## Grant deadline approaching in Silver Bay

*Charitable Fund is accepting applications for work helping low-income people*

The Silver Bay Charitable Fund is accepting grant applications from nonprofit organizations to finance work that will help low-income people in Silver Bay.

The application deadline is Feb. 3, but interested applicants should first submit an inquiry via [www.dsacommunityfoundation.com](http://www.dsacommunityfoundation.com) by Jan. 21. (We understand this date has past, but it's still worth the application) The fund is affiliated with the Duluth Superior Area Community Foundation.

The mission of the fund is to meet the needs of low income residents of Silver Bay in the areas of the arts, community and economic development, education and human services. Grant requests should align with one or more of the fund's priorities:

- Newly developed collaborative or organizational efforts that address budget or service deficiencies resulting from funding shortages.
- Work that addresses underlying causes of community problems or that is preventive.
- Efforts that help organizations resolve crisis situations within the community.
- Initiatives that build local organizations' program and/or management capacities or quality.
- Projects that respond to well-documented community needs and/or require a moderate amount of grant money but produce significant results.

Examples of past grants include: after-school programming and transportation, arts opportunities in schools, dental care for children, literacy programming, access to preschool education, youth programming, installation of smoke detectors, and youth theatrical productions.

Nonprofit organizations that are located in or provide services to Silver Bay residents with low incomes are eligible to apply. Grants generally range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 and, if awarded, would be available beginning May. 1.
