DESCRIPTION: When Ben Pearson introduced the Palomino in 1958, it became an immediate best seller, and was a top tournament bow in the early 1960's. This iconic multilaminated bow is still a great looking and performing recurve. It's long length makes it a smooth shooting bow, and ideal for archers with a longer draw length. The heavier draw weight also makes it ideal for hunting in terrain where a short bow is not necessary. This reconditioned Palomino has gray back limbs and crimson face limbs. The riser and back limbs are in good shape. The facing limbs had some discoloration and wear. The decal was very faded and was replaced with a reproduction. The bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing or stress cracks; A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decal is a reproduction. The crimson face limbs have been re-stained, but there is still some discoloration remaining which can be seen in the pictures. The bow was put to a stress test (held at full draw for 16 hours) to make sure the old glues still held and no stress cracks would develop. Comes with a new string.
