year of service in 2019. As proven by its past 99 years of history, it will continue to serve it members, other veterans, and the community with the same unshakeable sense of duty, loyalty and country.

ANNEX C Tri-County Legion Riders History and Officers

The American Legion Riders (ALR) have been a part of the American Legion since 2006. Riders nationwide participate in the Legion Legacy Run which annually raises money for the Legacy Scholarship Fund, established to provide scholarships to children of U.S. military personnel killed since September 11, 2001. Eligibility for the Legacy Scholarship fund was amended in 2015 to also provide scholarship funds for children of service members or veterans with a disability rating of 50% or more.

In November of 2012, the Tri-County Chapter of the American Legion Riders (ALR) was formed and initially chartered through American Legion Post 259 in Weimar, Texas. In January 2016, they moved their charter to American Legion Post 143 in Schulenburg, Texas. Membership in the Tri-County ALR is open to any member of the American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, or the Sons of the American Legion in the tri-county area - Fayette, Lavaca, and Colorado counties - who owns a motorcycle and enjoys riding. Spouses are also eligible for membership in the ALR even if they themselves do not qualify for membership in any of the three organizations listed above.

Since 2012 the Tri-County Legion Riders chapter has:

- Held monthly meetings and a monthly motorcycle ride.
- Hosted the 5th Annual American Legion Riders State Rally in May, 2014 in Weimar, Texas.
- Participated in every Legacy Ride since August 2013.
- Provided escorts each year for the participants from local school districts (Flatonia, Schulenburg, Columbus, LaGrange, and Weimar) to Boys State in Austin, TX and Girls State in Seguin, TX.
- Escorted the District and State Officers on their annual Coffee Tour through the Tri-County area.
- Conducted an annual fall fundraiser with ½ of the profits donated to a local nonprofit organization. The organizations who have received these monies are:

- Since 2015, hosted an annual Black Bean Run to raise funds for the American Legion Legacy Scholarship. In 2016, the chapter collaborated to combine the run with the annual Schulenburg Sausage Fest to better promote both events.
- In 2016, collaborated with the Sons of the American Legion Chapter to install curb posts to protect the Post 143 headquarters

building's front entrance handrails, and installed new tips on the facility's tables and chairs to protect the polished floor.

• In 2017 chapter conducted a ride to the VA Hospital in Temple, TX, to visit with veterans, sponsored a Girls' State attendee, and donated over \$2500 to local veterans in need and other veterans

organizations.

2018, the chapter participated in the first Annual Lone Star State Legacy Run (5 days over miles). The local ALR chapter director, Mark Meysembourg was appointed by the ALR State Advisor to be the State Chief Road Caption for the State Legacy Run in 2019. Meysembourg was able to present a check totaling over \$24000 to the National Legacy Foundation from the Texas ALR Chapters.

On November 10, 2007, the auxiliary celebrated the 75th anniversary of their charter with an open house at the legion home.

Veterans/Military Support & Advocacy

Unit 143 began distributing poppies in 1921 and annually ever since on the weekend before Veterans Day in November. Volunteers set up at several of the businesses in town and hand out poppies. There is no specific amount to be collected for the poppies but a donation is certainly accepted. A portion of the money is sent to the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Texas and the remaining funds are designated for the Child Welfare and Rehabilitation Fund.

community. The auxiliary president participates in the presentation and laying of wreaths. In 2017, the ceremony was dedicated to the surviving Family Members. Lisa Meysembourg, an auxiliary member and mother to three service members herself, was the guest speaker.

Family Support

Each month the Auxiliary Nursing Home Committee visits Legion and Auxiliary members in the assisted living, nursing home and retirement villas. Each person visited is given a bag of goodies or something special.

During National Senior Citizens Month, Fayette County honors the local senior citizens at its annual "Senior Citizen Day". Over the years, several Schulenburg auxiliary members have been honored: Patricia Marty (2010), Anna Janssen (2011), and Patricia Hranicky (2013).

At the December meeting each year, the Auxiliary and Legion enjoy the Christmas Party. The Auxiliary holds a raffle to help pay for the meal that is served. During the Christmas Party, auxiliary members are presented certificates and pins representing their years of membership.

Youth Development

Unit 143 is an active supporter of the American Legion Girls State each summer. The unit selects local high school junior or senior girls to attend the event in Sequin where they learn how governance works at the city, county and state levels.
